National Conference on 'Digital Enterprenuership'

January 29-30, 2021

Maharaja Surajmal Institute organised two days National Conference (Sponsored by GGSIPU) on '**Digital Entrepreneurship'** from January 29 to January 30, 2021.

Day 1

On January 29, 2021 the Conference began with the formal welcoming of the faculty and students of MSI by **Dr. Preeti Malik.** The function started with the prayer of goddess Saraswati. **Prof. (Dr) Harish Singh, Deputy Director, MSI**, gave the welcome address and briefed about the theme of the conference, 'Digital Entrepreneurship'.

He described about new patents and copyrights and also about new upcoming universities shall come under university industry 4.0 which works on the parameter set by industrial revolution 4.0.

Day 5



It also has functions for working in domain of linear algebra, fourier transform, and matrices. NumPy was created in 2005 by Travis Oliphant. She mentioned that Pandas is one of the most widely used python libraries in data science. It provides high-performance, easy to use structures and data analysis tools. Unlike NumPy library which provides objects for multi-dimensional arrays, Pandas provides in-memory 2d table object called Dataframe. She demonstrated some hands-on sessions based on both libraries and also conducted a quiz on Kahoot. Her session was appreciated by all.

In keeping with the webinar series hosted by MSI, a one-hour webinar on the topic 'Managing Self and Learning during Covid-19 Pandemic' was organized on the evening of 8th of October, 2020, with chief guest as honourable **Dr. Kiran Bedi** madam, Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry, India.

Dr. Kiran Bedi is the First woman in India to have joined the officer ranks of the Indian Police Service in 1972. For her, policing has stood for 'Power to Correct', 'Power to Prevent' and 'Power to get things done'. She has been the recipient of The Ramon Magsaysay Award, also called Asia's Nobel Peace Award, for bringing about a positive relationship between the police and the people. Dr. Bedi is a Law graduate, Masters, and a Ph.D. scholar with post-doctoral Nehru Fellowship. She is an author of several books such as "I Dare", "It's Always Possible", "Creating Leadership" and many others. She was also the First woman to be appointed as Police Advisor to Secretary-General in the United Nations, in the Department of Peace Keeping Operations in New York. Dr. Bedi has been voted as the Most admired and trusted woman in India by Readers Digest, The Week Magazine, and others over the years. In 2011, she was in the vanguard of a Nationwide, India Against Corruption Movement. In 2016, Dr. Kiran

Bedi was appointed as the 30th Lt. Governor of Puducherry. Breaking the myth that governors are a rubber stamp, her vision for a Prosperous Puducherry made open the closed gates of RajNivas for the people, paving way for trust, transparency & accessibility in governance. She has ensured the Institutionalisation of all the good practices as an administrator for posterity, which is available on her YouTube channel.

The webinar was hosted as a live event on Microsoft Teams platform. It began with a video showcasing highlights from Dr. Kiran Bedi ji's life, followed by a welcome address by honourable Shri Kaptan Singh ji, President, Surajmal Memorial Education Society, where he talked about the foundation and achievements of SMES and welcomed the chief guest Dr. Kiran Bedi madam and all the attendees.





