MSI Webinar Series: Webinar 7 Report

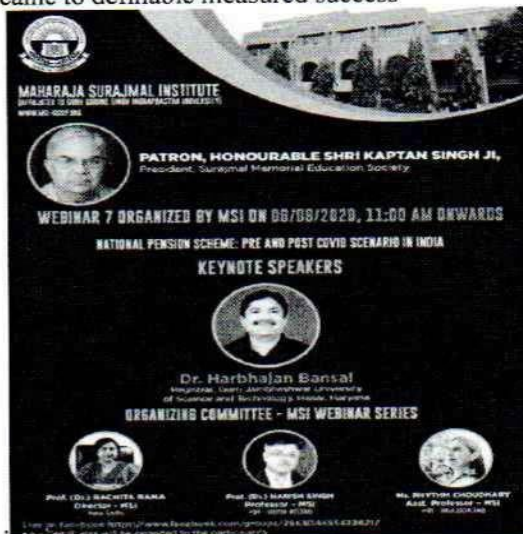

On 08- August 2020 Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized 7. Webinar in the ongoing webinar series. The Key speaker of the webinar was Dr. Harbhajan Bansal (Registrar, Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology, Hisar, Haryana).

The webinar started with welcome address by Dr. Neetu Narwal (Associate Professor, MSI) who highlighted the efforts and initiatives of Maharaja Surajmal Institute for providing a platform during pandemics for educational discussion and audience welfare. Along with this, she also requested the key speaker, Dr. Harbhajan Bansal to share his wisdom on '**Values-based Personality Development**'.

'**Values-based Personality Development**' topic was deliberated upon by Dr. Harbhajan Bansal. He started with what values are and the topic of ethics as one of prime importance. The values needed to lead a decent and respectful life and having a good understand and impression in the society about the self. 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



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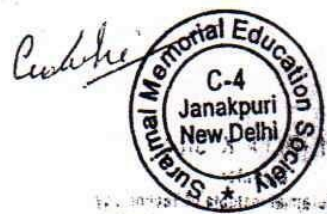
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
