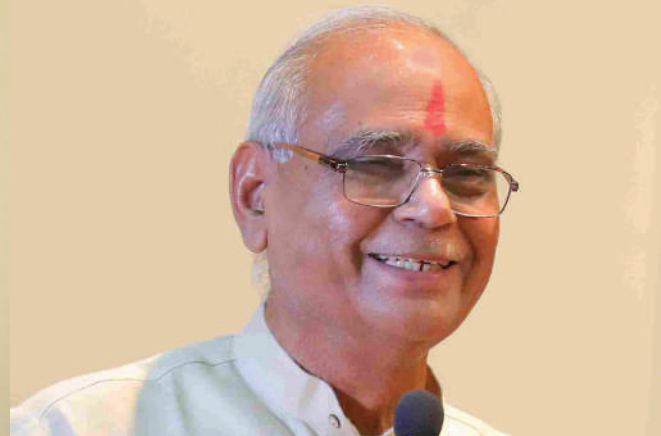

## **Maharaja Surajmal** *Could have been Emperor* (1707 A.D – 1763 A.D.)

The political landscape of India during the eighteenth century was not much different from what it had tended to be, more or less the same as far as its divisiveness is concerned, except of course, the period of the great empires of the Mauryas, the Guptas and the great Mughals . The British Empire comes into its own category.

The decline of the Mughal Empire, after Aurangzeb, was primarily caused by his thoughtless bigotry and reckless economic policies. In contrast to this the established tolerant approach of the Great Mughals had been responsible for maintaining amity and stability in the empire. North and Northwestern India during the later part of the seventeenth century was in continuous turmoil. The peasant revolt led by Gokula in 1680, though unsuccessful on the surface, proved a catalectic in igniting the minds of the peaceful village folk to fight for their rights. The eighteenth century brought bad omens for the Mughal Empire.



The impending vacuum in power led to the inviting of new players like the Jats, the Marathas and the several aspiring Muslim noblemen in the arena of politics, vying to occupy the space. The same year (1707) gave to the peasantry of North India a son, like the sun risen on the horizon in the birth of Surajmal in the house of a peasant chief Raja Badan Singh of Bhagalpur. Surajmal as a young boy joined his father as the latter's right hand man and helped in consolidating and expanding the Bharatpur territory to be ultimately recognized as a kingdom of consequence by the Mughal Emperor.

With the deterioration of the sight of Badan Singh, Surajmal assumed the reins of the Bharatpur kingdom as a de-facto ruler. Moving on from where his father had reached, he acquired new territories for the Bharatpur State. But the hallmark of his approach to restrict his endeavors in spreading his influence only over the territories largely dominated by his compatriots, the Jat peasants, who though of republican propensities accepted antime d went with the monarchical ruler. On his part Surajmal kept a peasant's profile both in manners and conduct. He had acquired the reputation of a warrior of great prowess at a fairly young age. His performance in the battle of succession at Baghru (1748) fighting from the side of Ishwar Singh of Jaipur lives on as a legend even today. Surajmal had risen to the occasion to fulfill his word given to the dying Raja Jai Singh. The powerful Marathas fighting on the side of the other contender Madho Singh had to taste dust in the rather fateful encounter. But at the time Surajmal was well aware of the devastation that war brings to the common people. Therefore as far as possible he ensured that his territories do not turn into an arena of war. Internally he maintained law and order thoroughly ensuring safety of the life and wealth of not only his subjects but also the safe return of the wealth of traders which they preferred to deposit with Surajmal in times of turbulence. He continued to be helpful to the rising rulers of the peasant fraternity like Balram of Ballabhgarh, Rana Bhim Singh of Gohad and the Jat rulers of Bajhod, Kajaura and Karauli.

How he handled, without giving up, the seize of his fort at Kumher (1754) laid by a confederacy of the Marathas, the Mughal Wazir Imad and Rohilla chief Najib can be described as an incredible feat. He did not hesitate to part with his hard earned wealth to be given as war expenses to mighty opponents, be they the money seeking Marathas or the avaricious Afghan Abdali.

