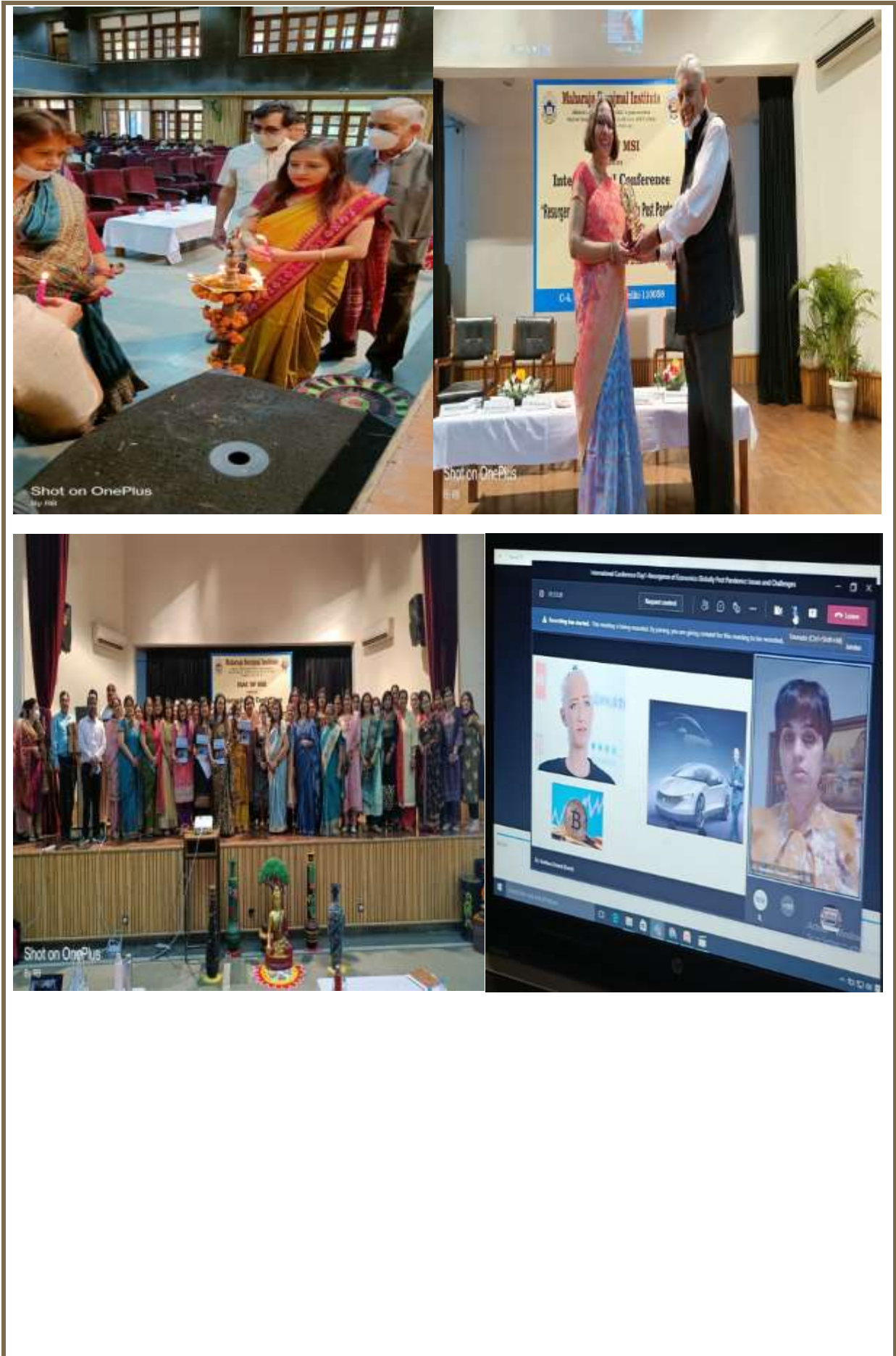

Maharaja Surajmal Institute (Affiliated to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi) organized **ONE-WEEK FDP ON NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020: ROADMAP TO DEVELOP FACULTY FOR 21<sup>st</sup> CENTURY** from 27<sup>th</sup> December 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> December

2021. The aim of the FDP was to provide a common platform to academicians, thought leaders, policymakers, corporate personnel, research scholars, practitioners, social activists to explore the fundamental roles and practical impacts of learning which includes a multilingual approach to teaching, a multidisciplinary way of thinking, promoting holistic development, a polished perspective on examinations and promoting technological literacy.

New Education Policy 2020 (NEP-2020) is promulgated by the Government of India in July 2020 to replace the National Policy on Education-1986, is an inclusive framework focusing on the elementary-level of education to higher education in the country. As the objective of any education system is to benefit children so that no child loses any opportunity to learn and excel because of circumstances of birth or background, NEP-2020 has a target of 100% Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER), in school education by 2030.

The Policy reaffirms that bridging social gaps in access, participation, and learning outcomes in school education will continue to be one of the major goals of all education sector development programmes.

In one week long deliberation on NEP 2020 wherein eminent speakers shared their views with respect to the implementation of the policy, there were many takeaways. It was highlighted throughout that the main aim of this implementation is to set a new framework and shape the education system and the student's education, aspirations and quality of life. This is a student centric effort to not just provide education but to develop them for the society and organization at the same time. National Education Policy 2020 envisions an India-centric education system that contributes directly to transforming our nation sustainably into an equitable and vibrant knowledge society by providing

high-quality education to all.

Eminent Speakers from the Industry **Ms. Shailaja Gupta** - Analytics Manager at Strides Pharma Science Ltd and **Ms. Sana Devan**- Assistant Manager-Startup India, Invest India shared their valuable knowledge and enlightened us with industry relevant insights for developing a Startup. The CSI team organized this power seminar on the online platform Microsoft Teams. Mver than 130 participants attended the seminar including students of BTech, BCA, MCA, MSc, BSc, BA (Hons.), many other streams, faculty, and many others from various colleges of region one and other CSI Regions.

Entrepreneurship and innovation are the engines of economic growth and the societal progress. In spite of the considerable advances in the rise and growth of start-ups, the number of start-ups that we have in India is not so encouraging which leads the need for a sustainable ecosystem. The 2017 Global Start-up Ecosystem Report indicates that several Indian startups struggle for survival and thus a renewed focus on the recent advances and the forces that underpin the start-up ecosystem in India assumes significance.

**2. Special lecture on WE ALL CAN BE MENTALLY HEALTHY August 31,2021**

A counseling lecture on “WE ALL CAN BE MENTALLY HEALTHY” was conducted for the students of B.Ed program of MAHARAJA SURAJMAL INSTITUTE on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2021. The speaker for the talk was Dr. Vanita Anand, Counselor, Maharaja Surajmal Institute.

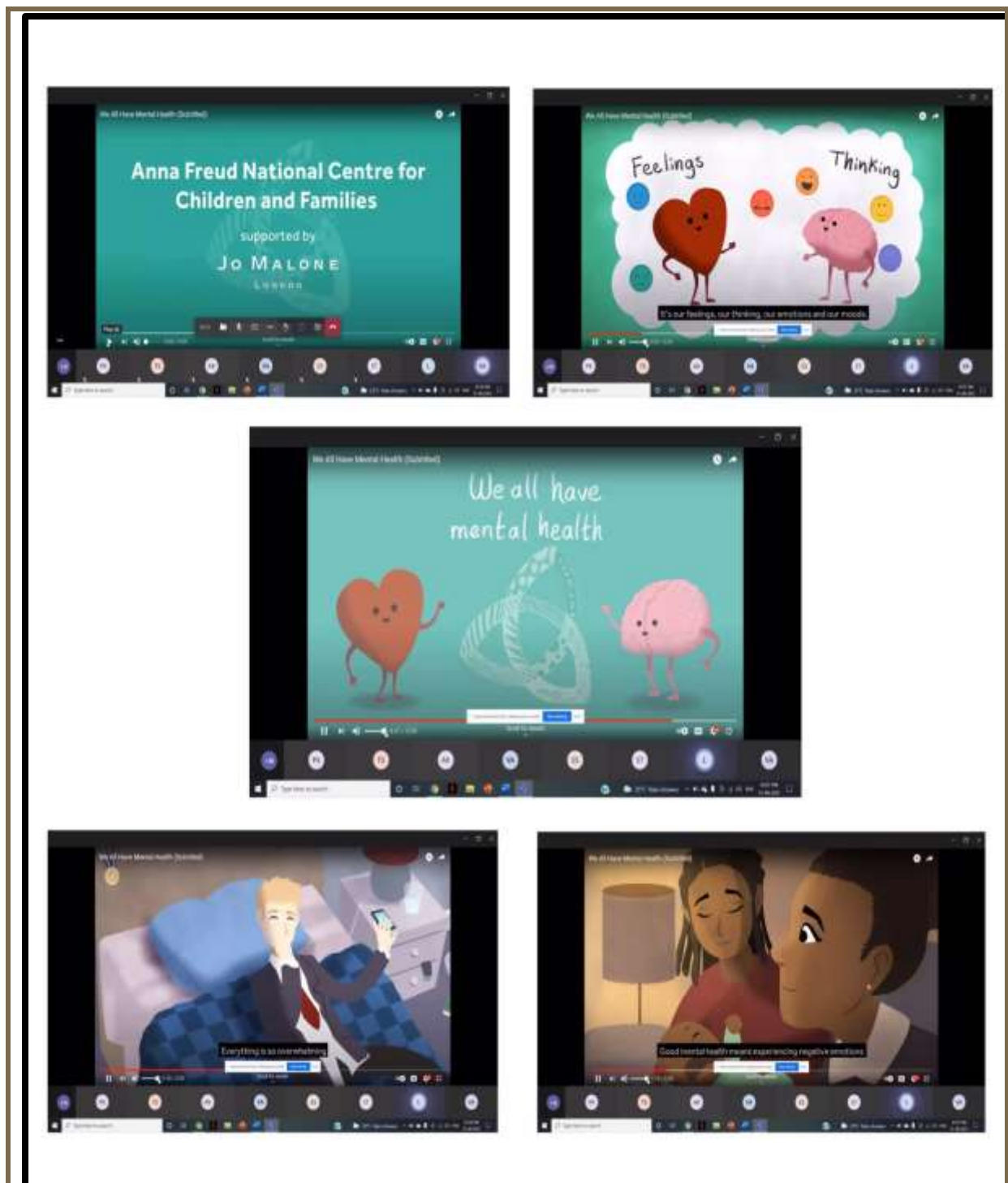
56 students of B.Ed program attended the session.

