**1. National Conference**

**Dated:23<sup>rd</sup> February,2019**

**Opening Addresses**

The function began with a formal welcoming of guests and the faculty of Maharaja Surajmal Institute. MSI has built a reputation through the dedicated and selfless endeavours of educationists and social workers who are deeply concerned with the standards of education and are determined to upgrade the quality, content and direction of education. The function began with lighting of the lamp ceremony.

**Dr Rajeshwari Malik, Co-Convener** then welcomed the guests and the faculty, and dedicated the conference to **Honourable President, Late Sh. S. P. Singh ji** whose Motto was **Dream It, Believe It, Build It** and after this homage she spoke about the future, how India's economy is going to be the third largest economy in the world by 2040 and the temporariness of any skill because of industrial revolution 4.0, the half- life of a skill is rapidly falling, currently it is 5 years which means that the 50% of what you have learnt will be a irrelevant after 5 years because of which every 5 to 10 years people will have to go back to colleges, the focus on education in the future will be high, the gap between industry and colleges will be reduced. Gone are the days where employees can enjoy the prospect of 60-year careers. She then closed her presentation with a very inspiring quote *"Technology will never replace grade teacher, however technology in the hands of great teacher can transform the future"*

**Dr Rachita Rana** -Director (MSI) delivered the **welcome address**, she spoke a few words about the chief guest Professor KK Aggarwal the guest of honour Dr.R.D. Sharma and the senior Vice President of Surajmal memorial education society Shri Kaptan Singh about their accomplishments and how they inspire her, support her ,motivate her and how they have been a beacon of light.

**Shri Kaptan Singh** (Vice- President, Surajmal Memorial Education Society) **addressed** the audience, he spoke about how people always talk about technology, industry but often forget the common man. 90% of the farmers are small marginal farmers,20% of them earn less than 2500 rupees per month which is insufficient to meet the bare necessities of life. Since 70% of the population is either in farming or farming related sector this can't be ignored.

**Prof. K. K. Aggarwal** - The chief Guest delivered the **inaugural address** he expressed his gratitude to be back after a gap of 15 years he spoke about how India slip down the network readiness index from 68<sup>th</sup> position in 2013 to 91<sup>st</sup> position and same thing happened with Global innovation index, the common factor between them was that after politicians learned about digital revolution and the importance of innovation, they talked about it and thought their job was done but talking is never enough, we need to take action as well. He spoke about the industrial revolution 4.0 as well as education 4.0, because of education 4.0 people won't need to go colleges to get educated they could educate themselves. People in India willbe able to design their own degree after 12<sup>th</sup> in the future, it doesn't have to be exact engineering, it doesn't have to be exact designing or medicine or Economics it can be a mix of all the four. The speed with which the technology is changing is so fast that about 65%of the five -six year olds right now will all be doing jobs whose names we don't know today. Because of Industrial Revolution 4.0

electric cars will soon be cheaper than regular cars because a regular car has 10,000 moving parts but the electric cars will only have 20 moving parts and soon there will be driverless cars.

**Dr RD Sharma** – guest of honour then took the stage he spoke about the importance of these academic events as we can't be confined to the literature available because of this dynamic world you also spoke about meaningful research How meaningful literature, research process, all of this is not meaningful, it is only meaningful when it's shared with other people. He also spoke about how Industrial Revolution 4th and 4.0 is different. It is marked by emerging technology breakthroughs in a number of fields, including [robotics](#), [artificial intelligence](#), [nanotechnology](#), [quantum computing](#), [biotechnology](#), the [Internet of Things](#), the [Industrial Internet of Things \(IIoT\)](#), [decentralized consensus](#), [fifth-generation wireless technologies \(5G\)](#), [additive manufacturing/3D printing](#) and [fully autonomous vehicles](#) first revolution witnessed the emergence of mechanization, a process that replaced agriculture with industry as the foundations of the economic structure of society. Nearly a century later at the end of the 19th century, new technological advancements initiated the emergence of a new source of energy: electricity, gas and oil. As a result, the development of the combustion engine set out to use these new resources to their full potential. third industrial revolution appeared with the emergence of a new type of energy whose potential surpassed its predecessors: nuclear energy

**Prof. (Dr.) Harish Singh**, Convener- **delivered** the vote of, he conveyed his condolences to the family of Shri.S.P. Singh the President of Surajmal Memorial Education Society he addressed and thanked the chief guest Mr K K Agarwal guest of honour RD Sharma director of MSI Dr.Rachita Rana and his colleagues.