Surajmal's best talent came out in the moments of crisis and turbulence. He kept his cool and baffled his contemporaries with his adroit diplomatic moves on many occasions precariously placed as he was between Abdali and on the North and the Marathas on the South, and had to continuously deal with the established Rajputs. With his robust communication skills he succeeded in evading an invasion by Abdali (1757) who was lurking in the vicinity of Bharatpur after having devastated major parts of the Brij country side. The contents and tone and tenor of his letter to Abdali given below is seen by experts as an example of fine diplomacy:

I have no important position and power in the empire of Hindustan. I am one of the zamindars living in the desert and on account of my worthlessness none of the Emperors of the age thought it worthy of him to interfere with my affairs. Now that a powerful Emperor like your Majesty, determined on meeting and opposing me face to face in the field of battle, would draw his armies against this insignificant person, that action alone would be discreditable to the dignity and greatness of the Shah and would help in the elevation of my position and people would say that the Emperor of Iran and Turan had, out of extreme fear, marched his armies upon a penniless nomad. These words alone would be a matter of great shame for your Majesty... Moreover, the ultimate result is not altogether free from uncertainty. If with all this power and equipage, you succeed in destroying a weakling like me, what credit there will be gained?.... But if by divine decree, which is not known to anyone, the affair takes a different turn (i.e. Ahmed Shah is forced to embrace defeat) all this power and predominance brought about by your Majesty during a period of eleven years will finish in a moment.

As to the threatening and violent order issued for the slaughter and devastation of myself, warriors have no fear on that score. It is well known that no intelligent man has any faith in this transient life. As for myself, have already crossed fifty of the stages (of life) and know nothing of the remaining. There shall be no greater blessing than that I should drink the drought (of martyrdom)...in the field of battle with valiant soldiers and leave my name and that of my ancestors on the pages of the book of the age to be remembered that a powerless peasant breathed equality with such a great and powerful emperor as had reduced mighty king to subjection and that he fell fighting. And the same virtuous intention lies at heart of my faithful followers and companions. Even if I wish to make up my mind to attend the threshold of your... Court the honour of my friends does not permit me. Under such circumstances, if your majesty.... forgive me and turn your attentions to expeditions of greater importance, no harm shall come to your dignity and glory. The truth about the three forts (belonging to me), the object of your wrath which have been regarded by your Majesty's chiefs as weak as spider's web, shall be tested only after an actual contest. God willing they shall be invincible as Alexander's Rampart.

[Quoted from Tarikh-i-Imad-ul-Mulk, 243-245 by Ganda Singh, Durrani, 181-183]

You have not conquered India as yet. If you have taken hold of an inexperienced child (Imad) who held Delhi, what is there to be proud of? If you have any pretensions, why this delay (in attacking me)?... I have spent large sums of money on this (Kumher) fort. The Shah can be kind to me by fighting with me as that the world may remember in future that a Badshah came from Vilayat and conquered Delhi, but was helpless against an insignificant zamindar. [Jam-i-Jahan Numa quoted by Ganda Singh, Durrani, p.183]

It is a matter of regret that but for the Marathas his efforts to form a coalition against Abdali bore little fruit. In not listening to his Saner counsel the Maratha general Bhau had to pay a heavy price in the battle against Abdali at Panipat (1761). Surajmal indeed did not join the Marathas at Panipat because he had seen through their game. He had been forewarned by some well meaning elements around Bhau about his plan to swallow the Jat principality along with the Delhi throne once he was done up with Abdali. Surajmal was not a nitwit not to have seen through the Maratha's game.