The session started with a video on “We All Have Mental Health”. The video was an animation designed to give young people a common language and understanding of what we mean by mental health and how we can look after it.

Dr. Vanita started the talk by stating that every person has a different level of issues pertaining to their mental health and it requires different level of treatment. We need to talk to understand that there is a shoulder to cry and an ear to hear your issues. She discussed about why it is important to share your problems with your parents and your peers rather than keeping all of it within. She advised that we should always try to speak to the ones who are close to us without the fear of being judged. Not only that we can also discuss our issues with anonymous people on social media platforms without having the fear of being judged as we are not aware as to whom we are discussing those issues with. She also advised that one should look for the happiness rather than waiting for the happiness to come to us. Dr. Vanita also asked the students to share their solutions which they implement to get over the mental stress. She advised the students to regularly do exercises especially cervical exercises to distract ourselves from the negative situation and move the energy to positive direction and increase oxygen flow to brain. Dr. Vanita asked the students about what they do to maintain their mental hygiene and enthusiastic responses were received from the student’s end. Dr. Vanita also advised students to meditate and inculcate atleast one hobby to calm our brain for a stress free life. The importance of sleep for proper mental health was also highlighted during the talk. Dr. Vanita even gave suggestions regarding the timely planning of the tasks and prioritizing the same to remain stress free.

Students shared their view points about mental health, hobby and stress. Dr. Vanita calmly listened to students’ points and tried to resolve them by suggesting suitable measures. The speaker discussed about ‘Catharsis’ and how it helps in leading out our emotions to make us feel relieved from underline stress and fear which is affecting our mental health.

Lastly she told the students to be expressive and show gratitude.



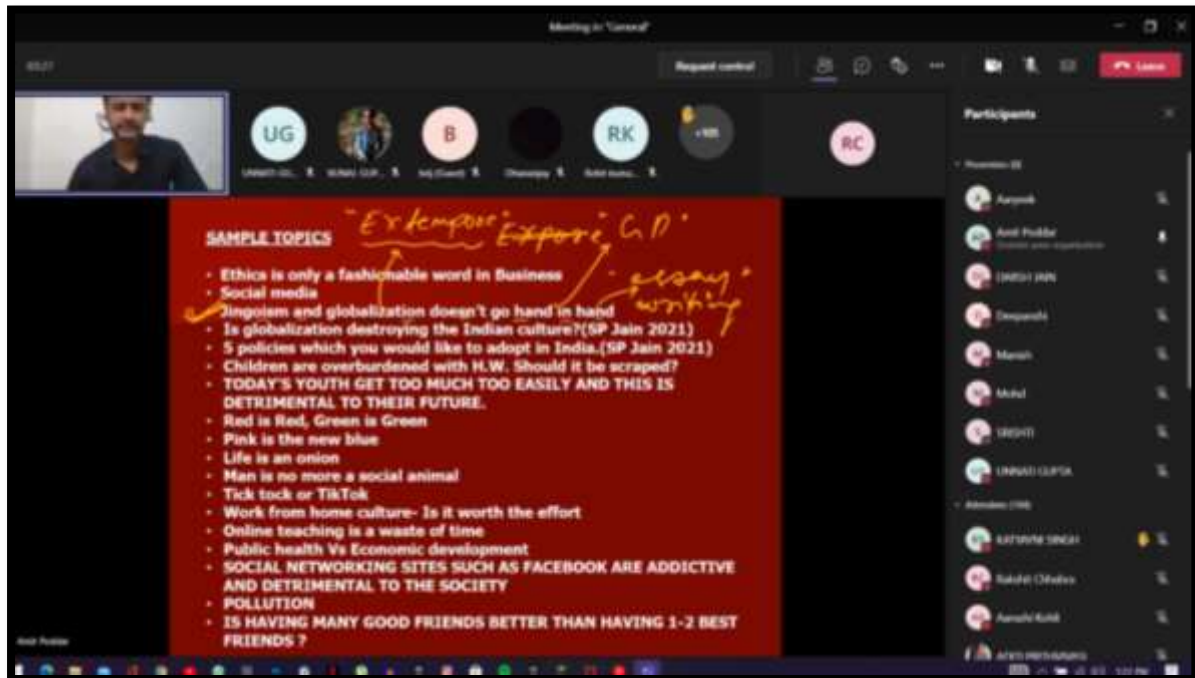
### 3. Webinar: How to do well in a GD

October 1,2021

Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized a webinar on Friday, October 1st, 2021; on the topic: How to do well in Group Discussion. The guest speaker was Mr. Amit Poddar, Senior Regional Head in T.I.M.E. Education, the webinar was conducted on Microsoft Teams and it went on from 01:00 pm to 02:30 pm. Nearly 90 students joined this webinar.

The webinar started with a basic description of a GD which was followed by a discussion on sample topics. The speaker told that one can get topics out of three categories, which could be:

1. Knowledge-based
2. Abstract based
3. Case study/situation based, he then gave certain examples of these three categories, and then he also gave tips to the students on how to prepare for such topics.



Then the speaker told the students about the significance of Group discussion and how is it different from public speaking, elocution, extempore, and debate. He told that in a GD, one may have points for both, for, and against the topic, which is completely fine, one may express all these points in sequence, on the contrary, one needs to stick to one side only in a debate.

Then he gave a technical definition of a GD which is as follows:

“A group discussion is a forum where people sit together, discuss a topic with the common objective of finding a solution for a problem or discussing an issue given to them.”

The next topic was about the basics such as the group size, seating arrangement, time allotted, what is the role of a moderator, how to start and end a discussion, how to address the group members, etc. The last topic before conducted the mock GD was the parameters of performance which are content, group behavior, leadership, and communication.

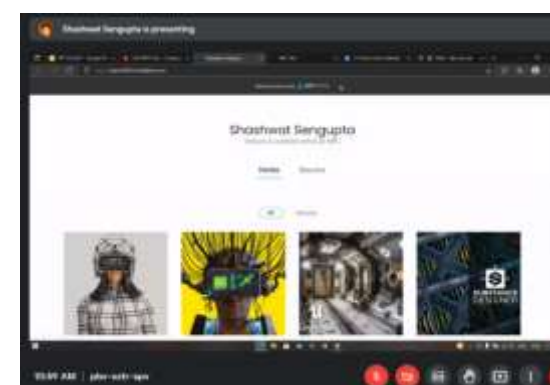
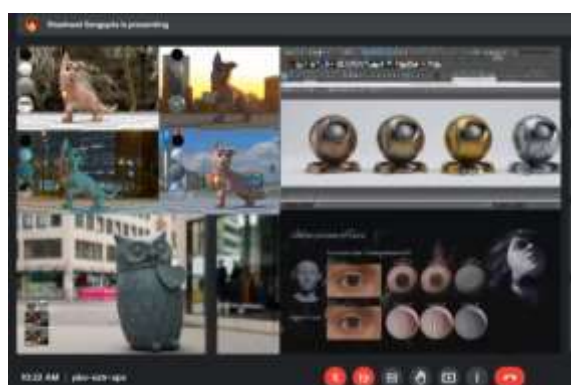
The last part of the webinar was a mock GD on the topic: Should the public or the politicians be blamed for the current state of India, the speaker was the moderator, 8 students participated, they were given 1 minute to gather their points. Then they one by one presented their points which ranged from the pandemic, stock exchange to even GST and demonetization. It went on for 10-15 minutes. After the conclusion, the speaker gave individual feedback to each participant.

Throughout the session, students asked their queries from the speaker such as the preferred language in a GD, how to present a point about which the person is not fully sure, etc., which were nicely clarified by the speaker. The session concluded after the mock GD.

