1. National Conference on “Human Values and Ethics: Journey of a Teacher towards becoming a Reflective Practitioner”

Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized National Conference on the theme “Human Values and Ethics: Journey of a Teacher towards becoming a Reflective Practitioner”.

Dr. Anviti Rawat welcomed the eminent speaker **Dr. J.P. Singh** to give inaugural address on the topic “**Teachers as Reflective Practitioners**”. Professional development of teachers is a prime concern of MSI to bring quality in teaching learning process. Prof. (Dr.) J. P. Singh addressed the faculty of different departments of MSI. One thing stands in common for development of Faculty is enrichment in terms of challenging aspects of life. The present day life is ridiculed by challenges of issues related to human values and ethics. The lecture enriched the teachers in terms of expected behavior modifications as examples of Pannadhay and Guru Gobind were referred in context of sacrifice. Further Maslow’s hierarchy of needs and its existence among all human beings was quoted in reference of humans and teaching situations the key note address. Starting from physiological needs step by step the human course of action can be guided towards ultimate stage of self-actualization. The inculcation of basic human values will give a direction to teaching and realization of reflective practices. Then in the final words the speaker stressed upon importance of individual differences, different strategies of reinforcement and motivation as key factors to bring quality in teaching learning process.

On the theme, “**The Significance of Gita in Our Lives**” eminent speaker **Prof. Mahesh Vidyalkar** address the audience . The programme was graced by the presence of Chairman, SMES, Sh. S.P. Singh, Director, MSI, Prof. J. P. Singh and Director, MSIT, Sh. K.P. Chaudhary and the faculty and staff of MSI and MSIT. Prof. Mahesh Vidyalkar emphasized on the importance of recitation of Gyatari Mantra for the purification of mind and soul. He further elaborated that the meaning of Bharat means ‘immersed in knowledge. The scriptures of India are a proof to that. He said that Gita is the second most translated holy book after Bible in the world. Gita makes us realize our duty, life, religion, God, soul etc. through the sermon of Lord Krishna to Arjun while the former prepared the latter for war. On his deliberations on the modern Education System prevalent in India, Prof. Vidyalkar said that the inability to inculcate values among today’s generation is a major flaw in our Education system. The purity of thoughts is utmost for any individual as lack of good thoughts created Ravana. Education without values is incomplete. He emphasized that awakening can be brought only by practicing the teachings of Gita in our life. And the gist of Gita lies in, “Do your duty, do not expect awards”. Our heart must be controlled by our mind. This would ensure wisdom as if heart is in control, everything is under control. The programme came to an end with the Vote of Thanks by Hon’ble Chaiman, Sh. S.P. Singh. In his vote of thanks, Sh. S. P. Singh deliberated on the importance of pure thoughts, behavior and clothes. He further talked about the importance of time management and on teaching being one of the noblest professions.

Afternoon session started with motivating words by the eminent speaker **Mr. Beni Kinha** on the area of Life skill education. Life skill Education is always needed to fulfill the conditions necessary for worthy human existence. Mr Beni Kinha started his session with the objective of enhancing the practices related to life skill education, mental health and spiritualization. The session started with a meditation exercise by reciting a spiritual prayer. With this positive energy it further worked upon realization of qualities already existing in human beings and knowing one's own worth. Professional development and concern of students both should go hand in hand. Thinking, reflection, meaning through contextual learning were the main focus of deliberation by speaker and audience. The session reassured the nurturing of qualities which enhances a teacher's capacity in respect to better student teacher rapport, classroom learning and output enrichment. Teachers were made to think how a teacher can bring completeness to own self.