Surajmal had all the qualities of a good ruler. Welfare of his subjects was his main concern. Trade and commerce thrived in his kingdom as he remitted transit duties and facilitated commercial transactions. He did not spend his money in wasteful projects but he did not lag behind in creating a full fledged department of charity under Somnath Chaturvedi. He patronized men of Art and Learning. The forts and buildings raised by him at Deeg, Bharatpur, Kumher and Wair are standing testimony of his taste as a builder and connoisseur of Art. His adopting of a happy blend of the features of Mughal and Hindu architecture in his buildings produced a new style called the Jat architecture. About his palace at Deeg which got completed several years after his death, Father Wendell, a contemporary has to say:

“It is difficult to realize the expanse and magnificence of this palace without seeing it. I have seen none in Hindustan that would surpass it in magnificence or would come near to it.”

Surajmal was liberal in his religious views. He built several tanks, arbors, temples and chhatris at Govardhan, Mathura and Vrindaban and other places. He was equally regardful of Islam. When tauntingly asked by Malharrao, how the Jama Masjid at Mathura was proudly standing in his Hindu principality, he simply remarked that he could demolish it if someone could guarantee that no single temple will be dismantled as a consequence or more importantly if anyone could guarantee him perpetual royalty, a fickle commodity. His friendship with Safdarjung was based on mutual faith and trust which stood all ordeal. Equally intense was his disliking and hatred for Najib. In the words of Wendell, “He was loved by his own and respected by all near him not so much because of the exploits which he accomplished, as because he was forthright in his capability to do what he had taken upon himself.”

The military legacy of Surajmal speaks of his organizing skills and vision of planning internal and external security for the people of his state. He left behind a cavalry of 15000 strength, 25000 infantrymen, 300 pieces of cannons with 60 elephants and 50 horses in stables apart from a well endowed treasure.

Had Surajmal not been stubbornly determined in not heeding to Najeeb's repeated pleadings for reconciliation on the issue of the Mewati nawab's betrayal, occasion would not have occurred for the son of Mewati to have been lurking around for revenge. His going back on his word given to the Nawab of Farrukh Nagar was not in line with his entire polity and temperament demonstrated throughout his career. We can only guess. Perhaps Surajmal had better reasons for behaving as did.

Had Surajmal survived the ambush attack on him made on him (on 25 December 1763) with a stratagem in east of Delhi at a time when victory was merely at a smelling distance, the political map of India would have been differently drawn and its history differently shaped. In other words Surajmal would have been sitting in the throne of Delhi which he so richly deserved. But who can write the script of destiny already written?

### FURTHER STUDIES

Domestic Secretary is 10+2 examination from a recognized University and the candidate must secure at least 55% aggregate marks in their examination. Candidates who are pursuing or waiting for the final year of 12th examination may also eligible to apply for CS examination. The candidate age should have a minimum 17 years at the time of appearing for Foundation course.

Company Secretary Course divided into three stage:-

- **Foundation course.**
- **Intermediate Course or Executive course.**
- **Final Course or professional course.**

Candidates who are completed 12th examination with 55% aggregate mark can eligible to apply for Foundation course. After completing foundation course, the candidate need to second level of course. Those who are cleared the all the level of the Company Secretary course is granted Membership to the Institute.

#### ❖ **Certified Management Accountant (CMA)**

If you have plans of going global or working in the Top MNCs then going for international certifications is the right choice for you. ACCA (Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) is the world's leading and fastest-growing international accountancy organization with 162, 000 members and 428, 000 students in 173 countries. The ACCA qualification helps develop successful careers in the fields of accounting, banking, management and consulting, and is a major advantage in competing for senior roles. ACCA is considered to be very similar to CA but ACCA program provides you with additional knowledge about UK GAAP, IFRS and laws which makes ACCA superior

to CA. To successfully complete your ACCA program you will need to clear 14 papers.

The programme makes a teacher skilled in coming up with innovative teaching techniques. This course teaches a lot and one becomes more competent in understanding psychological principles of growth and development and individual differences of the students which helps a lot in understanding their demands and needs. A teacher can also learn to guide the children and counsel them in solving their personal and academic problems.

### **PROSPECTS AFTER B.ED.**

The course ensures job security, job satisfaction and also good pay packages. One of the scopes of doing B.Ed is to pursue higher degree in education.

