A discussion on guilt and grief also took place and students shared their own experiences.


It was a fruitful discussion for one and all.

Director MSI, Prof. (Dr.) Harish Singh delivered welcome address for the eminent guests and participants of the event. Sir further stated that it is the constant support and guidance of Shri. Kaptan Singh ji, President, Surajmal Memorial Education Society and other executive members in the management for organization of faculty development session like these. The dignitaries who graced the dias through their presence during inaugural session were: Shri. Karnal Singh ji, Retd. Sh.Karnal singh shared his valuable insight on "Indian culture, Spirituality and pragmatic knowledge for excellence In Education and research". Sir emphasized on the need of promoting excellence by re-focusing on Indian indigenous knowledge and bringing consistency and discipline in one's life. He focused on the dire need to imbibe humanistic qualities in the learners through the teachers by being true role models. Sir also reiterated that one should not fall into the trap of cut paste culture in research. Quality comes with experience. Sharing a recent development by Karnataka state where they have included a chapter on Rishi Baudhayana-the original mathematician behind Pythagorus Theorem, the speaker said that research is already there in our scriptures that we should read and reflect on. Further, **Dr. Tejbir Singh Rana** as guest of honour expressed his views and concerns on "Quality in Research". Sir highlighted the major concerns in higher education and expressed his deep concern with respect to deteriorating quality of research. He said that the entire focus must be on value addition and quality education at higher level so that academic calibre can be rejuvenated. Sir further referred that for high global ranking of Universities in the world one of the important aspect is social outreach activities.