**Mr Vijay Kumar Gupta** deliver the first technical session he spoke about industrial revolution and reforms Covered a wide array of topics like the issues affecting the economy Adam Smith, Pulwama attack, excessive dependence on agriculture, high rate of population growth, chronic under employment or over employment, poor rate of capital formation, inequality in the distribution of wealth, underutilization of natural resources, lack of infrastructure, low level of living, poor quality of human capital, demographic characteristics, inadequate development of economic organisation .Some other issues like China, synthetic eggs India's love for gold and even Charlie Chaplin and James Bond

There were three **paper presentation**; Mr Ashraf Alam, on the topic: Higher education in India the need for reform in defence of globalisation, MS Deepshika Sharma on the topic: The role of education in women health in different socioeconomic status in Delhi, and Ms Hanisha Batra on the topic: A study of challenges faced by the counsellors in providing guidance and counselling services in secondary schools of Delhi.

**Dr PR Mishra** delivered technical session II on blockchain: issues and challenges He spoke about how Blockchains are having trouble effectively supporting a large number of users on the network. Both Bitcoin and Ethereum have experienced slowed transaction speeds and higher fees charged per transaction as a result of a substantial increase in users. Since the launch of bitcoin, it has long been associated with the shadowy dealings of the black market and the dark web. Because this is the first interaction of the public with blockchain technology, this connection has persisted with bitcoin, altcoins, and the tech underlying it as well. The Ethereum smart contract platform allows developers to deploy their own decentralized apps for a varied array of uses. While bitcoin is the leading cryptocurrency, the Ethereum network allows users to transfer the potential of the blockchain to real-world applications. Blockchain technology is an effective tool for reducing costs. It reduces the fees associated with transferring value and can streamline operational processes.

However, because it is a relatively new innovation, it is difficult to integrate it with legacy systems. Such a process is likely to be an expensive affair that many corporations and governments will be unwilling to undertake. And he spoke about some other issues like Energy Consuming Consensus Mechanisms, privacy, security.

After Second technical session there was a valedictory session address **by Professor K P Singh**. He congratulated the members for their judicious selection of the theme. He talked about promoting integrated approach in teaching

the students as we are preparing the students for New India. He strongly recommended few change in our education policy to promote multidisciplinary approach. There should be no strict demarcations of disciplines and examination system should be revamped. He also opined that teacher's role in this technological era is very crucial as S/he is now a facilitator and guide. He further suggested that there is a dire need of teachers like Swami Vivekanada and A P J Abdul Kalam for shaping the youth. He also focussed on the need of generating employment in the rural areas. He shared many anecdotes in this reference.

**Professor J P Singh** delivered vote of thanks hi thank chief guest KK Aggarwal guest of honour RD Sharma to Grace us with their presence. He thanked doctor Harish Singh and Dr Rajeshwari Malik, the convener and the Co-convener of the conference, and the faculty of MSI for their hard work and perseverance and dedication to this institute and education as well.

**1. FDP on Assuring Quality in Higher Education: Innovation & Challenges**

**Dated : 17th July'18 to 21<sup>st</sup> July'2018**

Maharaja Surajmal Institute organised One Week Faculty Development Programme on the topic "Assuring Quality in Higher Education: Innovation & Challenges" from 17th July'18 to 21<sup>st</sup> July'2018.

**Day 1 (Inaugural)**

The much awaited one week FDP commenced with the traditional lamp lighting ceremony proceeded by Inaugural Speech by Prof. Veera Gupta. **Dr. Gupta** is a policy planner, implementer, researcher and professor of educational policy. She has worked in academic, research and regulatory bodies. Her inaugural speech was interactive in nature wherein she sensitise the faculty members towards the need and importance of FDP and how it initiated. According to her FDP has two main purpose- own growth and to improve the growth of education.