Dr. Shimla Ved Prakash addressed the audience on theme, "Human values and ethics". The programme was graced by the presence of Chairman, SMES, Sh. S.P. Singh, Director, MSI, Prof. J. P. Singh and Director, MSIT, Sh. K.P. Chaudhary and the faculty and staff of MSI and MSIT. Dr. Shimla Ved Prakash began with the importance of the Educational Institutions in shaping the generations and preparing good citizens. She emphasized on the importance of right education in order to empower human beings by ensuring righteousness in Means of livelihood, rational thinking, nurturing curiosity, Widening of the horizons and work as an equalizing force. Dr. Shimla said that it is the role of educational institutions to aim for academic excellence by updating curriculum, hiring highly accomplished and efficient faculty, modernizing laboratories, using effective methodologies for transacting knowledge and using latest technologies. For ensuring a healthy mind, sports facilities, investing in research etc. are crucial components. On the role of teachers, Dr. Shimla Ved Prakash said that earlier the rank of the teacher (guru) was even higher to the God. But the present scenario is marred by unethical conduct and practices. The teacher must rise above the ordinary and impart quality education to all without discrimination and prejudices. The teacher must aim to acquire the latest knowledge and be attentive to the new developments. With researches, the teachers must add to the body of knowledge. In punctuality, regularity and discipline, the teacher has to be just like Sun. It is the source of infinite knowledge without discriminations and purifies all with the knowledge and hence, removes the darkness of ignorance. The address further drew the attention of the audience to the erosion of the values in society generally and amongst students particularly. She said that the values are diminishing faster and there is a crisis like situation. *Prospective* ways to inculcate values among the youth by lying emphasis on importance of desirable role models, importance of universal truths, laying more emphasis on duties than rights and making right choices was emphasized. In the valedictory programme Honorable Chairman, Sh. S.P. Singh presented a memento to Dr. Shimla Ved Prakash on behalf of Surajmal Memorial Education Society. Prof. J.P. Singh, Director, MSI rendered the vote of thanks by reiterating that teachers have a divine duty to carry ; as teachers are not common people. He drew the programme towards a successful end by congratulating the organizers for organizing the event so well.



2. National Conference on “Paradigm Shift From Developing To Developed India Through Digitization”

National Conference On Paradigm Shift From Developing To Developed India Through Digitization was organized by MSI. The Inaugural Session of the conference started with lightening of lamp ceremony. Welcome address was delivered by Director MSI, Sh. J.P. Singh in which he welcomed all the Dignitaries and participants. Sh. S.P. Singh Hon’ble Chairman, Surajmal Memorial Education Society in his address talked about how in earlier times people faced problems because of lack of communication facilities and now with digitization communication has become much easier. The Keynote address was given by Prof.(Dr.) Anu Singh Lather, Pro- Vice- Chancellor, DTU. She emphasized that with digitization everything can be well planned and corruption will decrease. The Guest of Honour Prof.(Dr.) KumKum Dewan, Vice- Chancellor, Noida International University reiterated that the biggest revolution of mankind is Information Technology and Digitization.

The First Technical Session was chaired by Prof.(Dr.) N.P. Singh, MDI Gurgaon in which six presenters gave their presentations. In this session the topics discussed included issues and challenges in the digital age, Government initiatives in setting up digital infrastructure, changing paradigms for Indian students, compression function and impact of leadership. At the end of the first technical session, the chairperson Prof N.P.Singh gave his expert views on various presentations.

The Second Technical Session was chaired by Prof.(Dr.) Sangeeta Chauhan, Dean University School of Education, GGSIPU. In this session five presentations were given. These presentations dealt with impact of digitization on classroom, how digitization of education can lead to progress of the nation, influence of digitization on management, commerce and media and the researchers perspective on the impediments in using ICT for teaching. The chairperson summed up the session by highlighting the main points in each paper.

On the second day of the conference the Chairman for the First technical session was Prof. Inderjit Dagar, Principal, College of Vocational Studies. In this session five presentations were delivered. The issues deliberated upon in this session included a review of Digital India and its contribution in the development of the nation, opportunities and challenges of converting Indian economy into

digital economy, applying data mining techniques to assess the students needs, demonetization and its impact on digitization, web 2.0 as a tool to promote reflection and characteristics of Smart cities. The chairperson Dr Inderjit Singh Dagar concluded the session by emphasizing on the need to change the mindset of the people towards using digital modes in daily life.

Dr. Manimala Roy, Principal, Basava International School was the Chairman for the Second Technical Session. In this session six presentations were delivered. In this session the topics discussed included impact of growth in cashless economy on Indian society, artificial intelligence and robotics, endeavors for bridging the digital divide in classrooms of India, impact of demonetization on rural banking, merchant banking and creation of e-commerce websites. At the end of the session, Dr Manimala Roy gave her feedback on the presentations.

The Chief Guest for the Valedictory Session was Sh. Vinay Thakur, Director, National E-Governance Department, Ministry of Electronics and IT. He gave his expert talk on the Digital India programme and how it will transform India into a digitally empowered nation. At the end of the session, certificates were presented to the presenters by the Chief Guest. The conference proved to be an enriching learning experience for all the participants.