November 26,2021

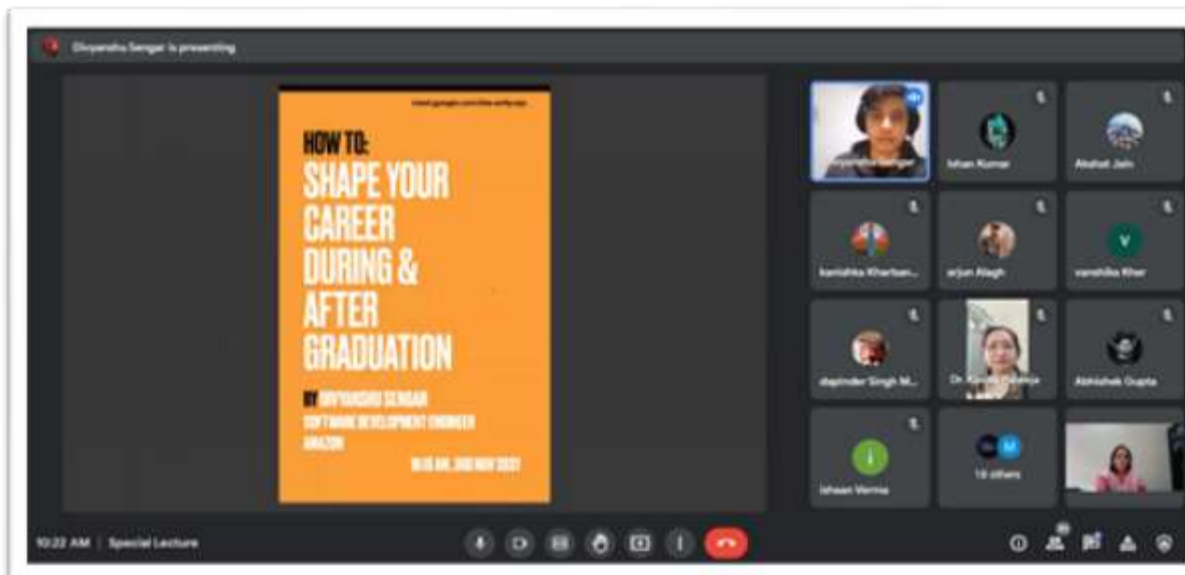

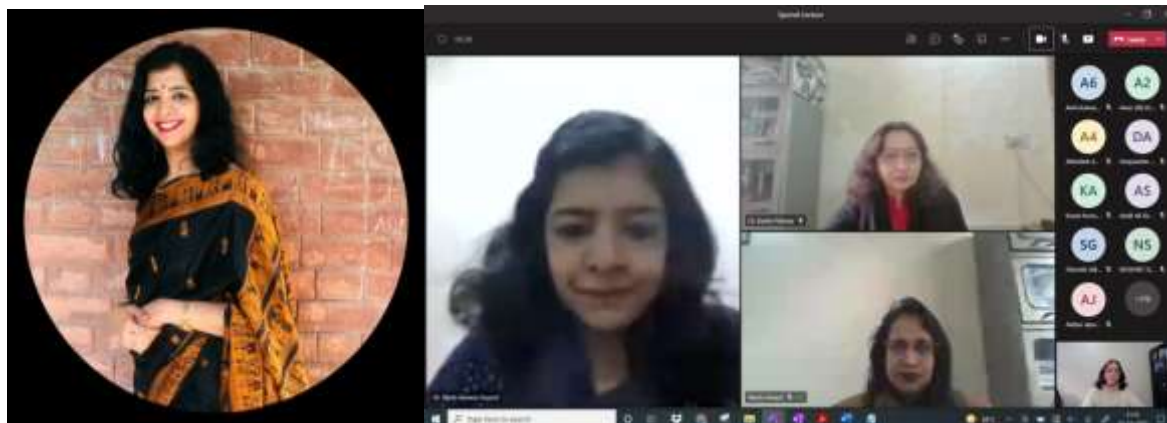

## 11. Special Lecture on “Mental Health Awareness”

January 12, 2022

In accordance with the institute’s initiative to conduct interactive sessions with their students,

The COVID-19 pandemic is a crisis unlike any our country has faced before. The constantly evolving situation may create significant stress and uncertainty. Many of us are dealing with constant stress due to this crisis in our country.

To overcome this stress and anxiety, an interactive session on stress management was organized by STUDENT COUNSELLING COMMITTEE MAHARAJA SURAJMAL INSTITUTE, JANAKPURI for the BCA 1 Semester students (2nd shift) on Wednesday, 12 Jan 2022 from 2 p.m. - 3 p.m. on an online platform. We were joined by a distinguished guest, Dr. Vanita Anand ma’am, who was the eminent speaker of the session, is a psychologist cum medical counsellor.

The session started out with an introduction and a welcome speech given to our guest, by student Anoushka, then Ms. Vanita kickstarted the session.

### Introduction:-

Our mental health determines how we think, feel and act. Good mental health is when you feel positive about yourself and cope well with the everyday pressures. If you experience issues dealing with everyday problems, it could be a sign of a mental health problem and should be addressed immediately.

### Why one faces such issues?

Both physical and mental health are the result of a complex interplay between many individual and environmental factors, including:

- family history of illness and disease/genetics
- lifestyle and health behaviours (e.g., smoking, exercise, substance use)
- levels of personal and workplace stress
- exposure to toxins
- exposure to trauma
- personal life circumstances and history
- access to supports (e.g., timely healthcare, social supports)
- coping skills

### **What is Neurosis?**

Neurosis is characterized by anxiety, depression, or other feelings of unhappiness or distress that are out of proportion to the circumstances of a person's life. They may impair a person's functioning in virtually any area of his life, relationships, or external affairs, but they are not severe enough to incapacitate the person. Affected patients generally do not suffer from the loss of the sense of reality seen in persons with psychoses.

### **What is Psychosis?**

Psychosis affects how a person thinks and their perceptions. Their senses may seem to detect things that do not exist, and they may find it difficult to determine what is real and true. People with psychosis may:

- hear voices
- see people or items that are not there
- smell odours that other people cannot detect

They may also believe that they are in trouble, someone is chasing them, or they are very important when these situations are not the case. A person may not be aware that they have psychosis because the delusions feel real to them. Psychosis can be overwhelming and confusing. Sometimes, the symptoms can cause the person to harm themselves. In rare cases, they may hurt another person.

### **Ways of prevention:-**

- Meditation
- Yoga (breathing exercises)
- Inculcate a hobby
- Do something good , something selfless once in a while
- Express gratitude to people around
- Connect yourself with nature
- Value yourself
- Listening to music

These tips also help to expel negative thoughts from the mind and promotes positive thinking. She told many ways to relieve stress and the most important way she told is about how one can talk about their emotions in a better way.

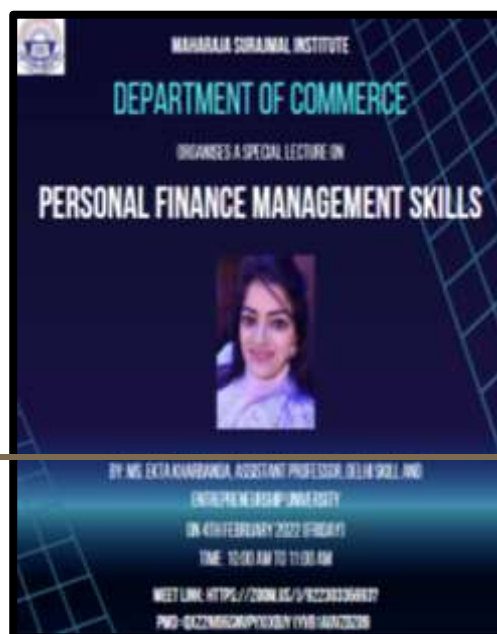

## 21. Special Lecture on Cognitive Sciences

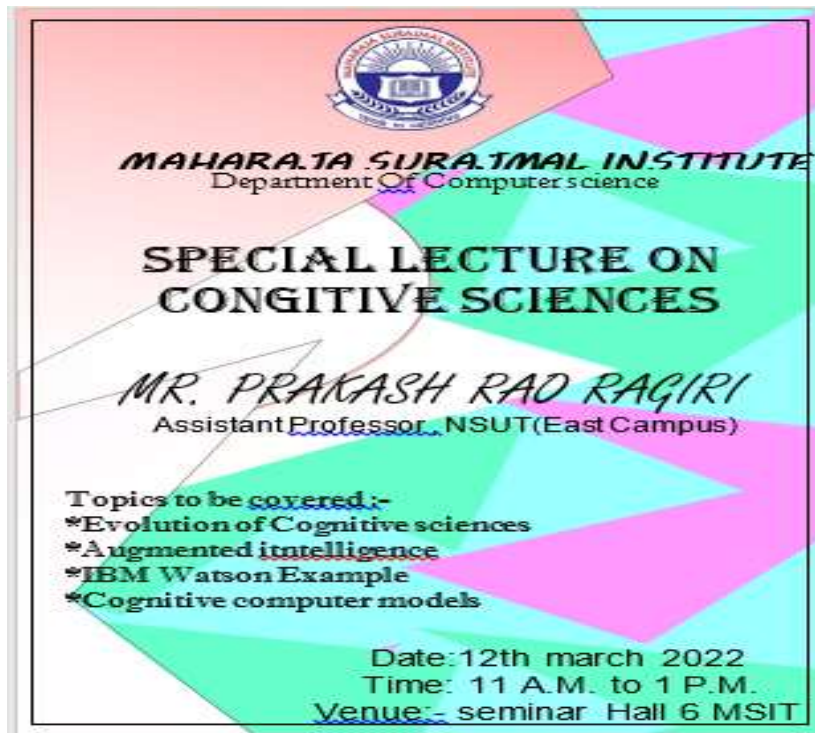
March 12,2022

Further, Mr. Ravi explained that students applying for social science and language teaching should select social science for paper 2 and students applying for science and maths teaching should select