1) QUIZATHON

19th-20th August, 2020

The CSI Student Branch of Maharaja Surajmal Institute in association with CSI Delhi Chapter on the occasion of its Golden Jubilee Foundation Day organized "Quizathon", an e-quiz competition on 19th-20th August, 2020 in order to provide students an opportunity to test their knowledge about Computer Science and its various sectors. The event was organized in multiple rounds and students from various institutes of India participated in the event. Students were from institutions like ABESIT College of Engineering, Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication Technologies and Research (AIACTR), Anna University (AU), Army Institute of Technology (AIT), Banaras Hindu University (BHU), Birla Institute of Technology (BIT), Mesra, Birla Institute of Technology & Science (BITS), Pilani, Chandigarh University (CU), Delhi School of Economics (DSE), Gauhati University (GU), Gautam Buddha University (GBU), Government Engineering College (GEC), Bhuj, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU), Hindu College, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT), Indian Institute of Management (IIM), Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Delhi, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Kharagpur, Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), Institute of Information Technology & Management (IITM), Indraprastha Institute of Information Technology (IIIT), Jadavpur University (JU), Madras Christian College, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology (MAIT), Maharaja Surajmal Institute of Technology (MSIT), National Institute of Technology (NIT), Warangal, Netaji Subhas University of Technology (NSUT), Osmania University (OU), Hyderabad, Punjab Engineering College (PEC), Rabindranath Tagore University, SRM Institute of Science and Technology, Tamil Nadu, University of Delhi (DU), Vellore Institute of Technology (VIT), Xavier School of Management (XLRI), Jamshedpur etc. The platform used for registration and to conduct the quiz was Dare2Compete (Round 1 & 2) and Google Meet (Round 3). Quizathon received tremendous response from all over India (More than 50,000 Views on Dare2Compete Platform), Quizathon was sponsored by CSI Delhi Chapter.

Round 1: Preliminary Round: 1st round of the Quizathon was conducted on 19thAugust, 2020 starting at 12.00 PM on the Dare2Compete Platform. Participants were given 60 minutes time to answer 90 MCQ questions. Total 160 students participated in this round to test their knowledge of the Computer Science domain. The questions were from different areas of Computer Science like Programming, Operating System, Database Management, Computer Networks etc with easy, moderate and hard level. Top 30 participants qualified for the 2nd Round.


After the Finale Round, we got the winners as follows:


2) Workshop on Face Detection & Recognition


1) Alumni Meet-Department of Computer Application



13th December,2020



Rawat and his team also talked about the rising levels of anger and frustration in young adults and how one may tackle situations that test their patience.


The team of young hosts further held a Q and A session on each day to take questions and queries from the listeners, viewers and participants and generate a greater connects with everyone.

This activity was organised by Surbhi Tomar. This activity was a part of our observation skills- as we remember words or things if we observe them carefully. There were two parts in this activity.


Part 1 – spot the difference. In this activity each picture was shown just for 2 minutes and the participants were asked to find as many as difference possible.

9) Art in Education- Puppet Making

22nd January 2021

The first workshop of P-157 Drama and Art in Education was conducted by Dr. Rajesh Gill, i. e. me, on 22nd January 2021 between 12.40 PM- 2.50 PM. The first year students of both Section A and Section B participated. The aim of this workshop was to introduce puppetry as an aid to education and to prepare educational scripts and programmes based on the curriculum by using puppetry. The session was opened with an introduction to the art of puppetry, it's origins, different types of puppets, uses of puppets in the field of education, etc. Firstly, the students were taught to make a sock puppet. They were asked to bring a sock, two small plastic balls, some wool, coloured sheets of paper, a pair of scissors, fevi-quick to make the puppet in the workshop itself. I demonstrated the steps online to make a sock puppet one by one and the students made their own puppets along with my demonstration. It was a fun-filled activity. Later on, I also went on to demonstrate the method to make a paper puppet which the students were asked to make at home as an activity. I concluded the workshop by showing the students how to use these puppets as a reference for the students in their future teaching endeavours and also taught them the methods for integrating it into their school curriculum. I also went around to review the puppets made by all the student-teachers and appreciated their efforts.

