



9. INTERNATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY RALLY by NSS MSI October 11,2021



The results were announced on the 6th of December through an Instagram post. All the participants were given participation certificates.





The members of Nature knocks: The Eco Club of Maharaja Surajmal Institute carried out a 'Green Audit' on Monday, 14th February 2022 in the campus premises wherein the members carried out a task of identifying the various kinds of vegetation in the campus. The team was divided into four groups and each group was allocated a specific area of the campus of which they did the audit of the various kinds of trees, bushes, plants etc. of the area. The campus was divided into 4 broad areas namely the MSI building, Auditorium, Hostel and MSIT Ground. The members then clicked pictures of the trees and bushes of those areas and identified them and maintained a count of those greens on Google sheets. The members were able to identify the names of the trees using 'Google Lens' which further made them aware of the wide variety of flora in the campus. They also realized the various greens which provide immense benefit to the humans were planted inside the campus premises, like the Dracaena trifasciata or the snake plant, which provides oxygen in abundance and is beneficial in areas especially like Delhi where pollution levels rise high beyond bars. The 'Green Audit' was organized by the Faculty Coordinator of Nature knocks, Dr. Anupama Sharma and was coordinated by the President of the club, Bhavya Bhatia. The members of the club participated actively in the audit with immense zeal and enthusiasm, making the audit accurate and reliable. The aim of this audit was to know about the greens in the entire MSI campus province, to keep a count of the vegetation and to increase this count in the coming time so that the campus building is safe, eco-friendly and remains as beautiful as it already is with additional greens. 





The event was very interactive as we were given the opportunity to ask any doubt that we had in our minds regarding NCC and its functioning.



Above mentioned awareness was made through advisory posters that were displayed on bulletin boards and eye-catching areas on the Campus.




WELCOMING THE INSTRUCTORS





March 24,2022



The speakers then took up some questions from the audience after which the Dr. Shailza Dutt personal anecdote and thanked the speakers and concluded the session at 11:08am.




36-FITNESS FUESDAY



- 4) Quilling Earrings & Fridge Magnet: There were painted fridge magnets and handmade quilling earrings for people to buy.









Total Participation- 20 Teams of 3 to 4 participants, out of which 10 teams qualified for the next round.




OBJECTIVE

TIMELINE OF THE EVENT - The event was divided into two shifts, with time frames of 9 am-12 pm and 12 pm-3 pm. 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If considered eligible, a phlebotomist would draw 1 pint of blood and after that, put an adhesive strip on the arm. Through this easy process, 200 volunteers were able to donate their blood.




CONCLUSION-The event was a massive success. 200 motivated volunteers, as well as members from the faculty donated their blood and did a noble deed. Through these 200 pints of



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


45. "AU REVOIR" - BCA [M] Farewell 2022 for Batch 2019-22




50 Plantation Drive Date:24 June 2022