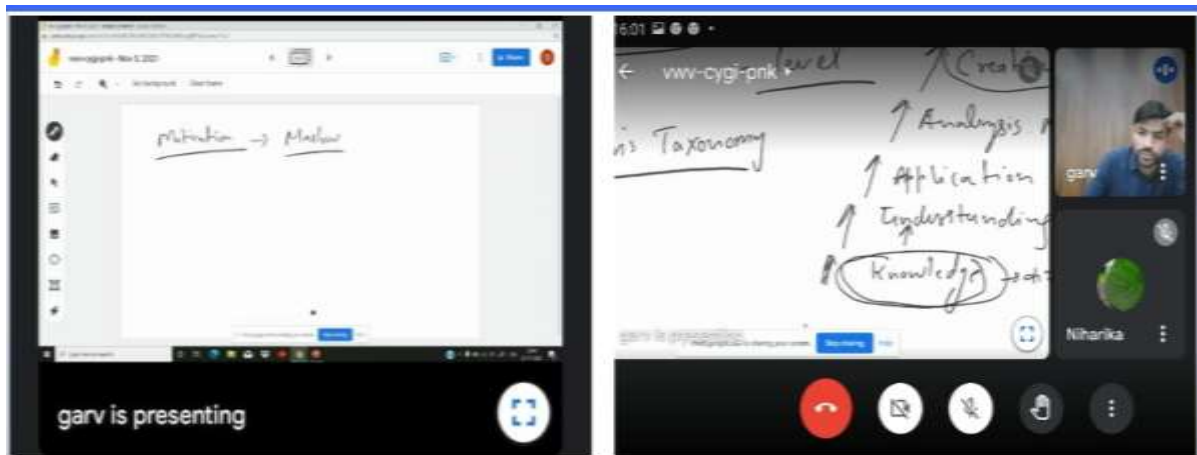

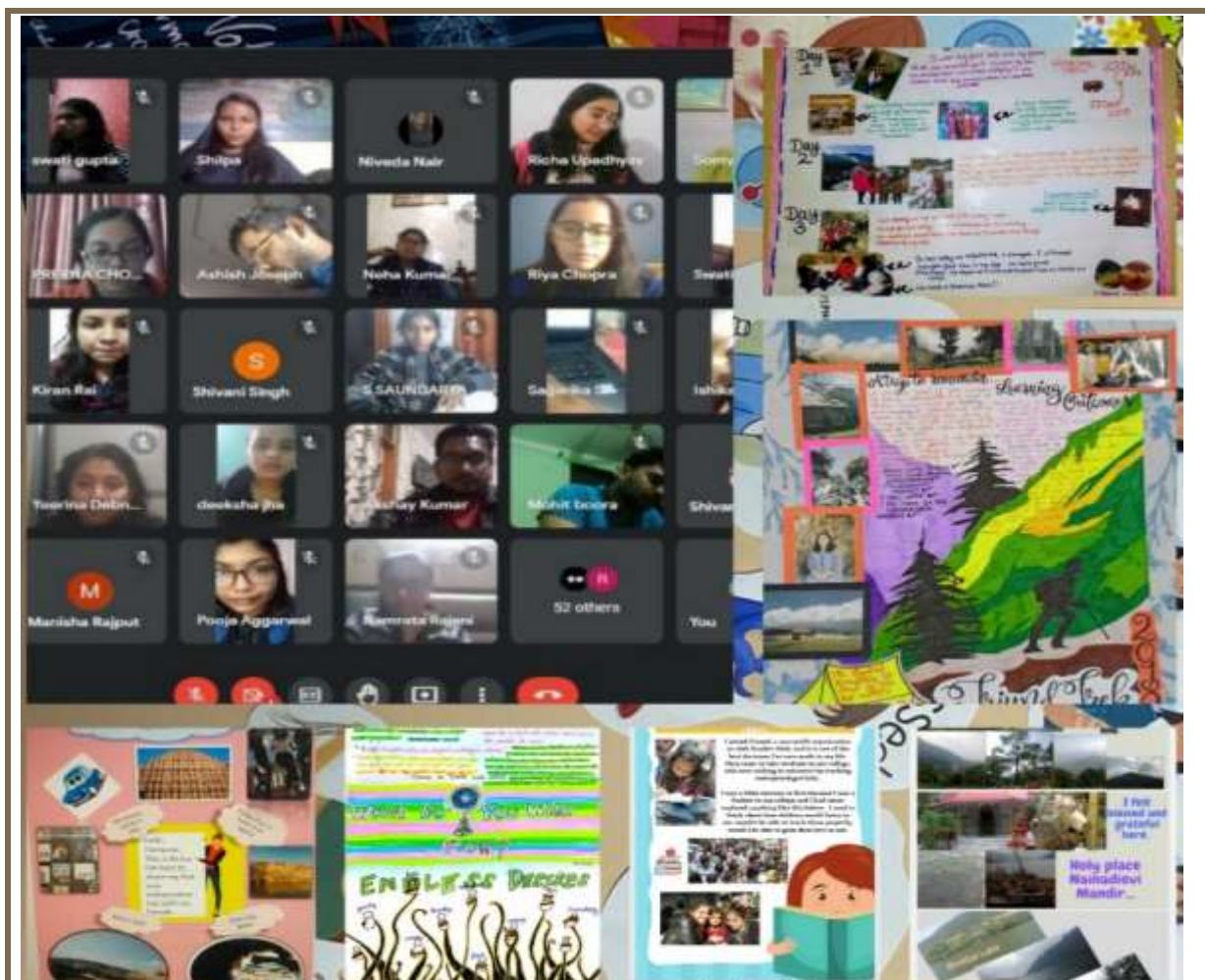

- To enable student-teachers to become more conscious of their responses to experiences, observations of life situations, as also of ideas and issues that arise in their minds, and to thus develop their capacity for reflection.

Dr. Vanita Anand and Dr. Vivek Solanki introduced about what mindfulness is, difference between formal and informal mindfulness, how it works, what it can do, its effects and benefits.

Informal mindfulness means paying attention on our day to day activities like when we are brushing teeth, we should focus just on the brush and the teeth and not stress or think about anything else because that will hinder the process of effective teeth cleaning. If we multitask, there is high probability that one of task won't be completed as expected because our attention got divided. Formal

mindfulness means doing some activities different from daily activities that will lead to mindfulness example mindful yoga, mindful breathing exercises.

She also discussed various benefits of mindfulness like it helps us fight depression and anxiety, helps reduce stress level and bodily pains, help improve sleep and stimulate production of dopamine too.

Vanita ma'am also explained that how we should 'RESPOND' to things and not 'REACT' to them. The difference between reacting and responding is that the later means taking some time to think and then give a reply but in reacting the reply is quick. So we should think first, understand other person's perspective and emotions, pause and breathe before speaking if the conversation is taking a high road.

Vivek sir taught us how to do mindful meditation. For that all we need to do is find a comfortable position, sit with our back straight and start then start by focusing on our breathe. During that duration, our mind is going to wonder about our daily life problems but we must try to focus on the breathing. This should be done for a minimum of 5mins daily, maximum up to however possible. Regular practice will make us better and better at it.

**CONCLUSION** This workshop helped me understand why mindfulness is so important in life. It can help us become more aware of what is going on for us internally and externally. We become more present to the "right now". Mindfulness practices can help us to increase our ability to regulate emotions, decrease stress, anxiety and depression. It can also help us to focus our attention, as well as to observe our thoughts and feelings without judgment. As we become more present in our lives and in relation to others, it can help us to make better decisions, to manage our emotions and to be more fully engaged in life. Mindful meditation practices can help with a variety of issues, including anxiety, depression, increases our concentration power, our focusing ability and also it regulates our mood and so we must incorporate it in our daily life activities for a better way of living.

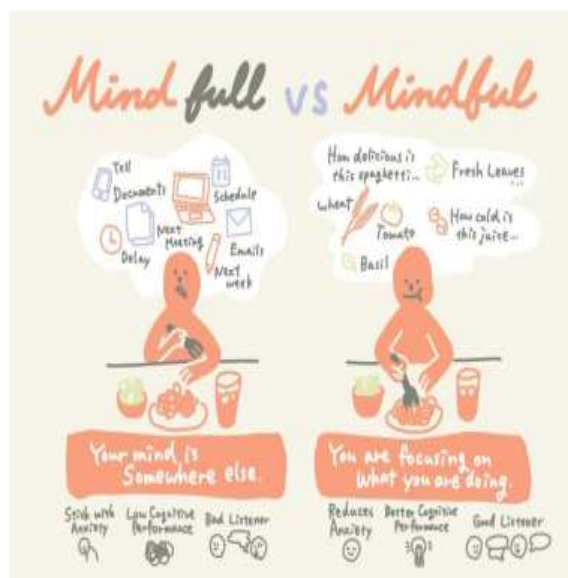

## 7. Workshop on Data Manipulation using Scilab software

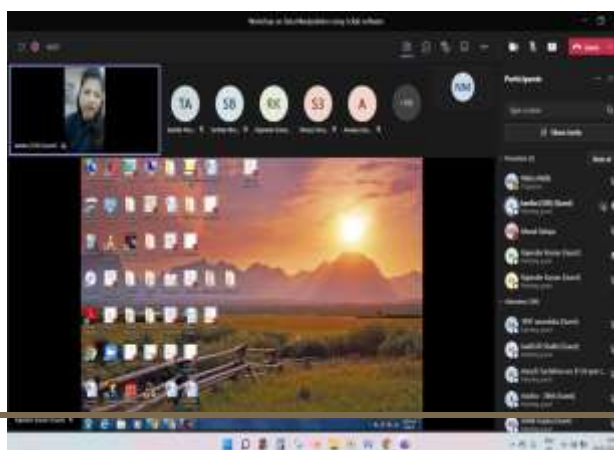
January 29,2022

**Had Anhad – Journeys with Ram and Kabir, a film by Shabnam Virmani**

#### HAD-ANHAD

Had Anhad – Journeys with Ram and Kabir, a film by Shabnam Virmani is an attempt at exploring the living traditions of Kabir while juxtaposing them with the reality of religious divisiveness that exists in our society today. Journeys to central and western India and across the border to Pakistan reveal an interesting tale. The film opens a door to the world of Kabir through the public and private lives of folk singers of central India, Rajasthan and Pakistan. These singers coming from distinctive regional and religious background recite Kabir in their own style. The mystic strength of Kabir and the rich musical tradition would leave a listener almost mesmerized. The film profiles Prahlad Tipaniya of Ujjain a compelling Dalit folk singer, who has grown into a popular Kabir singer of the Malwi folk tradition. Tipaniya's journey with Kabir reveals the impact Kabir's poetry could have on a common person. The film also portrays Mukhtiar Ali, from Bikaner, Rajasthan. He beautifully blends the Rajasthani folk idiom with refined classicism while singing Kabir and other Sufi poets like Mira and Bulleh Shah. Finally we move into Pakistan to encounter the charismatic Fariduddin, a traditional qawali singer whose enthralling music and poetry stir our souls. Besides the beautifully rendered music and poetry, the film raises several issues relevant to the modern day discourse on secularism and peace. The Sufi tradition effectively disintegrates the concept of organised religion and the dogmatism it entails. It also exposes organised religion's tendency towards oppression, exclusion and deliberate marginalisation of communities. These traditions are essentially reformist. Had Anhad is just about 100 minutes of visual treat in Hindi language, subtitled in English. Kabir, as the film portrays, defies boundaries between Hinduism and Islam and acts like a buffering agent between the two. Kabir had a Muslim name and upbringing, but his poetry repeatedly invokes the widely revered Hindu name for God - Ram. "Who is Kabir's Ram" is another question which the film seeks an answer to. The film journeys through songs and poems into politics of religion, and finds a myriad answers on both sides of the hostile border between India and Pakistan.