- M.Ed. or MA in Education after which he/ she can get jobs in B.Ed. Colleges. M.Ed. is a regular course whereas MA Education can be done both correspondence and regularly.
- Teaching Jobs as TGT and PGT teachers in Govt as well as private schools.

Obviously this is the first and foremost thing you can do after B.Ed. There are two categories of teaching posts you can get after doing your B.Ed. First is of TGTs (Masters / Mistresses). For getting the jobs as TGT, the candidates need to do Graduation and then B.Ed. in the concerned subjects. These teachers are expected to teach from 6th to 10th classes. If you are PG in any of the subjects and then you do your B.Ed. in the concerned subject, you can apply for PGT Posts. For that you must have 50% in the PG Degree. The CTET is mandatory to become teachers in the school. After doing B.Ed you must focus on the CTET Examination.

- **Online Tutors**

Online tutoring can also be opted after completion of your B.Ed. and you can specialize in providing online tuitions for 6th to 12th grade students that covers, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Economics, Statistics, languages and so on. Each tutoring session can be customized as per student's requirements. Making extensive use of digital white boards, audio and video to make the tuition more interactive and effective is a good option. Every session can be recorded to help students to review it in later stage.

- **Education Consultant**

One who is an independent consultant and helps parents, students and organisations with educational planning. They are classed as "educational, vocational, and school counsellors. These consultants are, however, normally self-employed (or are part of consulting firms), while school counsellors are employed by a school.

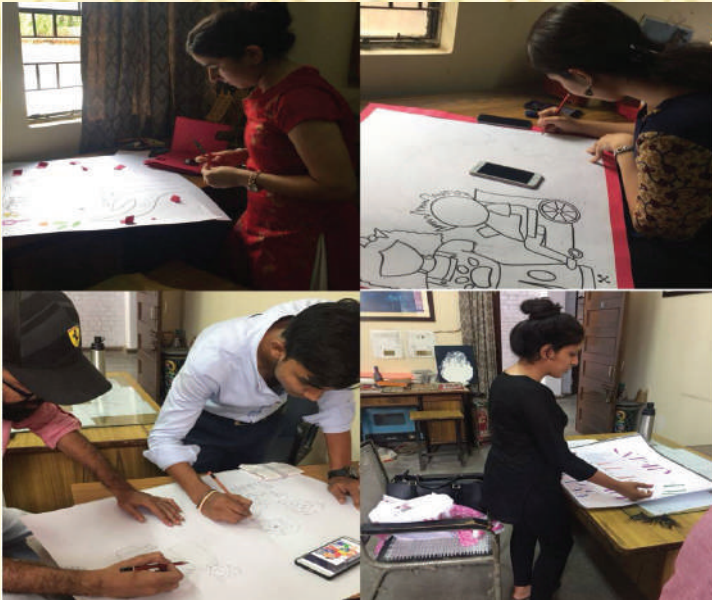

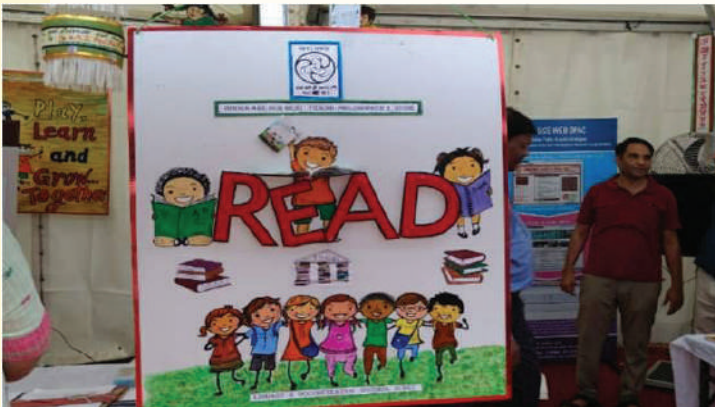

Whether it's through toning your body, mastering a new move, or just building up the courage to ask a new person to dance, dancing provides many avenues for boosting self confidence. Our mind just works better when we're in motion. I would never have believed in the power of movement as much as I do now if I hadn't experienced it first hand. Health counsellors suggest dancing for weird health issues. Dance helps in healing eating disorders, digestive problems, physical injuries, chronic tension, thyroid problems - it catalyzes change in the way we relate to ourselves and the world. We cannot truly move freely unless we break through the blocked and dysfunctional patterns that hold us back every day. Movement brings us back into a fully integrated place, and that's the most healing place we can be. Moving your body freely, every joint and muscle clears the energy blockage in our body caused by disbalancing of chakras. We have seven chakras in our body.