10) Drama And Art in Education

29th January 2021

The second workshop in of P-157, Drama and art in Education were conducted by Dr. Rajesh Gill, i. e. me, on 29th January 2021 for two hours in the afternoon between 12.40-2.50. 50 students each from Section A and Section B participated in this workshop. The opening of the workshop were marked with a coordination activity where the participants were assigned with a task according to a number allotted to each one of them, like 1-jump, 2-sit, 3-lie down, 4- dance. The teacher would call out random numbers and the students had to perform them one by one. This activity was aimed at building coordination between the mind and the body. The second activity was Meditation. I asked the students to close their eyes and imagine a scenario where they visualise spending time with they childhood friend and doing various things like climbing a mountain, walking in a park amidst trees and flowers, etc. The prime focus of this activity was to increase concentration and enhance imagination of the students. They were then introduced into a brief history of theatre and the importance of drama and theatre in education, TIE, or Theatre in Education, is the name given to a particular kind of theatre, practised by professional drama companies, or TIE teams, which work specifically in educational projects to be devised at schools. DIE, or Drama in Education, is the term applied to the practise and use of drama in the classroom, as both subject and method. It can be introduced to deliver any aspect of the curriculum, often to explore cross curricular aspects; in contrast to TIE, it relies upon the work of teachers, not actors. The remaining sessions were marked with two activities. The first one being a Memory game. Students from roll numbers 1-21 were involved in a game of memory. One student will say a proper / common noun and the others were to add a new noun after the previous one. In this way a chain of nouns were to remembered and said in order. Many students either forgot the previous nouns or rendered the nouns which they were able to remember. The purpose was to make students increase their memory retention, vocabulary, to make them alert and vigil, improve concentration and enhance imagination. The last activity was called Story making. Students from roll numbers 22-40 participated in this activity. The teacher will create a premise/location were the story would take place and the students will create a sentence one by one culminating with a moral of the story. This activity helps the participants to increase their imagination power, concentration, develop empathy, confidence in public speaking. The overall experience was very educational and fulfilling. These activities can be carried out in thethel future to make learning innovative and enjoyable.

11) Workshop on Mental Health Talk

17th February 2021

Workshop was organized for BBA (G)& B&I (IInd Shift) on (17th February 2021). Mental health issues can be caused due to many reasons, such as an unhealthy diet, lack of

physical exercise, loneliness, strained family relations, pressures from schools and workplace, and much recently, the on-going pandemic. However, in the past few years, these issues have been on a rise.

Thus, in order to reach out to the students and show the Institute's continued support, an interactive and sensitizing session on the topic of "Mental Health Talk" was organized. This session was held at Maharaja Surajmal Institute and was attended by fresher's pursuing BBA. While giving presentations, the importance of a timeline was also explained to the students.








- Autonomy


Positive relationship with others

The session turned out to be highly engaging and relevant for students.




8) Mental Health Talk, B.Com Dept


The session started with a welcome note by the student organizers Pearl and Tanvi followed by the talk by Prof. J.P. Singh who about the problems and experiences of day-to-day life and his professional journey while highlighting the importance of values in a person's life.

He discussed the three most important aspects of human life — food, clothing and shelter and how we end up judging people based on these aspects. Sir, while giving motivating examples, explained about the difference between what is right and what is wrong and how one can differentiate between the two. Prof. J.P. Singh very efficiently explained to the students about the meaning of morals and values. Sir very rightly stated that the things which make one feel wrong are the same things which will also make others feel bad as well. 
highlighted the role of women in society and how the women are playing an important role in inculcating morals and ethics in the present and future generation.


15) WEBINAR ON STOCK MARKETS

Ever since the country was plunged into nation-wide lockdown due to the impact of Covid-19 virus, stress levels have been undoubtedly high in almost all citizens. To combat stress in students, an online webinar on Stress Management was organized by Maharaja Surajmal Institute for its BCA students. The webinar was held on 4th June, 2021 and commenced from 10a.m. on an online platform. We were joined by a distinguished guest, Dr. Lovleen Malhotra ma'am, who was the eminent speaker of the session.