Shabnam Virmani is a prominent Indian documentary filmmaker and Had Anhad proves it beyond a point. This film goes far beyond the confines of personal lives of those who have found meaning in Kabir's philosophy, spilling over into socio-political issues, delving into the core of Hindu-Muslim politics and the concept of anthropogenic boundaries. Shabnam travels to Pakistan only to discover that Kabir has touched lives even across borders. As she journeys with Kabir singers, stumbling upon revelations, old and new, it is likely that we find ourselves travelling alongside, engrossed in Kabir's verses. The brilliance of characterization clubbed with the breath taking visuals, leg tapping musical score and well carved out story make 'Had Anhad' an interesting watch! The session was concluded with big round of applause from audience.

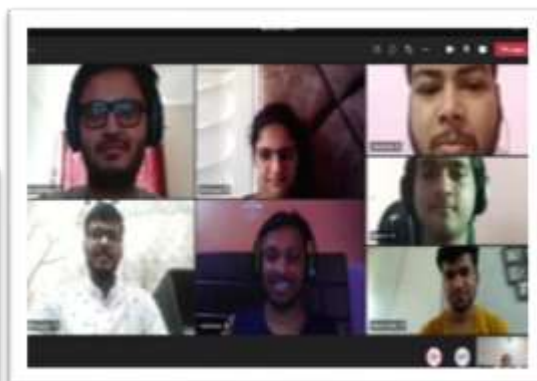
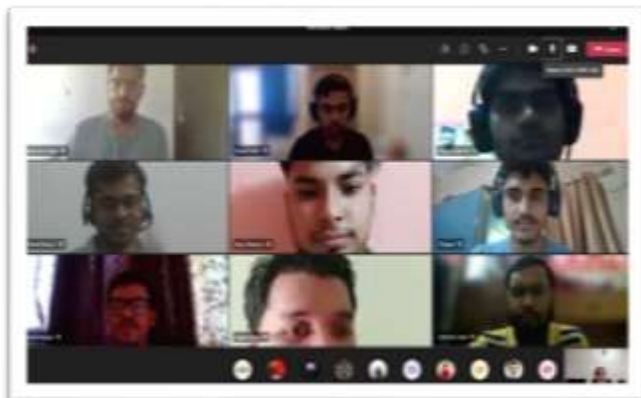

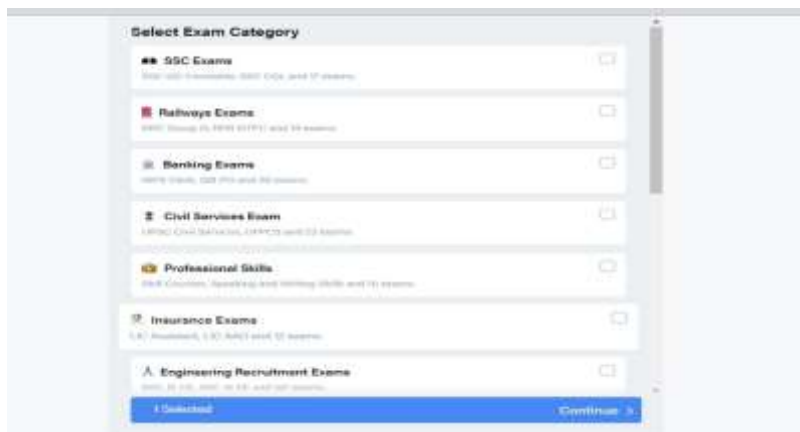
## 2. Report on IHS Markit Webinar

Friday, September 3, 2021

The Pre-placement cell of Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized a webinar on Friday, September 3, 2021. It was conducted by IHS Markit with its Product Management Executive Director, Mr. Bhushan Vijaywargi as the speaker. The topic for the webinar was 'Introduction to Financial Services with a deep dive into bonds', it began at 02:00 pm on Microsoft Teams. Nearly 186 students of MSI from the 3rd and the 5th semester had joined this webinar. Initially, the speaker conducted some polls for the students via slido to get to know his audience. Then he gave insights about product development, IHS Markit, and consultancy services. It was followed by a series of questions from the audience, one such question was, "Can a digital marketing student take up as product manager?". Then there was a much descriptive explanation of the concept of Financial services and Bonds. What is meant by capital? And what are the sources of capital? etc. were some of the topics covered. The speaker also gave insights about related terminologies such as what is the face value, issue price, coupon rate, collateral, etc. Throughout the session, students kept asking their doubts through writing in the chatbox or by unmuting themselves, Mr. Vijaywargi clarified all the doubts instantly. This was followed by a deep dive into the types of bonds. A large variety of bonds were discussed ranging from types based on Issuer, seniority to security, rating, etc. The next topic discussed was the Time Value of money (which means: the value of money today will not be the same tomorrow). All the topics discussed were well presented through a PowerPoint presentation, but, in addition, some numerical problems too were solved on Microsoft Excel. He discussed in a much detailed manner how to calculate the future value of money. The webinar ended at 03:30 pm with the thank you note from the head of the pre-placement cell. Overall, the entire workshop was well conducted and it was very insightful. MSI looks forward to more such webinars by IHS Markit.

## 3. APTTUTDE TEST,TESTBOOK CAMPUS LEADER PROGRAM September 4, 2021

Testbook - Campus Leader Program conducted a live aptitude exam on 4 September 2021, for the duration of 2 hours. The students had to register for the Aptitude exam by providing some basic personal details along with qualities as a leader, and their reason as to why they wanted to apply for the program. The Aptitude test had various categories from SSC, Railways, Banking to CAT and College Placement tests. All of these Tests had various subcategories of Tests in them.

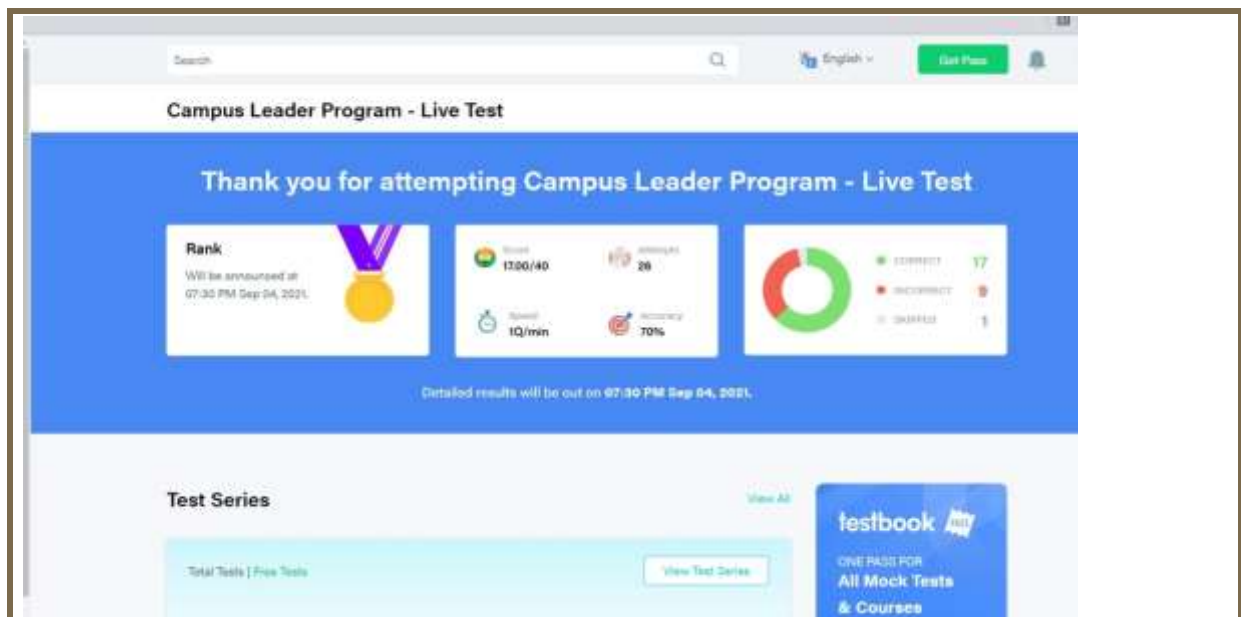


The CAT Exam Had two Aspects to it, the General Business Awareness and Aptitude Awareness. Each had 15 questions, with 1 mark being awarded for each correct answer. There was no negative marking of any sort. All of these questions had to be attempted in a span of 30 mins. All of these general instructions along with question identification and navigation were informed before the test.