She insisted that as a faculty member it is our moral duty to keep ourselves abreast with the development pertaining to the educational field and must update our "skill janampatri". In other words we must update ourselves regularly and do our bit to bring the change in education sector. She asked the faculty members to be mentally dynamic, and be active and look for the policies in order to sensitise our environment. She made it very clear that as educational professionals it is our duty to help the society grow.

**Day 2 (First Session)**

Day second initiated with the talk given by **Former Director Prof. (Dr.) J. P. Singh** on the **Topic- Value of Life Skills in Higher Education**. Prof. Singh well known for speaking his heart out shared his valuable experiences pertaining to the field of education. He made very clear that Life Skills can never be segregated from education as these skills are part of our everyday life. He was of the view that everyone must strive to lead a quality life by being a better version of him/ herself on every day basis. He also focussed on the need of being appreciative and creating a conducive environment. He also advised faculty members to be open to all kind of questions from students as it will assist them to be expressive and will definitely strike a chord.

**Second Session**

Second Session was headed by Director MSI, Prof. (Dr.) Rachita Rana. Prof. Rana emphasised on the **role of faculty in nation building**. Her main concern was to sensitise the faculty members to connect with the students, hand-hold them and guide them. She made it very clear that role of teacher is redefined in modern times and a teacher must be appreciative rather than dictator. According to her the main lacuna of current education system is the lack of individual connects. She emphatically said that without passionate teachers a nation cannot progress and as a consequence will have sick minded population in times to come. She asked the faculty members to take that extra mile for the learners and at the same maintaining the efficiency and effectiveness vis-a-vis standards. She asked to prepare study material in such a manner that is deliverable and is according to the need and level of the learner within the constraints of time. She advised to rehearse the lecture well before delivering it in the class. Her lecture assisted the faculty members to plan a roadmap for coming session and also guide them to set a benchmark.

**Day 3 (First Session)**

The Topic of for the session was **Enhancement of Quality of Research in Higher Education**. The eminent speaker for the session was Prof. N. P. Singh, Professor (Information Management), Management Development Institute, Gurgaon. He deliberated upon the concerns of higher education with reference to research work. He was of the view that Research in our country lacks scientific approach/ systematic, logical evidences. There is the need to change the mind set of people then only we can talk about bringing quality to research. According to him there is no uniformity in the entire system with reference to research. Universities are following all the whole different parameters for admission, coursework and evaluation. He also suggested corrective measures like- redefining autonomy, making it result- oriented, creating better measurement for monitoring evaluation, disseminating research among wider audience, making a balance between quantity and quality.

#### **Second Session**

**Role of Pedagogy and Assessment in Bridging the Industria Academia Gap**, this Topic was delineated upon by Dr. Harish Chaudary, Placement Coordinator, IIT Delhi. Dr. Chaudary narrated many anecdotes and conveyed the hard hitting message with child-like ease. He focussed on the need of creating a safe environment for the students. According to him as a teacher we must earn the trust of our students before teaching them. He also suggested that senior teachers should mentor juniors. He elaborated thread-barely upon what makes a good teacher great.

#### **Day 4 (First Session)**

Prof. M. C. Sharma, Former Director IGNOU, New Delhi delivered the talk on **Instructional Strategies for Quality Teaching and Learning**. He made it very clear that as a teacher we must focus on implementing quality along with ensuring it. The only limitation with reference to policy making is that a teacher is not given the opportunity to plan the program. But we can contribute to quality education through curriculum transaction. He also shared important instructional strategies to be used by teachers while delivering a lesson. The session was very informative and enriching.

#### **Second Session**

**Director (MSIT) Prof. (Dr.) K. P. Chaudhary**, delivered the talk on **Innovations in Research in Higher Education**. The main focus was on maintaining the quality in Education and research. Throughout his talk the resource person focussed on meeting the parameters in order to maintain the quality and setting new benchmark in research. He explained it thread-barely citing various real life examples. There is dearth of quality work in Higher Education. Advent of technology has revolutionised education and research to a great extent. He reaffirmed the importance of research and the rapid development since past ten or twenty years in knowledge generation and its ramifications for social change and progress. New dynamics are evolving in each of the key domains of higher education. He insisted on recognizing and promoting excellence.