#### **\*ABOUT YOGA AND DANCE:\***

Letting loose in the dance takes the integration achieved in yoga a step further, because we're no longer being told how to move - the natural intelligence that lives in us is moving us. Dancing with people of our school, college, colony, or same age group, cousins, relatives or spouses can actually be quite a gateway for us to experience levels of interconnectedness and bliss we didn't know existed. It is our birthright to know ecstasy, serenity, wholeness, unbridled joy. Those feelings come naturally when we let go of our inhibitions, and allow the freedom that is our true nature to ride us beyond our beliefs about how good, beautiful, successful, or lovable we are. Getting there while sober takes a willingness to push your edge, to face how uncomfortable you are with yourself. And at the same time, a willingness to have your ideas turned upside down when you discover how amazing it feels to move freely, just as you are. There are also plenty of ways to get into the groove without waking up with a hangover. Rhythm and bass have a direct and potent effect on our brainwaves, bringing us into different kinds of fun trance states.

Our brain waves are entertained and synced with the drum beats in the song. In a dance class, it's an atmosphere where everyone is free to shed their inhibitions and have a blast, dance, chill, and connect with a vibrant community. Ballet dancers are known for their physical grace — the ability they have to move precisely and smoothly from one motion to the next. This poise does not only come because they practice constantly, though. A new study published in the Journal of Neurophysiology reported that professional ballet dancers' many years of training have enabled their nervous systems to coordinate their muscles to a better level than individuals without dance training. The nervous system consists of the brain, spinal cord, and a network of nerves throughout the body. It's what allows the body's different systems to coordinate and communicate with each other (ie: the brain controlling the movement of the leg muscles). The nervous system activates muscles in groups, rather than controlling each muscle individually. These muscle groups are referred to as "motor modules," and they in turn combine to achieve a wide range of motion.

In the new research, a team from Emory University and Georgia Institute of Technology looked at whether long-term dance training affects how motor modules are recruited when moving. They compared ballet dancers with at least 10 years of training to people with no dance or gymnastics training. Activity of muscles in the legs and torso was tracked as the study participants simply walked across the floor, across a wide beam, and across a challenging narrow beam. The two groups had similar gait patterns when walking the floor or first beam, but when it came to the narrow beam, ballet dancers showed better balance and walked farther. The dancers recruited more motor modules to do this, and did it much more consistently than untrained participants. The researchers reported that the ballet dancers utilized their muscles more efficiently and effectively than their untrained counterparts, supporting the idea that training can influence the control we have over everyday movements. The report suggested that years of training actually changed how the nervous system coordinated muscles for walking and balancing motions.

“There’s no question, anecdotally at least, that music has a very stimulating effect on physical activity,” says Daniel Tarsy, MD, an HMS professor of neurology and director of the Parkinson’s Disease and Movement Disorders Center at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center (BIDMC).

Scientists gave little thought to the neurological effects of dance until relatively recently, when researchers began to investigate the complex mental coordination that dance requires. In a 2008 article in *Scientific American* magazine, a Columbia University neuroscientist posited that synchronizing music and movement—dance, essentially—constitutes a “pleasure double play.” Music stimulates the brain’s reward centers, while dance activates its sensory and motor circuits.

2003 study in the *New England Journal of Medicine* by researchers at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine discovered that dance can decidedly improve brain health. The study investigated the effect leisure activities had on the risk of dementia in the elderly. The researchers looked at the effects of 11 different types of physical activity, including cycling, golf, swimming, and tennis, but found that only one of the activities studied—dance—lowered participants’ risk of dementia. According to the researchers, dancing involves both a mental effort and social interaction and that this type of stimulation helped reduce the risk of dementia.