1. Seminar on “Road Ahead for Indian Insurance Industry: 2020 and Beyond”

Dated:25th August ,2017

The topic for the seminar was “Road Ahead for Indian Insurance Industry: 2020 and Beyond”. The insurance industry has been in the seamless process of transformation with the entry of number of global leaders into the Indian insurance market after the opening of this sector to private players in year 2000. The seminar was sponsored by J.K risk managers and insurance brokers Ltd., Life Insurance Corporation of India and Oriental insurance Company Ltd...Through the deliberation by the industry experts, academicians and researches will help in identifying the steps to take the expected upcoming issues of the future. Seminar was started with the panel discussion on Life insurance. Mr. Sanjay Verma, Regional Manager (CRM) LIC of India explained the concept of persistency and growth required in the terms of profitability, number of policy and innovation required in the various products. Mr. Amit Patra, Chief investment officer, DHFL Pramerica Life insurance Ltd. explained how digitization of agency channel would lead to dynamic more customized insurance environment . However, for achieving the aim of full digitization there are still issues in overcoming the fear factor among the people. Mr. Sunil Solanki Vice president –learning and development, Max life insurance Company Ltd. Explained the scope of mergers expected in general insurance through sale of stake of public sector undertaking and how it will be a win-win situation for both insurer as well as insured. This is likely will result in penetration of more insurance companies.

After that seminar mainly focused on with the panel discussion on non-life as well as health insurance. Mr. Tapan Singhel, Managing Director & CEO, Bajaj Allianz General Insurance Co. Ltd. explained about the importance of non-life insurance. He told that the most important factor in non-life insurance is the profitability indicator that shows the proportion of claims & operating expenses incurred. Apart from this he also told about his journey from being a failure to a successful person. He was also awarded with the “Golden Leadership Award”. Mr. Pavanjit Singh Dhingra, Director, Prudent Insurance Brokers Pvt. Ltd. explained that how he helped in growing Prudent into a company that places over 450 crores of direct premium annually servicing close to 1500 corporate clients on a Pan India basis. Mr. Nishant Jain, Dy. Programme Director, Indo-German Social Security Programme told about various health insurance plans which are available for senior citizens and other people. He also discussed about the advantages of purchasing health insurance policies. Ms. Malti Jaswal, COO, Health Insurance TPA of India worked with general insurance industry since 1986, both public sector and multinational insurers. She mainly stressed on topics such as claims management, fraud control and relevance of health insurance TPAs in India. Ms. Tanmeet Kaur, Sr. Consultant, Ernst&Young, Actuary from Institute and Faculty of Actuaries, UK explained that the pricing of health insurance policies is based on mainly four factors such as age, rating area, no. of people in the family and tobacco use. Apart from this she was also awarded with the “Certificate of Excellence in Academics”.

After the panel discussion an “Open House Question Answer Session” took place in which students asked about their queries related to life, non-life and health insurance and they also asked about the employment

3. Workshop on git --version control system**Dated:3rd February,2018**

BitsPlease Society organised a Hands-On Workshop on “git --version control system” on **3rd February 2018** (Saturday). The workshop was led by Maqbool Alam of BCA (IIIrd Year) and the members of BitsPlease Society were engaged in providing a hands on experience to the audience in doing the live exercise. As scheduled, students were seated by 11.15 a.m and the workshop commenced. The purpose of the workshop was to answer the very first question that arises whenever the topic of "git" is discussed; - "Why do I need git?"

Git is a distributed version control system for tracking changes in computer files and coordinating work on those files among multiple people. That's what Wikipedia says, but what does it mean and how is “git” different from “GitHub”.

As a student git isn't a necessity, but consider a situation where a student, along with associates are working on a big project. Now obviously, they can't share the same Desktop, also, sharing code using a flash drive after each modification would be cumbersome. So, there is a need for an online platform to share code, say Dropbox, with which they can view code and edit it. But things turn

tricky when some of them edit the code at same time and accidentally override each other's changes. That's where git come in handy. Git allows you to track your files and tells what you have worked on, what you are working on and what your friends are working on. So, even if you both work on the same file, your work will not be overridden, instead git will tell what all both the modified files have in common, what is new and what has been deleted, giving you the liberty to either merge the changes into main file or discard there. You must have noticed by now, that GitHub isn't mentioned so far, it's because you don't need GitHub if you all are on the same network. GitHub is useful when you are working remotely, so that you can push your changes to the cloud and then your friends pulls the modified file, makes his changes and then pushes it back to the cloud. Similar to GitHub, there are many other cloud services like Bitbucket, AWS CodeCommit, GitKraken etc. you can use any one of them to track files remotely.