#### **Day 5 (First Session)**

**Valedictory session** was chaired by Dr. Angel Ratnabai from CIET. She delineated upon the need and importance of ICT. Her department consistently focuses on dissemination and extension of ICT resources among schools, students and teachers in every nook and corner of the country. She explained the concept and strategies pertaining to ICT and its implementation. She oriented the students regarding various certificate and diploma courses which are useful for them and which will assist them in teaching learning processes. She motivated the students to visit CIET for hands on learning and developing new apps pertaining to their teaching pedagogy. The session was interactive and interesting where students were very enthusiastic with reference to using the techniques for making presentations. Certificates were distributed at the end of the session.

### 3. Workshop on Shibui Talks- First talk

**Dated: 8<sup>th</sup> September, 2018**

An Event named “Shibui Talks” was organised in our college, Maharaja Surajmal Institute on 8<sup>th</sup> September, 10AM in the auditorium. The aim of Shibui talks is to stress on the holistic development of the students. All the students of BBA first year (both shifts) were present for the event. The event started with explaining the meaning of shibui which was done by Dr. Rajeshwari Malik. She explained how Shibui is something that summarizes the best in way of life, yet it has no explanation and cannot be translated. Then she continued by explaining the seven elements of Shibui.

The first element of shibui is “simplicity” which is ultimate sophistication. Simplicity is having, doing, talking and thinking only what is important to us and others. Second element of Shibui is “Implicitity”. An implicit attitude is a memory that serves as a connecting link between an object and feeling or thoughts towards that object. Implicit learning is the learning of complex information in an incidental manner, without awareness of what has been learned. Then she also explained the difference between implicit and explicit learning by giving various and interesting examples. Then she continued to the third element of shibui which was “modesty”. It means being unassuming in the estimation of one’s abilities. It is an intrapsychic reality that doesn’t take credit, and is humble, thoughtful and not big headed. It is also a social phenomenon that is plain and not flashy, unpretentious and avoids attention. The fourth element is “naturalness”. It means to be like water making its way through cracks. It is a combination of balancing, natural instinct and control. The fifth element is “everydayness”. It is a human project and a blessing. Humans have the inalienable capacity to find a way of living that is, more or less satisfying. Everydayness is recognized by conditions like idle talks. It is a mode of being the attitude towards reality, which typifies our ‘normal’ participation in the life world. The sixth element is “imperfection”. It means life is not perfect. The world we live in is far from perfect. It means we can stop pursuing the mystical, perfect life. The seventh element is “silence”. Silence is a powerful thing. The control group was exposed to silence and they found that after exposing the mice to silence for two hours.

He supported this idea by giving some short examples ranging from simple machines to humans and explaining that how the most plain and simple things in life have a complex working process and how these things work without letting us realize their true nature.

The event started with Lighting of the Lamp and Floral Tribute to late Sh.Ram Niwas Mirdhaji. Then a Brief Insight was given by Prof.(Dr.)Rachita Rana about the Honorable Mirdhaji as Philanthropist and a Visionary.

Dr.Ved Prakash delievered the lecture on “Historical Progress towards, “Quality Higher Education in India”

The lecture gave a detailed account of the journey of education in India from the reminiscence of history to present day silhouette. In his talk he said the education which doesn’t enlighten the mind of person, is more harmful than not being uneducated. It also accepted that even the Americans had to modify its means of education when Russia launched SPUTNIK in October 1957.America brought a consensus on one man commission to promote science and mathematics education. They realized that quality is of paramount significance. Quality education requires continous efforts from leaders,organisers, administrators. We have a history of rich learning centres like Takshila Nalanda And Vikramshila. Then during the era of britishers higher education invited a little attention and centres like Hindu college in Calcutta in the year 1817, Pune college in 1833, Agra college in 1837 came to effect. They acted as centre for awarding completion and finishing certificate, which was enough to pursue contemporary higher