In a small study undertaken in 2012, researchers at North Dakota’s Minot State University found that the Latin-style dance program known as Zumba improves mood and certain cognitive skills, such as visual recognition and decision-making. Other studies show that dance helps reduce stress, increases levels of the feel-good hormone serotonin, and helps develop new neural connections, especially in regions involved in executive function, long-term memory, and spatial recognition.

Parkinson’s disease belongs to a group of conditions called motor-system disorders, which develop when the dopamine-producing cells in the brain are lost. The chemical dopamine is an essential component of the brain’s system for controlling movement and coordination. As Parkinson’s disease progresses, an increasing number of these cells die off, drastically reducing the amount of dopamine available to the brain.

According to the foundation, the primary motor symptoms of Parkinson’s disease include bradykinesia (slowed movement), stiffness of the limbs and trunk, tremors, and impaired balance and coordination. It is these symptoms that dance may help alleviate. “A lot of this research is observational, not hard science,” says Tarsy, “but it’s consistent and there’s a lot of it.”

Tarsy says that dance can be considered a form of rhythmic auditory stimulation (RAS). In this technique, a series of fixed rhythms are presented to patients, and the patients are asked to move to the rhythms.

Tai chi is a Chinese martial art once used for self-defense but now performed as exercise. Wayne considers tai chi to be a more ritualized, structured form of dance. Tai chi is one such exercise that we focus on because of its benefits for both balance and mental function.

One such study appeared in 2012 in the *New England Journal of Medicine*. In this study, a team of investigators led by a scientist at the Oregon Research Institute found that tai chi helped improve balance and prevent falls among people with mild to moderate Parkinson’s disease. After six months, those who practiced tai chi twice weekly were physically stronger and had better balance compared with those who did either weight training or stretching. On average, the participants who did tai chi achieved balance measures that were two times better than those achieved by weightlifters and four times better than those participants who stretched. Those people who practiced tai chi also fell less and had slower rates of decline in overall motor control.

concert, those same strangers could find themselves dancing and singing together like best friends. That's the power of music. I always tell my kids if you lay down, people will step over you. But if you keep scrambling, if you keep going, someone will always, always give you a hand. Always. But you gotta keep dancing, you gotta keep your feet moving. Morgan Freeman I know, this isn't about dancing but to make you smile, Common sense and a sense of humor are the same thing, moving at different speeds. A sense of humor is just common sense, dancing. There's a field of study, psychology of dance which is the set of mental states associated with dancing and watching others dance. Dance magically dissolves the difference that divides us as we know what unites us is much more than what divides us! Dancers displayed stronger synchronisation at the low theta frequency. Theta synchronisation is linked to emotion and memory processes which are central to all interpersonal interaction and self-understanding.

Dancing is also associated with "flow", a well-researched phenomenon in which the person becomes fully immersed in an activity. Flow experiences have been found to increase the general contentment and productivity of the person as well as the quality of the activity. It reduces the activation of the neural network which is responsible for logical deduction and detailed observation.

This makes room for the creative neural network which also has an important role in generating a relaxed state of mind. Brain synchronisation enables seamless cooperation.

Practicing an instrument requires extreme precision. It has been found to shape motor processes in the brain in many ways. In addition to drug treatment and psychotherapy, exercise is currently even being recommended as a form of treatment for depression. Exercise releases hormones that create a sense of wellbeing, which in turn boosts positive emotional processes in the brain. It also lowers the activation of the amygdala, the brain's fear and stress centre. Finding the right dance style can make dancers euphoric, and make them forget the drudgery of official exercise recommendations and step counters.

About dancing with partners: contact improvisation makes the dancers to listen attentively to the body of their partner. Touch is known to reduce pain, fear and anxiety. In one study, a touch from a significant other reduced the intensity of the pain activation in the brain during an electric stimulus when compared with pain experienced alone. Dance being an artistic and athletic experience is loved by people of all age, religion, job and culture. There maybe variation in our dance forms and styles but the best thing is we all love dancing!