The session started out with an introduction and a welcome speech given to our guest, by student Jasmehr Kaur Bhatia. Then Ms. Lovleen kickstarted the session by asking what sort of psychological issues or mental health problems, like anxiety or stress, were the students facing. To this they promptly replied, that they were facing obstacles such as long hours of online classes throughout the week, procrastination, being cooped up under the same roof due to lockdown, and suffering the loss of a close one due to Covid. She had a very optimistic approach while answering all the students' queries and emphasized on moving on from the past and prioritizing the present, living it to the fullest. She discussed how having an irregular sleep cycle can take a heavy toll on one's physical as well as mental health. Bringing the sleep cycle back on track, and getting a good eight hours of sleep each night can prove to be instrumental in a good recovery, and help clear the head. She also commented on unhealthy eating habits of today's generation and how deeply they can affect us. She pointed out some common practices like skipping meals, binge eating, having midnight meals, not consuming enough fruits and vegetables as key problems in most people's lifestyle. She proceeded to warn us about the negative effects of social media, and how scrolling mindlessly through your feeds all day can cause loss of concentration and aids procrastination. She encouraged students to focus more on their real lives, have an exercise regime, play outdoors once it is safe to do so, etc. instead of spending more time on your mobile phone than necessary. Playing games, especially with friends, could prove to be a real stressbuster too, she said, as long as there are fair restrictions on the time limit. Overthinking, a common practice among individuals is more inclined to be personality trait than a side-effect of stress, according to

ma'am. It can be avoided by incorporating mind-clearing habits in one's life, such as meditating, getting a fresh breath of air in a park or even a terrace, listening to good music and having a fun hobby to distract yourself with. These tips also help expel negative thoughts from the mind and inculcating these good habits promote positive thinking. Apart from students, teachers were also eagerly participating in the online seminar and enquiring about how they can help with students' well-being and mental health. She ended the session by stressing on the importance of loving yourself and keeping an optimistic mindset in the long run.

After concluding the session, Ms. Lovleen Malhotra was offered a vote of thanks from one of the students, Akshat Jain, on behalf of the whole institute. All the attendees greatly benefitted from the seminar and expressed their gratitude to the speaker. The session ended on a positive note and the main takeaway was to live in the present and not dwell on the past.

18) Special Talk on "The Regulatory Framework of School Management"

June 11,2021

A talk regarding "The Regulatory Framework of School Management" was conducted for the students of B.Ed program of MAHARAJA SURAJMAL INSTITUTE on 11 June 2021. The speaker for the talk was Prof. Chandra Bhushan Sharma. He served as the Chairman of the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) from April 2015 to April 2020. During his leadership the NIOS experienced a complete turnaround, with many landmark new initiatives. He is the recipient of the President's Award for "Commendable Contribution to Digital Initiatives" during the National Convention on Digital Initiatives for Higher Education. Recognizing his talent and contributions, the Government of India had assigned the responsibility of training more than twelve lakh untrained in-service teachers to the NIOS through the Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed.) Programmed and the same was completed in a record time of 18 months.

The talk was organized by Dr. Poonam Beniwal and Dr. VanitaAnand.98 students of B.Ed program first year and second year attended the session.

The session started with a welcome note by the student organizers Pearl and Tanvi followed by the talk by Prof. Chandra Bhushan Sharma.

He started the talk by the importance of teachers in a student's life. He laid emphasis on teacher's autonomy and how much freedom does a teacher has in framing the curriculum and how it is executed. Sir gave various examples of the present day times to support his statement. He questioned whether the CBSE exams being cancelled and the solutions each state is coming up with are in students favor or not. He gave an example of the schools in Chhattisgarh and how the government is handling the situation and the problems that are arising due to it. He questioned everyone, why these problems do not occur in Chhattisgarh universities. He answered his own question by emphasizing the difference between a statutory and non statutory body. He explained that all the universities come under the UGC which are made by acts of parliament which makes it a statutory

Body, whereas the CBSE and schools are not statutory bodies. He elaborated further that Ministers chair the school sectors. He questioned why ministers chair such bodies because a minister's agenda would be political and not educational. He questioned if it was in the favor of the country or not.

He suggested some solutions for the same. He suggested that if the country's education system has to flourish, there has to be a "School Education Commission" parallel to the UGC which should be a statutory body. The chairman for the same should be elected in the same way as the chairman of the Election Commission and should be given the same importance. He briefly explained the importance of the Radha Krishnan, Kothari Commission and the National Education Policy 2020 which was followed by a Doubt and Question session. Enlightened by the talk the students asked various questions like how we as students can help in the process, how the management of the school would be taken care of etc.