education from abroad as well. The woods commission in 1854 (also known as magna carta of education) recommended university of Calcutta, Bombay and madras. Post-independence Pt. Jawahar lal Nehru who was great visionary paid attention to cause of education and constituted university education commission in the year 1948 under the chairmanship of S. Radhakrishnan to ascertain the kind of resources they were spending on education. After 4 years it was realized feeder education is needed to be strengthened and secondary education commission in the year 1952 under the chairmanship of Mudaliar was constituted. After two decades in 1964-66, Indian education commission under the chairmanship of Dr D. S. Kothari came covering all levels of education. But during this phase at the political front the country faced war with china and Pakistan. Then Rajiv Gandhi era marked the new policy initiatives. The massive demands of education led to inappropriate public funding and 1990-2004 marked massive liberalization of economy and as well as field of education. Then there was second wave of expansion of higher education in our country having a totally of unprecedented change and introduction of architecture and management as the new subjects of study. This new space created for learning provided with scope to innovate and create.



Now we are witness to New education policy on education 2015 having as many as 33 different areas of specialization. Today we are talking about online delivery, vocational orientation to higher education and autonomy in respect to governance. The education today is in gigantic shape and it is enlarging with 864 degree awarding universities, 11000 thousand standalone institutions and a total of 36.7 million enrolment of students and 15 lakhs teachers. Progress is fairly well but quality is a concern for educational administrators and political executives. The matter of concern is teaching neither creates interest nor promotes relation with social milieu. That is why the learner searches the route of escapism. If a learner is a not exposed to social problem, then how one can expect a solution from him related to the environmental issues. What is needed most is inclusive and qualitative expansion of higher education. For this quality teaching, quality research and innovation is equally important. The



UGC, ICSSR, ICHR and other agencies promotes research funding and allocation of funds must cover wider areas and more subjects. Subject specific benchmarking is essential, the sooner it is done, will be good for education. Sh Ved Prakash ji also highlighted the importance of Academic audit in relation to all aspects pertaining to teaching and learning outcomes at institutional level should be mandatory. The session indeed touched every being present in the auditorium and reminded them of the vision of our beloved president Mirdha ji. **Dated:14<sup>th</sup> February 2019**