परन्तु मेरे विपक्षी वक्ता उनके ही निर्णय पर सवाल उठा न केवल पाप बल्कि घोर पाप कर रही है। अरे सर्वोच्च न्यायालय तो हमारे देश का ऐसा मंदिर है जो कि कसाब जैसे दरिंदे के लिए भी रात के तीन बजे अपने पट खोल देती है ताकि कोई उनसे नाइंसाफी न हो जाए कोई गलत निर्णय न हो जाए। परन्तु मेरे विपक्षी वक्ता उसी न्यायमूर्ति पर सवाल उठा रही है। हमारे देश के सर्वोच्च न्यायालय जो कि समय—समय पर लोगों के हितों के लिए कार्य करता रहा है। अगर हम बात करें 1964 को जब गोरखनाथ कांड हुआ, जिसमें हैनरी और गोरखनाथ दोनों भाई थे दोनों के पास 100 एकड़ जमीन थी व पंजाब सरकार ने उस वक्त विधेयक 30 लेकर आई जिसके तहत उनकी जमीन उनसे लेकर लोगों में दी जाती, परन्तु ये दोनों भाई सर्वोच्च न्यायालय के दर पर गए व अनुच्छेद 32 के तहत याचिका डाली, व उस वक्त हमारे सर्वोच्च न्यायालय ने पंजाब सरकार को कड़ी फटकार लगाते हुए बोला कि कोई भी संशोधन जो कि मौलिक अधिकारों का उल्लंघन करता हो वो मान्य नहीं होगा। सर्वोच्च न्यायालय ने धारा 13 का हवाला देते हुए अपनी बात कही। सरकारें तो समय—समय पर अपनी राजनीतिक हितों को देखते इस तरीकों का संशोधन लाती रही है। परन्तु वो तो धन्य हो हमारे सर्वोच्च न्यायालय का जिसने हमारी संविधान पर आज तक आंच नहीं आने दी, व लोगों के मौलिक अधिकारों का रक्षा करती रही है।

सरकारें यहाँ तक नहीं रुकी केसवनंद सन् 1973 उस समय सरकार संशोधन 24 लेकर आई जिसके तहत कोई भी धार्मिक संस्थान कि संपत्ति सरकार के अंतर्गत होगी। परन्तु उस समय भला हो सर्वोच्च न्यायालय का और धन्य हो नानाभाई जैसे वकीलो का जिन्होंने सर्वोच्च न्यायालय में अपनी न्याय की याचिका डाली व उन्हें वहाँ इंसफ मिला व इनकी लड़ाई कुल 68 दिन 13 जजों के साथ चली, उस समय भी कोर्ट ने अपनी टिप्पणी में साफ—साफ कहा कि आप संविधान के बुनियादी ढांचे से छेड़छाड़ नहीं कर सकते।

सर्वोच्च न्यायालय ने समय—समय पर लोगों के हितों की रक्षा की है चाहे वा सबरीमाला केस हो जिसमें सालों से महिलाओं का जाना पाबंद था उस मंदिर का दरवाला महिलाओं के लिए खुलवाने का अगर किसी ने कार्य किया है, तो वो सर्वोच्च न्यायालय है। पर्यावरण व अन्य संवेदनशील मुद्दे जिससे हमारी सरकारें असंवेदनशील रही है उन मुद्दे पर किसी ने न्याय व ख्याल रखा है तो वो सर्वोच्च न्यायालय है।

अंत में मैं यहीं कहना चाहूंगा कि सर्वोच्च न्यायालय जो कि हमारे देश के कानून के लिए अभिभावक हैं व अभिभावक के निर्णय को पलट कर हम कल्पना कर सकते हैं कि हम अपने देश को किस ओर ले जा रहे हैं।