Prof. Sharma, while concluding the talk, said that school teachers and principals must have a say in the policies and curriculum because they know and understand the students better than anyone else. He reminded the students that our role as future teachers is very important because we as teachers are the initial guides of our students who will become our own reflection in future.

The session was concluded by Shashi with a vote of thanks to the speaker.

19) Development of Research Aptitude among Commerce Students June 15, 2021

The Department of Commerce, Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized an online lecture under the skill development series. On 15th June,2021, the Department of Commerce organized a session on the "Development of Research Aptitude among Commerce Students". The session was taken up by Annviti Rawat and in the session students were given problem solving and research aptitude questions. Also students were guided on the various quantitative data analysis softwares like SPSS. More than 100 students practiced the usage of shortcuts of SPPS commands and understood the importance of research skills for their student and professional life.


EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES






The program was joined by all the students and was a success, owing to the efforts of the organizing team, all HoDs and faculty members.

December 15,2020






14) Celebrating National youth day


The winners of the events Painting and Sketching were Mansi Rawat and Muskan Bakshi respectively.

On December 28, 2020; Department of Computer Applications organized a National level competition based on core concepts of C++ programming language.


The aim of the event was to help the participants to judge their programming skills for interviews and different competitions.








Maharaja Surajmal Institute is honoured with "Best Educational Institute Award 2020" for the best practices in imparting world class quality education at tertiary level.

MSI Internal Hackathon was organized by Faculty Co-ordinators Ms Rhythm Choudhary, Assistant Professor, BCA and Mr. Manoj Kumar, HOD BCA[M] department along with Student Co-ordinators of BCA 3rd Year. Total 9 Teams were participated in SIH round out of which two teams were able to make entry in Grand Finale and the Codifire Team finally with the winning tag in Grand finale.

On 01/08/2020, the world witnessed the biggest virtual Hackathon ever. Out of the 8,50,000 registrations for the hackathon, only a handful made it to the final round. Not even this current situation of a global pandemic could stop it from being a grand success. The Smart India Hackathon was scheduled in the month of April 2020. But it got postponed due to the Coronavirus Pandemic and got rescheduled to the month of August. The grand Hackathon was a four days mega event, out of which three days were assigned for coding, evaluating, and working on the ideas and the last day was reserved for the announcement of results. The Smart India Hackathon commenced by inauguration at the Institute and National level. All the participants joined the inauguration through YouTube and were addressed by some prominent personalities in the field of IT, live. The inauguration marked the beginning of the Hackathon and was followed by our team meetings, interactions, exchange of ideas on how to add more features to our solution, and actual coding. Each day in the Hackathon was scheduled to contain a mentoring and an evaluation session with the mentors that were assigned by our nodal center, SVCE Bangalore.

The best part of the Hackathon was the constant motivation and support we got from the organizing authorities and Ministry of Human Resource Development. Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi addressed the participants wherein various ideas and solutions were discussed. The whole address was quite engaging and encouraging.

Mr. Amit Bansal and Mr. V S Sreejeet (BCA [M] Batch2016-19) appointed as Mentors for the team Codifire by the SPOC Ms Rhythm Choudhary. The coding window was followed by a mentoring session in which the mentors interacted with our team members and suggested features and improvements in the solution our team presented. Right after the mentoring session, team have all day to communicate and code. On average we would have 2-3 meetings and 25-30 GitHub pushes. Each day, in the evening, we had evaluation sessions where we were marked on the basis of the progress and approach. The most notable part of the Hackathon was to constantly make us think and improve. In the entire course of this hackathon journey, our team discovered and discussed hundreds of ideas with the help of the mentors who have been very supportive and have helped us through various hurdles we came across. Some were discarded and some were successfully implemented. The learning never stopped. Through constant hard work and hours of coding, team finished the hackathon on a winning note entitling us for 1 Lakh Prize Money and a Certificate of Appreciation for the problem statement MK204 proposed by the Ministry of Rural Development.