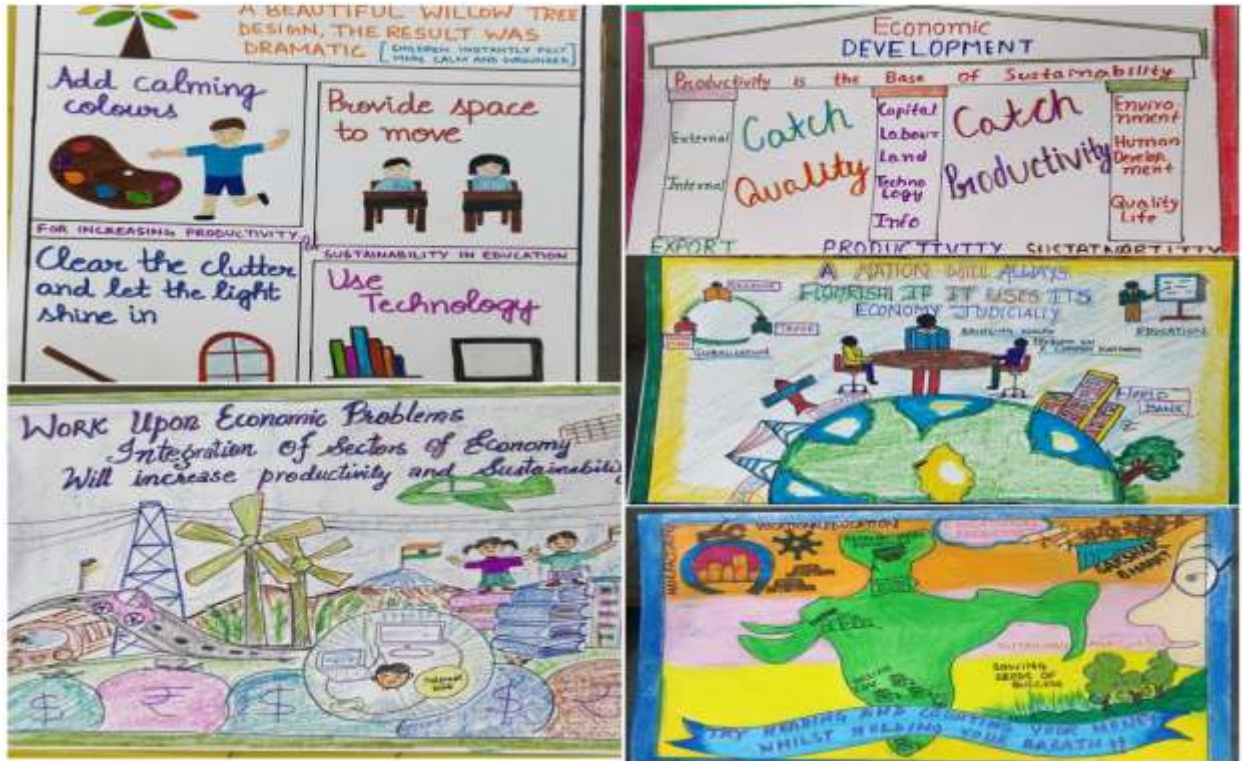

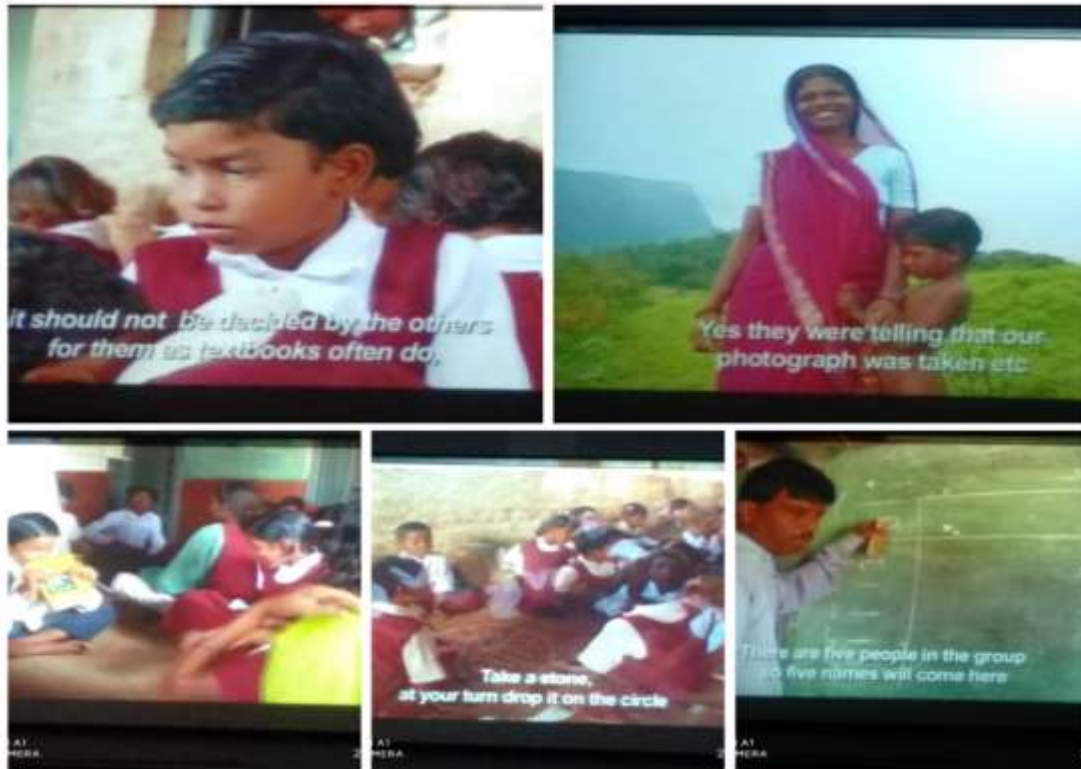
### **32. Movie Screening of 'Teacher's Journey'**

If they do, students from the upper caste are provided with the food first and the leftovers are consumed by the dalits. It is shown that children from the lower caste are willing to learn, but they are not provided with the opportunities to grow. The documentary makes one introspect about the need to include all sections of society in the realms of Education.