The General Business Awareness section had questions about basic management, marketing and financial terms, like sales strategy, leadership, social media marketing etc. While on the other hand the Aptitude awareness section had questions from logical reasoning and quantitative mathematics.

The Test ended with providing the result in demographics such as score, speed i.e number of questions per minute, accuracy etc. Detailed results of the test were rolled out at 7:30 pm on 4 September 2021.

First part is mere intro of company its cultures, values etc.,

Now most important part is online test. It has 3 parts: Aptitude/Quant, English/Verbal and Coding sections. RS Agarwal is enough for first two. Third part being coding is toughest. For coding there would be 3 questions. It will be in ascending order of difficulty. SAP usually prefers a guy who has solved atleast one program correctly over a guy who hasn't touched the coding section yet! So solve this section as much as possible to increase your chances of qualifying for the next round.

### 5. Report on 13x Vaave Webinar

September 18, 2021

The pre-placement cell of Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized a webinar on Saturday, 18th September 2021 on Zoom which commenced at 04:30 pm. It was conducted by 13x by Vaave and the speaker for the webinar was Mr. Prashant Chaudhry. 13x is a program that will provide 13x Insights for MBA preparation and it will also give the chance to interact with the alumni of various Top B schools. The topic was: ACE 99+%ile in Quant.

The Agenda of this webinar was to brief about the expectations from CAT, 2021, how to set a goal in QA session, preparing a strategy, solving a few previous year's questions, and lastly, Q and A. Proper bifurcation of types of questions and how much time needs to be spent was clearly defined. Then there was some discussion about CAT 2020 marks vs percentiles through a graph and some tabular data of the past three years.



This was followed by explaining the Syllabus of CAT in a quite descriptive manner. The number of days was also mentioned corresponding to the topic telling the students that how much time each topic requires.

Then, the speaker talked about practicing Quant, he told about the 5-step ordering process which is as follows:

Study all the concepts involved.

Apply those concepts while practicing questions.

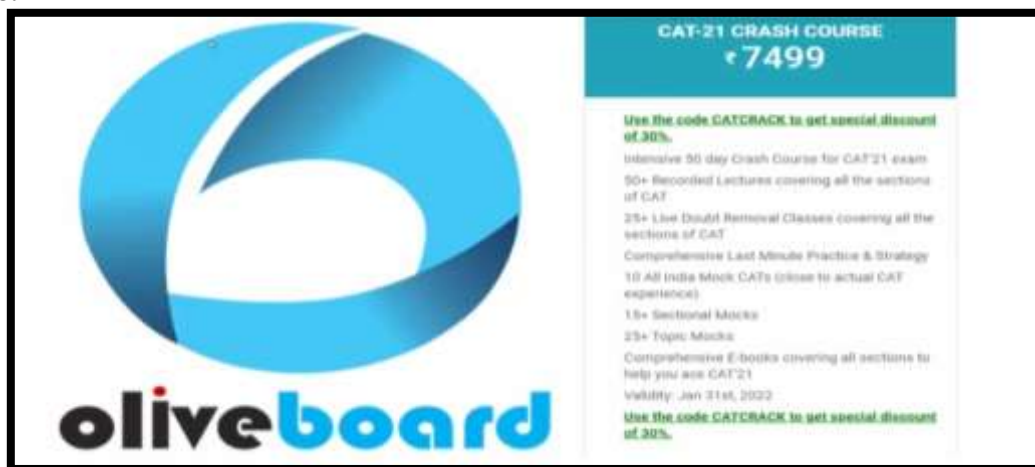
Make notes by noting down all important concepts and questions.

Keep solving few questions every week for every chapter you completed.

Make short notes/formula sheets for ultra revision.

Then, he told about the CPRM Approach to quant which is concept, practice, revision, mock.

He then gave insights about the 50-day crash course for CAT, 2021 organized by Oliveboard. Then he gave the complete action plan after one has enrolled in this course. He also told about the mock-taking strategy.



The speaker then solved around 4-5 questions from CAT, 2020 to give an idea to the audience regarding the type of questions asked. Lastly, few students asked their queries like how much time is sufficient to prepare for CAT, what is the difference between CAT and GMAT.

The session concluded after the QnA. Overall the session was very insightful, thanks to Vaave for conducting this webinar, Looking forward to more such sessions in the future.

### **6. Interaction Session for BCA III Year students was organised by BCA Alumnus Mr. Karan Sharma of Deloitte on 23<sup>rd</sup> Sep 2021.**

The following things were discussed and Mr. Karan have shared his experience with the students

The Deloitte Pre-Placement talk is quite long (about 2 hours) and filled with insights from the company and lots of interaction with the students.

Segregate your doubts in two heads:

1. **Doubts pertaining to the company**
2. **Doubts pertaining to the interview process**

ABOUT THE COMPANY:

Listen carefully and watch the videos shown and try to come up with questions.

Ask them how a day at Deloitte is like from different roles' point of view.

A little detail about the initial training, and how should one be better prepared for it.

How would the projects and offices be allotted once you make it to the company.

**Try to talk about the green dot (but don't sound extremely unknown about it)**

What initiatives does the company undertake to sharpen the skills of its employees to make them more efficient?

ABOUT THE INTERVIEW PROCESS:

For Deloitte, there is not much to ask about the interview process, it is very simple and straight-forward. If there will be any doubts, they would be relating to the group discussion mostly, as that round is the trickiest round. So, you can ask them about:

How to go about the group discussion. What kind of case study can we expect.

How to present the chart in the group discussion.

In the end, you can just ask your final question: **What according to them is the 'perfect hire'** (this would be my all time favourite)

Finally, let me tell you what I asked. I did not ask any questions in the pre-placement talk, but did not leave the chance when given by my interviewers after they were done interviewing me. I asked them two questions:

1. The pre-placement talk mentioned that the per-capita revenue is over 150,000 dollars. So, does that imply there will be a lot of work and expectations on our heads?
2. Also, in the pre-placement talk, your team mentioned that there is constant evaluation of the employees based on their work and how they are performing, so as to promote the deserving ones. So, should I be prepared to face a lot of competition in the work place, with people constantly trying to pull me down in order to prove themselves better?

## 7. "Soft Skills and Communication" By Uptoskills

20<sup>th</sup> Sept to 24<sup>th</sup> Sept 2021

The First Day of the Uptoskills 5 day Campus Ready Programme organized in association with Maharaja Surajmal Institute started with an informal chit chat between the trainer Ms Meetu and the attendees about their experience attending online lectures, personal anecdotes, etc. It was followed by a small activity wherein the attendees identified themselves with an animal and talked about how their personality aligns with that animal. The answers ranged from a lion- being brave, to a cheetah- being swift.



The trainer followed up with the topic, whether working under pressure yields better results or not. The attendees had varied opinions, where some agreed that yes critical and pressure situations do lead to better results, and on the other hand, some suggested that they do not.

This was followed by a fruitful discussion on the importance of communication skills for professionals. Some of the topics under this were how communication helps to improve performance, leadership skills, improve body language and reduce stress. The session further moved on to talk about communication percentage where it was discussed how little words matter in comparison to body language and voice of the speaker. The speaker then talked about the Communication process which incorporated how crucial feedback is in an effective conversation. The session then moved on to discuss the types of barriers to effective communication. The speaker explained how linguistic, psychological, emotional, cultural, attitude, and perception barriers lead to ineffective communication through personal anecdotes. Further, the session proceeded towards the 4S of communication, namely sincerity, simplicity, shortness, and strength. The speaker explained each with an in-depth personal example to keep the audience hooked up. The next topic up for discussion was the types of communication which included verbal, non-verbal, written, visual, and listening communication. All of these were discussed in depth along with their sub-categories like eye contact, body language, email, active listening, infographics, etc. The session moved ahead with another activity which was meant to tell the importance of tone while speaking. The trainer said the same word in different tones and then asked the students that what they could interpret from the tone. There was another activity to tell the importance of posture while speaking in which a student was asked to introduce himself while looking down and with a rounded back, then the same person was asked to give his introduction with his back straight, there was much difference seen in the two introductions, the latter sounded much more confident. So, it was concluded that a good posture enhances the speech of a person.

This was followed by discussing Verbal communication and all its important elements such as volume, rate, tone, emphasis, etc. Then, the trainer talked about articulation which further includes Grammar, Pronunciation, and Vocabulary; fillers, and orators. Some examples of good orators in history were also discussed.



The next topic was non-verbal communication, it was told that just the body language could indicate that whether the person is willing to listen or not, whether the person is dominating or submissive, etc.

Then the discussion moved on to how to work perspective can be changed by making sure to understand the situation before jumping to the conclusion. She further discussed temper and emotional quotient, this was complemented by a short QnA as well. Then the trainer showed a video titled 'Brune Brown on Empathy', this was shown to make the students understand the difference between sympathy and empathy.

Then the discussion moved to Group discussion, what is it, the purpose it serves, important tips to be successful in a GD, etc. Then two GDs took place where around 8-10 students participated in each. The first topic was movies vs books and the second topic was degrees were meant for the past, not in the present times.. Further, the speaker talked about the importance of time management as a necessity and also an effective way to reduce stress. The session delved into the importance of making a stress log as an efficient way to bust stress. The speaker then talked about some steps that can help in stress management, namely one should expect rejection, take a step back and reflect, find a way to stay positive, take care of yourself.

Towards the end, the final topic picked up was Corporate values wherein pointers like integrity, ownership, respect, boldness, trustworthiness, accountability, and autodidactism were pondered upon among others. The session ended with positive and brilliant feedback given by the attendees ranging from the session being the most interactive and interesting to behavioral changes being incorporated in many of the attendee's personalities.