After the introduction of git, the students were taught about some basic keywords like repository, fork, branch, merge, clone etc. After which, the students were helped to configure git and the live Hands-on started.



In the Hands-on part of workshop, students were taught about converting a normal folder into a repository, different stages of git, making a commit, reversing a commit, finding difference between various versions of the same file, locating an old commit, finding status of current repository, checking git logs, pushing and pulling changes from cloud etc.

The overall workshop was a success, active participation and cross questioning made it even more fun. Allotted time for workshop was of one and a half hour but it went for more than 2 hours. In the end, everyone had fun, learned something of value, and BitsPlease society looks forward to give more fruitful workshops in the future.

1. FDP on Latest Research Trends in Information Technology, Education and Management'
Dated : 18th December – 22nd December,2017

A Faculty Development Programmewas organized by Maharaja Surajmal Institute on 'Latest Research Trends in Information Technology, Education and Management' from 18.12.17 to 22.12.17.

The FDP began with an inaugural address by Dr. Prof J.P. Singh Director, Maharaja Surajmal Institute. He emphasized on the importance of holding such FDPs where faculty present and share their knowledge on latest research trends in their respective fields. First presentation was given by Dr. Amit Chaudhary. He delivered his lecture on 'Pattern Recognition using Soft Computing Technique'. He discussed artificial neural networks and handwriting recognition using pattern recognition technique. The next speaker was Dr. ArtiBahuguna. She delivered a Powerpoint presentation on the topic ' Blended Learning and Flipped Classroom'. She discussed the concept and benefits of blended learning and flipped classroom and its implications. The last speaker for the day was Dr. Arvind Gill who delivered a lecture on 'Teachers in Making'. He dealt upon the historical background of development of education in India, the minimum qualifications required for becoming teachers and the subjects they are eligible to teach.

2. FDP on Assuring Quality in Higher Education: Innovation & Challenges

Dated : 17th July'18 to 21st July'2018

Maharaja Surajmal Institute organised One Week Faculty Development Programme on the topic "Assuring Quality in Higher Education: Innovation & Challenges" from 17th July'18 to 21st July'2018.

Day 1 (Inaugural)

The much awaited one week FDP commenced with the traditional lamp lighting ceremony proceeded by Inaugural Speech by Prof. Veera Gupta. *Dr. Gupta* is a policy planner, implementer, researcher and *professor* of educational policy. She has worked in academic, research and regulatory bodies. Her inaugural speech was interactive in nature wherein she sensitise the faculty members towards the need and importance of FDP and how it initiated. According to her FDP has two main purpose- own growth and to improve the growth of education.

She insisted that as a faculty member it is our moral duty to keep ourselves abreast with the development pertaining to the educational field and must update our "skill janampatri". In other words we must update ourselves regularly and do our bit to bring the change in education sector. She asked the faculty members to be mentally dynamic, and be active and look for the policies in order to sensitise our environment. She made it very clear that as educational professionals it is our duty to help the society grow.

Day 2 (First Session)

Day second initiated with the talk given by **Former Director Prof. (Dr.) J. P. Singh** on the **Topic- Value of Life Skills in Higher Education**. Prof. Singh well known for speaking his heart out shared his valuable experiences pertaining to the field of education. He made very clear that Life Skills can never be segregated from education as these skills are part of our everyday life. He was of the view that everyone must strive to lead a quality life by being a better version of him/ herself on every day basis. He also focussed on the need of being appreciative and creating a conducive environment. He also advised faculty members to be open to all kind of questions from students as it will assist them to be expressive and will definitely strike a chord.

Second Session

Second Session was headed by Director MSI, Prof. (Dr.) Rachita Rana. Prof. Rana emphasised on the **role of faculty in nation building**. Her main concern was to sensitise the faculty members to connect with the students, hand-hold them and guide them. She made it very clear that role of teacher is redefined in modern times and a teacher must be appreciative rather than dictator. According to her the main lacuna of current education system is the lack of individual connects. She emphatically said that without passionate teachers a nation cannot progress and as a consequence will have sick minded population in times to come. She asked the faculty members to take that extra mile for the learners and at the same maintaining the efficiency and effectiveness vis-a-vis standards. She asked to prepare study material in such a manner that is deliverable and is according to the need and level of the learner within the constraints of time. She advised to rehearse the lecture well before delivering it in the class.