#### 40. Crazy Quiz

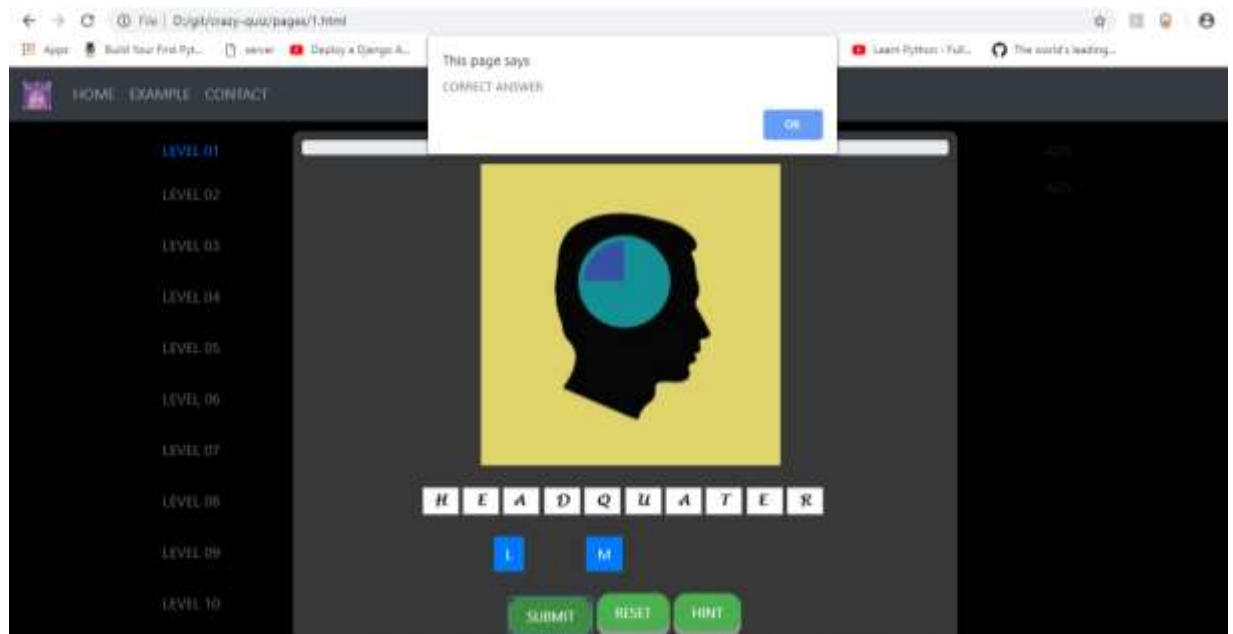
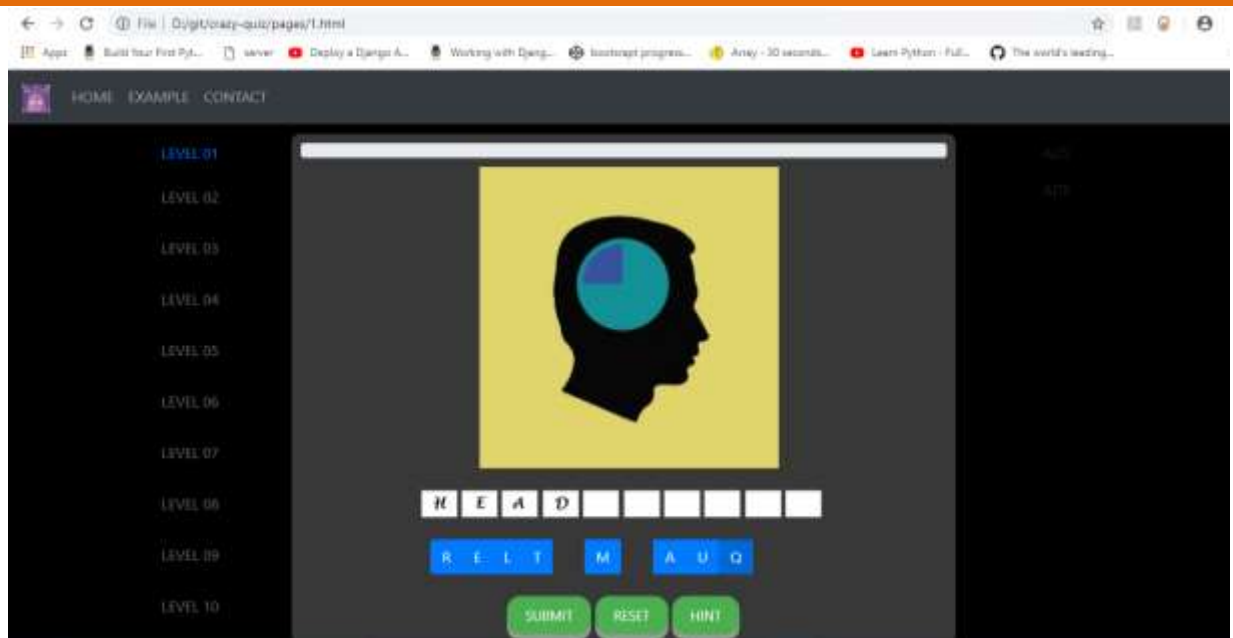
Dated:13<sup>th</sup> March,2019