#### **8. Industrial Visit to Network Bulls**

**September 29, 2021**

Maharaja Surajmal Institute, Department of Computer Application organized Industrial Visit to Network Bulls, Sector 14, Gurgaon, Haryana on 29-09-2021. BCA Final years students participated in the visit. They were given theory session followed by hands on practical session using Cisco Simulator for Establishing a small network. Later, students were shown latest Routers, Switches, Data servers, IP Security servers etc. The coordinator took a brief session on career guidance in various fields like Entrepreneurship, Digital Marketing, Web Development and Networking. The students had a great time learning.

## 10. Career Edge Workshop

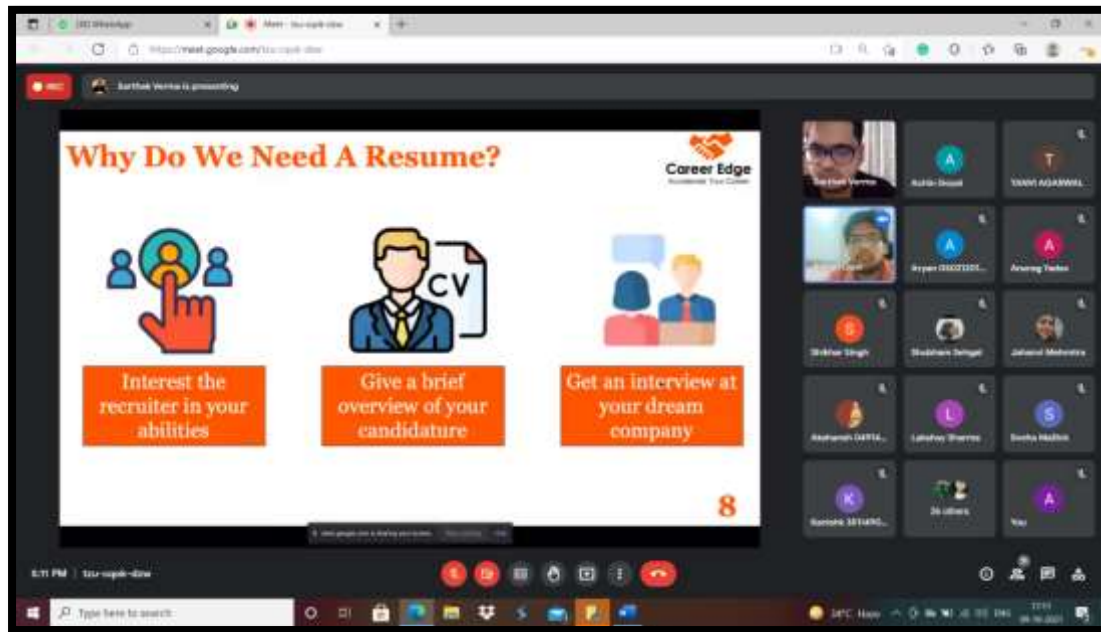
October 9-10,2021

The pre-placement cell in collaboration with Advertere, the marketing society of Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized a workshop on two days, they were conducted by 4 mentors of Career Edge, who come from top colleges to guide the students. 9th October 2021, Saturday, was the first day and 10th October 2021, Sunday, was the second day.

The agenda for day 1 was to discuss career options in Finance and how to make a nice resume. The workshop began with a brief introduction of Career Edge, its founding members, and the four mentors who were conducting the workshop. It took place on Google meet and 51 students had attended this workshop.

Then began the first half of the workshop which was: Career options in finance. There was in-depth discussion and explanation done by the speakers about the options one has in some particular field, for instance, under accountancy, there are audit, tax, risk assessment, etc., under Investment management, there are corporate finance, debt investment, portfolio management, etc.; and then under investment advisory, there are credit rating, investment banking, financial planner, etc.

Then began the second half, resume making. First, the mentors talked about the need for a resume. Then they discussed the layout and appearance of a good resume which was followed by making the right choice of words while writing a resume. Then, the discussion moved further to the spikes in the resume which are skill, experience, and PoR, and lastly they discussed how and where to begin when writing a resume.



Throughout the session, students kept asking their doubts such as which one is better: MBA or CFA, whether to pursue CFA alongside or after MBA, etc., all these doubts were clarified nicely by the mentors. Day 1 ended at 05:55 pm.

For the second day, the agenda was to discuss how to ace the technical rounds and HR interview experience. It took place on Google meet and 31 students had attended this workshop.

The workshop began with a discussion on acing the technical round which comprises of general topics (Micro and Macro Economics, Finance news. Latest deals, etc.), Corporate finance (3 statements, ratios, etc.), and Investment banking (M&A valuation, sector prep, ratio, etc.). The mentors also talked about sources for each field such as Investopedia, economic times, correlation and line-item movement & effect, financial statements revision, changes in budget/monetary/fiscal policies.

The workshop moved ahead with a discussion on the HR round which includes the aptitude round, company prep, role prep, strengths and weaknesses, incident-specific questions to see the leadership skills, ethics, etc.



Students asked several questions like, are NISM courses worth doing and adding to resume? Does putting work experience aside MBA in the resume give you an edge etc. All these doubts were cleared by the mentors.

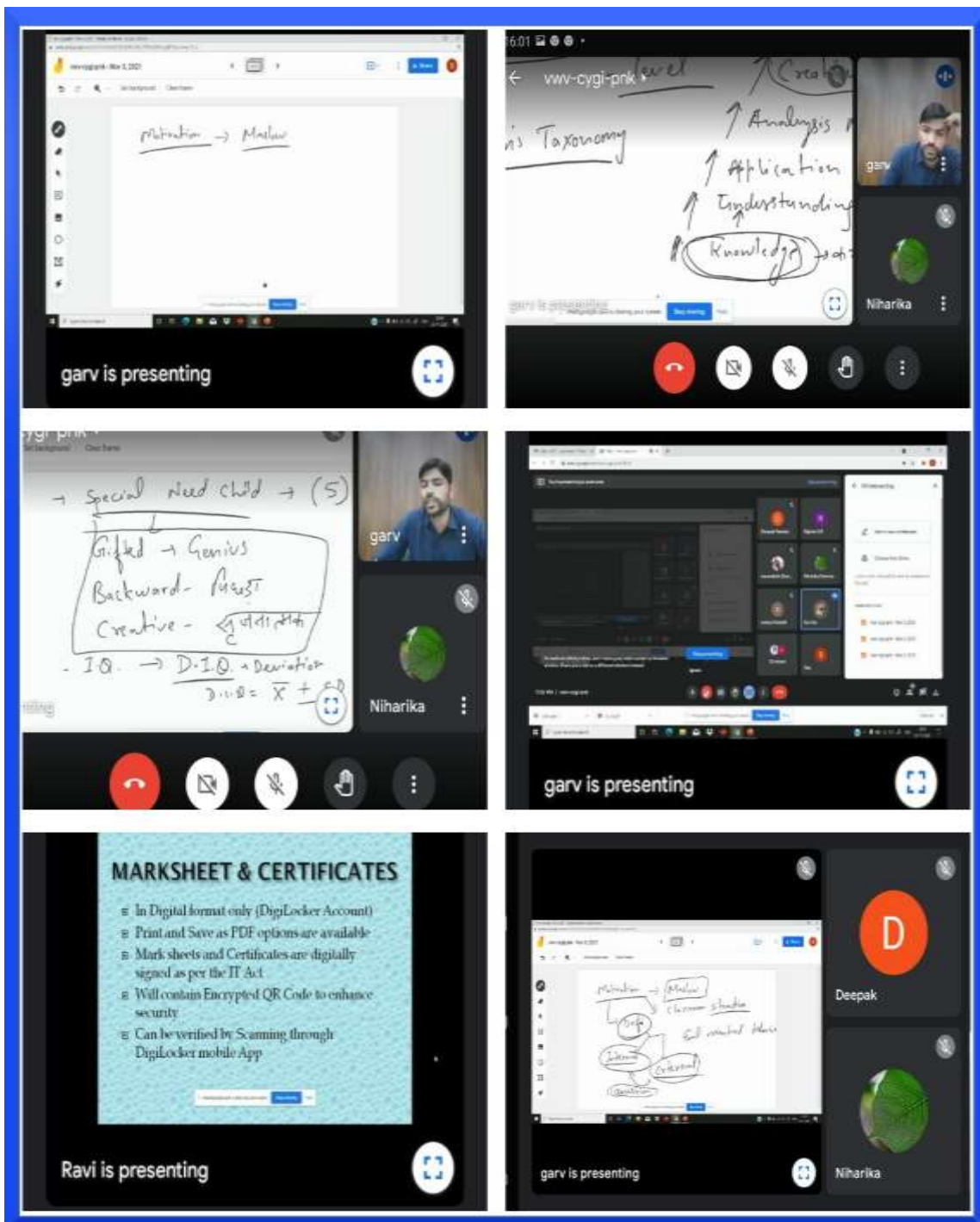
about the TPCs centers where students can go and give mock exams for CTET as the CTET is being conducted online for the first time this year.