Her lecture assisted the faculty members to plan a roadmap for coming session and also guide them to set a benchmark.

Day 3 (First Session)

The Topic of for the session was **Enhancement of Quality of Research in Higher Education**. The eminent speaker for the session was Prof. N. P. Singh, Professor (Information Management), Management Development Institute, Gurgaon. He deliberated upon the concerns of higher education with reference to research work. He was of the view that Research in our country lacks scientific approach/ systematic, logical evidences. There is the need to change the mind set of people then only we can talk about bringing quality to research. According to him there is no uniformity in the entire system with reference to research. Universities are following all the

whole different parameters for admission, coursework and evaluation. He also suggested corrective measures like- redefining autonomy, making it result- oriented, creating better measurement for monitoring evaluation, disseminating research among wider audience, making a balance between quantity and quality.

Second Session

Role of Pedagogy and Assessment in Bridging the Industria Academia Gap, this Topic was delineated upon by Dr. Harish Chaudary, Placement Coordinator, IIT Delhi. Dr. Chaudary narrated many anecdotes and conveyed the hard hitting message with child-like ease. He focussed on the need of creating a safe environment for the students. According to him as a teacher we must earn the trust of our students before teaching them. He also suggested that senior teachers should mentor juniors. He elaborated thread-barely upon what makes a good teacher great.

Day 4 (First Session)

Prof. M. C. Sharma, Former Director IGNOU, New Delhi delivered the talk on **Instructional Strategies for Quality Teaching and Learning**. He made it very clear that as a teacher we must focus on implementing quality along with ensuring it. The only limitation with reference to policy making is that a teacher is not given the opportunity to plan the program. But we can contribute to quality education through curriculum transaction. He also shared important instructional strategies to be used by teachers while delivering a lesson. The session was very informative and enriching.

Second Session

Director (MSIT) Prof. (Dr.) K. P. Chaudhary, delivered the talk on **Innovations in Research in Higher Education**. The main focus was on maintaining the quality in Education and research. Throughout his talk the resource person focussed on meeting the parameters in order to maintain the quality and setting new benchmark in research. He explained it thread-barely citing various real life examples. There is dearth of quality work in Higher Education. Advent of technology has revolutionised education and research to a great extent. He reaffirmed the importance of research and the rapid development since past ten or twenty years in knowledge generation and its ramifications for social change and progress. New dynamics are evolving in each of the key domains of higher education. He insisted on recognizing and promoting excellence.

Day 5 (First Session)

Valedictory session was chaired by Dr. Angel Ratnabai from CIET. She delineated upon the need and importance of ICT. Her department consistently focuses on dissemination and extension of ICT resources among schools, students and teachers in every nook and corner of the country. She explained the concept and strategies pertaining to ICT and its implementation. She oriented the students regarding various certificate and diploma courses which are useful for them and which will assist them in teaching learning processes. She motivated the students to visit CIET for hands on learning and developing new apps pertaining to their teaching pedagogy. The session was interactive and interesting where students were very enthusiastic with reference to using the techniques for making presentations. Certificates were distributed at the end of the session.

4. A Special Lecture on Group Discussion and Personal Interview

Dated: 7th September, 2017

A special lecture on “Group Discussion and Personal Interview” was delivered on **7th Sept 2017** by **Mr. Sunil Dua** of Time Education Group in Room No. 401 for **BCA students**. Mr. Dua is a member of the senior faculty of Verbal and GD with a work experience of more than 30 years and has an expertise in English language.

GROUP DISCUSSION

A group discussion is done with the objective to assess ones’ communication skills, team-building skills, level of confidence, conceptual and leadership skills and ability to understand group dynamics. It also tests the person’s knowledge in various fields like education and current affairs as well as his presence of mind working in a group. On average, a group discussion has a time duration of 10 to 20 minutes with a number of 7 to 15 participants. It also has a specific sitting arrangement that enables the members of the group to maintain an eye-contact with one another easily. The seats can be arranged in circular, semi-circular, triangular or a rectangular form.

There are two parties present in a GD- a moderator, who acknowledges the participants with the terms and conditions, topic of the group discussion, he controls the behavior of the group members and keeps in check the time duration of the GD.

The second party is a set of members participating in a group discussion with a goal to achieve a place in the list for personal interview. To obtain good points in a GD, one has to put his best foot forward by initiating the discussion with the best point he has to create a good impression amongst others. Also, you may not get the chance to speak later or someone might have said the point already.