ये घटनाएं व तथ्य स्वयं चीख-चीखकर कह रहे हैं कि 100: स्मार्ट फोन युवा वर्ग को भ्रमित कर रहा है। जरा दृष्टि डालिए उस खूनी ब्लू-व्हेल गेम पर जिसके कारण 260 मासूमों की जीवन लीला समाप्त हो गई। वर्तमान में मोमों गेम युवाओं की जान का दुश्मन बना बैठा है जिसके कारण 28 बच्चों की जान चली गई। स्मार्ट फोन में कानों में लीड लगाकर गाने सुनने, गेम खेलने व सेल्फी लेने के कारण कितने बच्चे रेलवे ट्रैक पर कट जाते हैं। कितनों के बस, कार आदि से एक्सीडेंट हो जाते हैं। स्मार्ट फोन में पोकेमान गेम में पोकेमान को ढूँढने के चक्कर में कितने बच्चे दिशा भटककर अनेक दुर्घटनाओं के शिकार हो जाते हैं।

तो कहा जा सकता है कि स्मार्ट फोन पूरी तरह से युवाओं की जान का दुश्मन बन रहा है। इसके आकर्षक चक्रव्यूह में फंसकर युवा स्वयं का जीवन बर्बाद कर रहा है। फोने बच्चों के नैतिक मूल्यों व आदर्शों का भी पतन कर रहा है। पहले बच्चे सुबह उठकर अपने माता-पिता को प्रणाम कर उनसे आर्शीवाद लेते थे लेकिन अब वह सबसे पहले अपने फोन रूपी देवता को संभालते हैं जिससे रिश्तों की मिठास कम होती जा रही है।। जन्मदिन व त्योहारों की शुभकामनायें Whatsapp द्वारा देकर केवल औपचारिकता पूरी की जाती है।

जब माता-पिता हर समय बच्चों को फोन में लगा देखते हैं तो उनका खून ही जल जाता है। मना करने पर घर में कलेश का तूफान आ जाता है। आज का युवा माता-पिता के साथ बैठकर बातें करने की बजाय या पढ़ने की बजाय अपने Whatsapp Chat या फेसबुक को ज्यादा महत्व देता है जिसके कारण वह अपने पढ़ाई के मार्ग से भटककर फेल होने की कगार पर पहुँचकर अपने भविष्य को बर्बाद कर रहे हैं। आज बच्चों की चरित्रहीनता व उनके बढ़ते प्रेम प्रसंगों की जड़ ये स्मार्ट फोन ही है जिसके कारण आज युवाओं की नजरों में बड़ों का आदर सम्मान कम होता जा रहा है।

ये स्मार्ट फोन युवाओं को अनेक बीमारियों का शिकार भी बना रहा है। फोन पर ज्यादा गाने सुनने, वीडियो देखने वाले बच्चे देर से बोलना शुरू करते हैं। बच्चों की एकाग्रता कम होती है, आँखें सूखी हो जाती हैं, आँखों की रोशनी कम हो जाती है, सीखने की ललक घटती है, मैदानी खेल समाप्त हो रहे हैं, वे मोटापे का शिकार होते जा रहे हैं, सुनने की क्षमता कम होती है, वे कैंसर जैसी भयानक बीमारियों का शिकार होते जा रहे हैं, वे हिंसक व चिड़चिड़ हो रहे

है। इससे सिद्ध होता है कि स्मार्ट फोन युवाओं को बीमार बनाकर अवनति के गर्त में धकेल रहा है।

अति हर चीज की बुरी होती है। स्मार्ट फोन के कारण युवाओं की मानवीय भावनाएँ समाप्त होती जा रही हैं। वे घायलों की मदद करने की बजाए उनकी विडियों बनाने में ज्यादा रुचि लेते हैं। साइबर क्राइम में लिप्त होकर बड़े-बड़े अपराधों में शामिल होकर अपना व अपने परिवार का सम्मान समाप्त करता जा रहा है। समाज व युवाओं के पतन का कारण यह स्मार्ट फोन ही है। अश्लील व भद्दी जानकारी प्राप्त करते हैं।