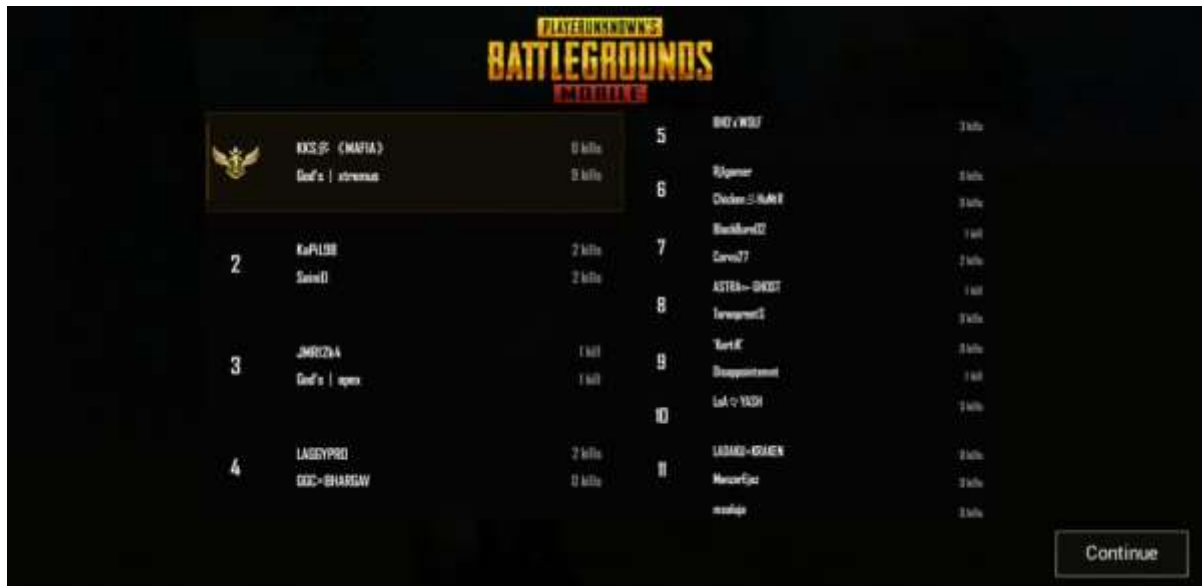

- To undertake research, evaluation and monitoring of the systems, programs and materials with a view to improving the materials and increasing their effectiveness.
- To document and disseminate information, materials and media programs for better utilization and to function as a clearing house / agency in the field of Educational Technology.
- To advise and coordinate the academic and technical programs and activities of the State Institutes of Educational Technology (SIETs) set up by the MHRD in six states of India.

Students and faculty members assembled at Gate No. 1 of NCERT and reported at CIET Building at 9:30am. Having marked the attendance everyone headed to the seminar room where a brief introduction of the day's schedule was given by Dr. Deepti Gupta (Assistant Professor at NCERT).

The **First Session** commenced at 10:00am. Head of the Department Dr. Uday briefed the students with the basic structure of NCERT and CIET, their functioning and importance. He explained the work and significance of the departments in NCERT.