PERSONAL INTERVIEW

After clarifying the GD stage, the candidate undergoes the procedure of a personal interview. A GD assesses a person’s abilities in group co-ordination; the interview tests his individual knowledge. There is a bench of 4 to 5 interviewers testing various skills. General questions asked are “tell us something about yourself” and “goals of life”. One has to know his strengths and weaknesses and always push himself to limits to know his full capability. We can get such answers about ourselves through someone else’s perspective. We should always tell the strengths and weaknesses to the interviewers.

4. Guest Lecture on GST**Dated: 18th September, 2017**

The launch was marked by a historic midnight (1 July –2 July) session of both the houses of parliament convened at the Central Hall of the Parliament.

He helped students realize the benefits of a common tax than paying several taxes with the help of real life examples and even did comparisons to what Tax we were paying before GST and significantly it has declined under GST.

He concluded his talk by detailing out different benefits GST has already roped in for the Indian Economy like A significant drop on the “Ease of Doing Business Ranking” i.e. from somewhat around 149 to 132 and an expectation of it dropping further to 99 by the end of 2020, etc and hoped that it would further be beneficial for the Economy in many ways.

NSIC is an organization that facilitates small scale industries and also encourages students to become an entrepreneur in future.

Students reached there at 10AM and they move towards the incubation centre of NSIC building. Students were then greeted by the representative of NSIC who gave a brief description of various

machines. Firstly, he introduces students with socks weaving machine. This machine can weave socks of different designs and colours. Students get to know about the working of embroidery on socks with the help of another machine.

The students were then shown the oil making machine which makes oil according to the demand and supply needs prevailing in the market. Then the representative of NSIC enhance knowledge of students by giving information about many other machines like water sachet machine, spices knitting machine and also packing of spices in small packets, tissue paper making machine with different quality papers and even one can get printed tissue of their choice, next to it was a packing machine used to pack tissue papers of equal units which could be preselected in the tissue making machine, then machine of similar function which was to make toilet paper rolls with similar concept of breaking a big paper roll into small units, pet bottle making machine which uses small plastic pieces which were heated near to its melting point and then mould into a form of a bottle with the help of air pressure in 1 liter and 1/2 liter bottles, paper plate making machine which would join and bend layers of different type of sheets into 1 paper plate, soya machine which would make soya milk with the help of soya beans or could further be processed to make tofu(soya cottage cheese), biscuit making machine which would bake biscuits and then be cooled down into refrigerators to retain their shape and be packed, and a bread making machine. Students also get to know about the cost of these machines and they concluded that the machines they are introduced with ranged from 1.5lac to 12lac.

Then students were asked to be seated in a conference room where students were encouraged to become an entrepreneur. What are the roles entrepreneurs plays in one's life and in the economy and why our honorable Prime Minister, Mr. Narendra Modi is making efforts to promote it. Students were very enthusiastic and it was a wonderful event.

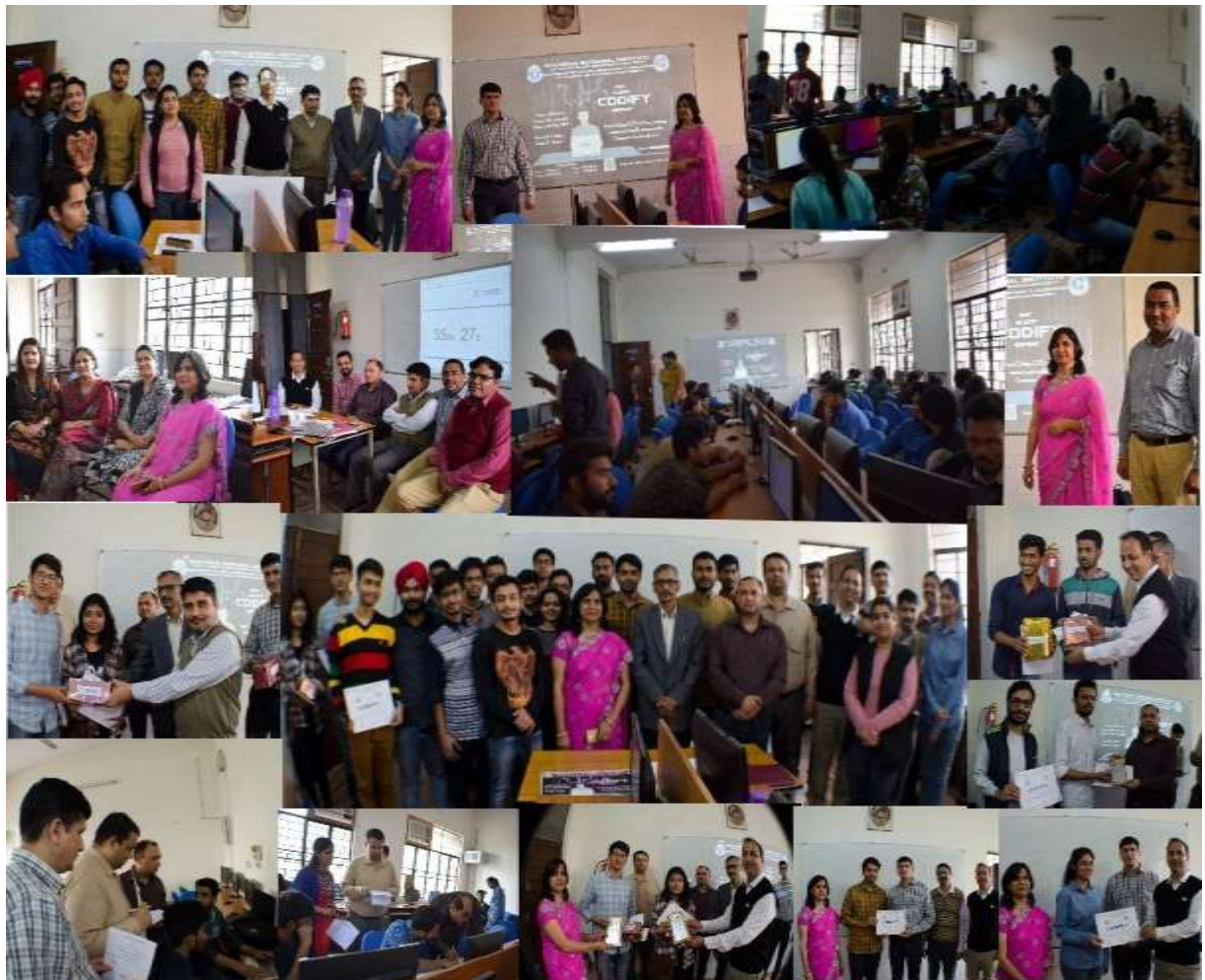

31. Educational Excursion to Yamuna Biodiversity Park

26th February, 2018

An Educational excursion was organized by the Department of BBA, on 26th February, 2018 Maharaja Surajmal Institute to Yamuna Biodiversity Park, Wazirabad village constructed on the flat alluvial plains of the Yamuna. The main aim was to make the students aware of the deteriorating condition of their environment, various conservation strategies and their putative role in future in its

maintenance. The Yamuna Biodiversity Park is located in North Delhi and has attempted to recreate the original riverine ecosystem that River Yamuna is supposed to have in Delhi.

The Field Trip began with introductory remarks about biodiversity conservation and the efforts being made at the Yamuna Biodiversity Park by the Authorities. The students were provided with basic understanding of the various stages through which the Park has undergone, from being a barren piece of land and a fruit orchard supporting the thorny *Zizyphus* to a fully functional and self-sustaining riverine ecosystem that it is today.

'This was followed by a visit to various zones of the Yamuna Biodiversity Park (Phase I) including the two wetlands located inside it. The students were shown several species of herbs and trees that are widely used for medicinal and other purposes and that were once found aplenty in Delhi's urban ecosystem, but have become considerably reduced in number in the city.



Official's interaction with the students help them fetch information about different species of flora and fauna and how they are inter dependent for maintaining the equilibrium of the ecosystem.

In the nature reserve zone, around 30 forest communities have been developed which offer multiple micro-niches and habitats for a diversity of animal species to live and breed in. It was explained how they substantially and naturally they were able to preserve the Yamuna to its natural self. Presently, these wetlands also receive flocks of migratory birds (around 5000) from Siberia and other Palearctic regions every year.

The discussion around the migration of birds and ability of the Park to provide a habitat for them was a good learning experience for the students.

Biodiversity parks with their rich flora and fauna, managed and developed using scientific expertise are ideal instruments for promoting conservation education that will ultimately have a positive impact on environment quality and conservation ethics.