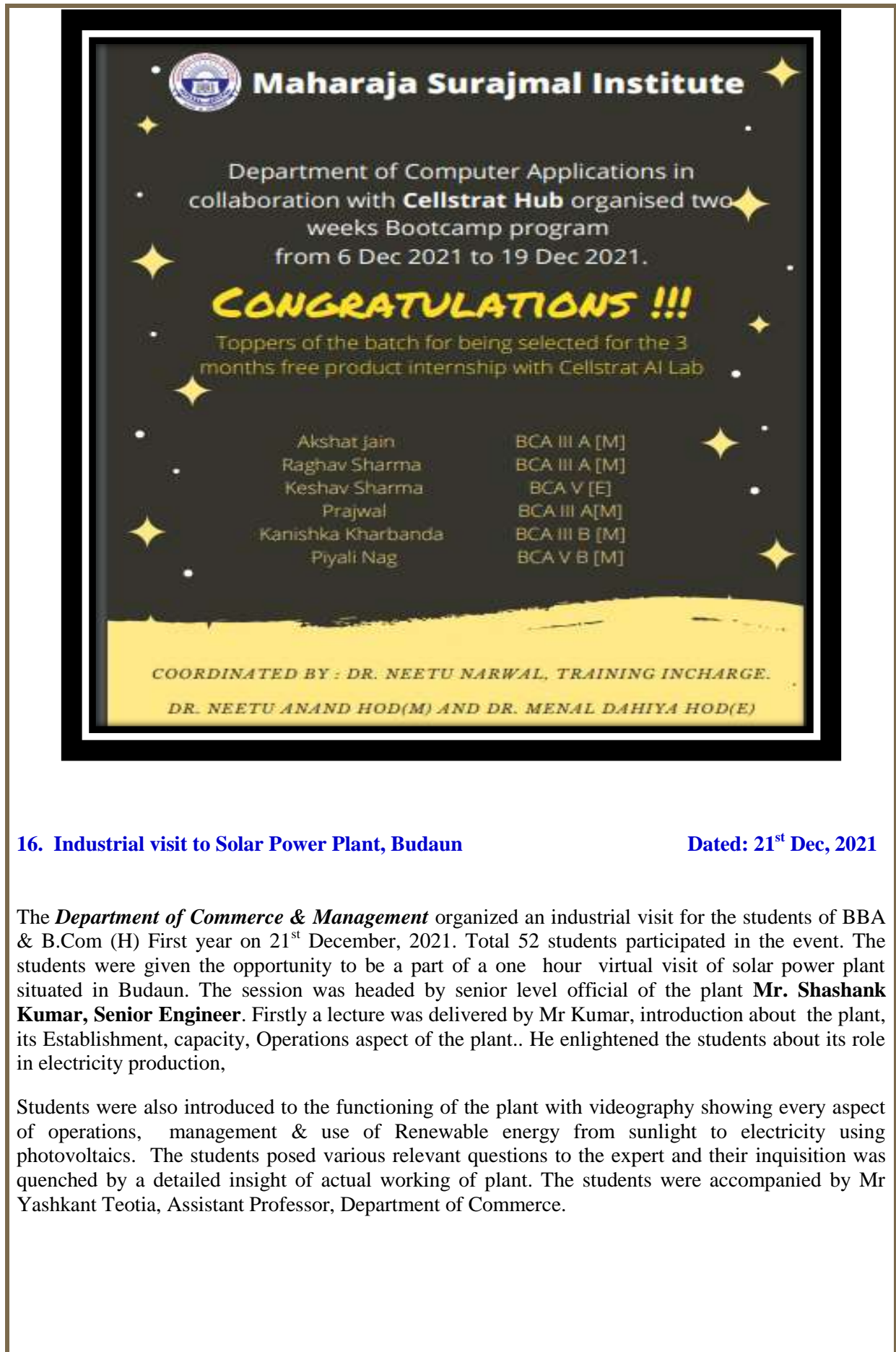

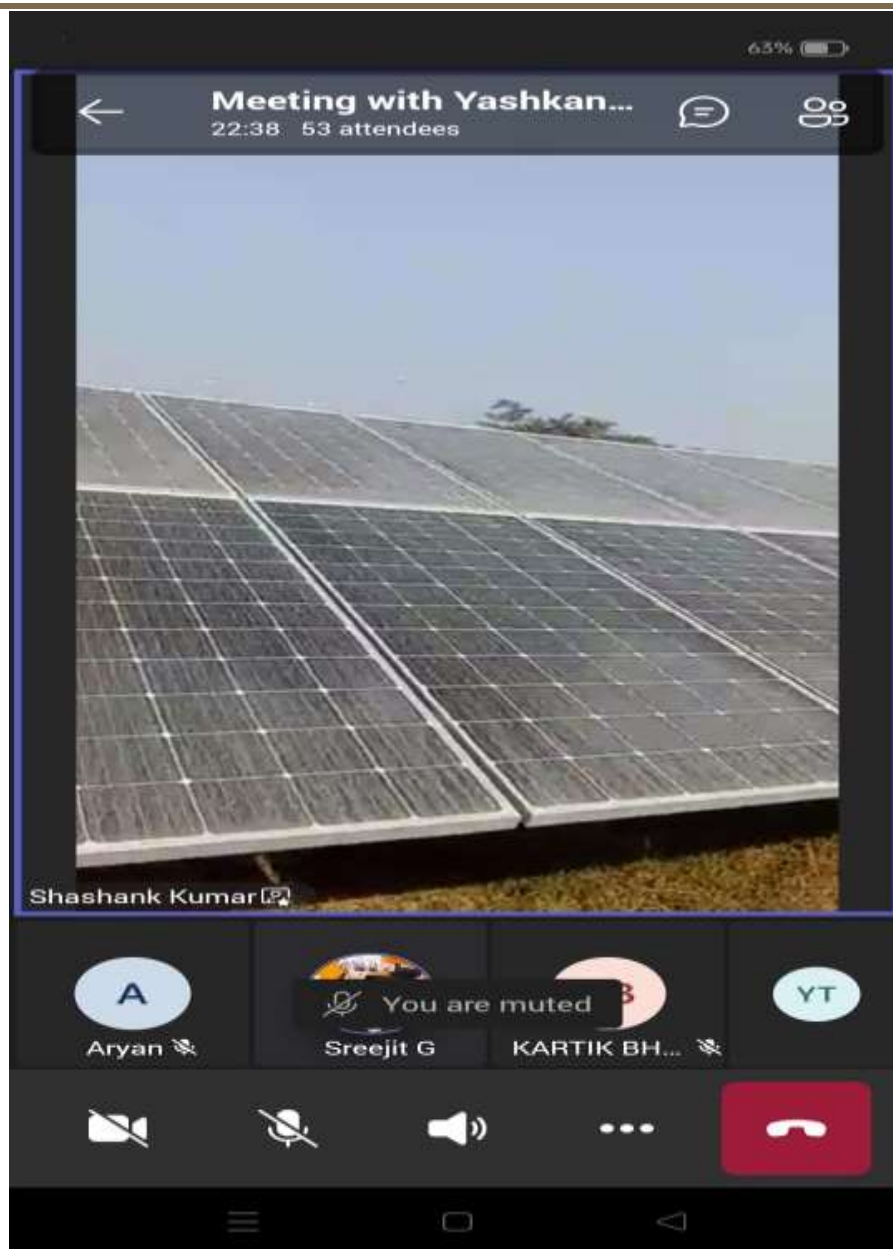
## 16. Industrial visit to Solar Power Plant, Budaun

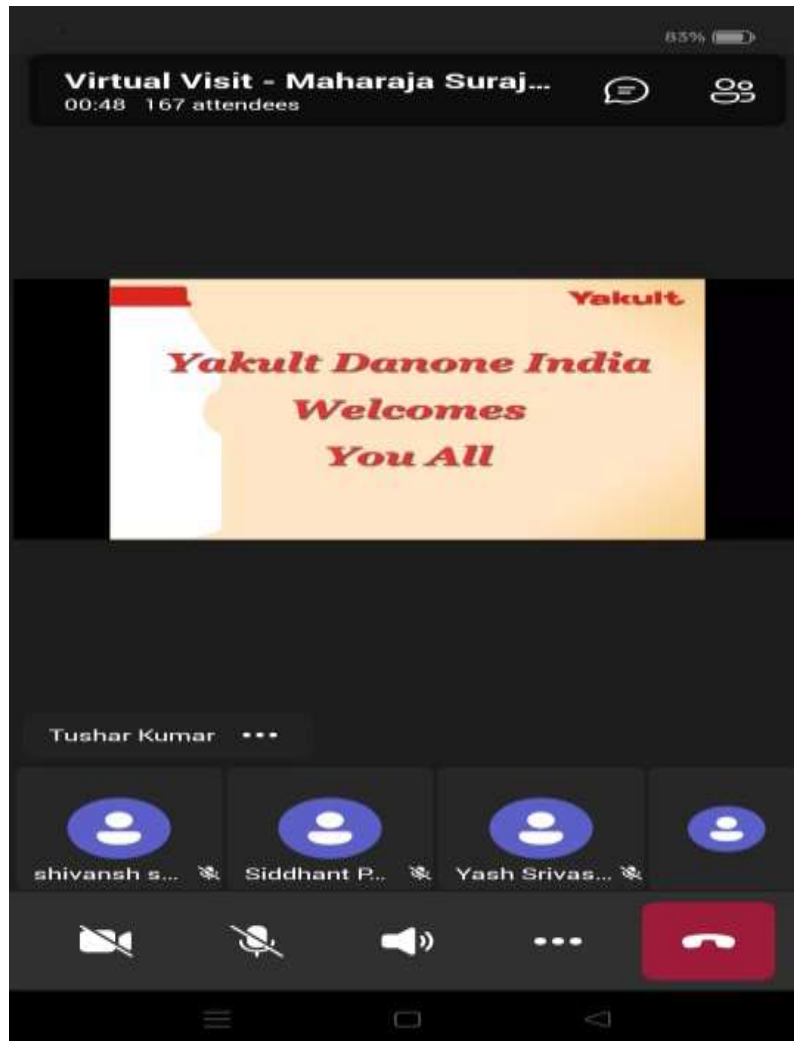
### 17. Industrial visit to Yakult Danone India Pvt Ld, Sonipat

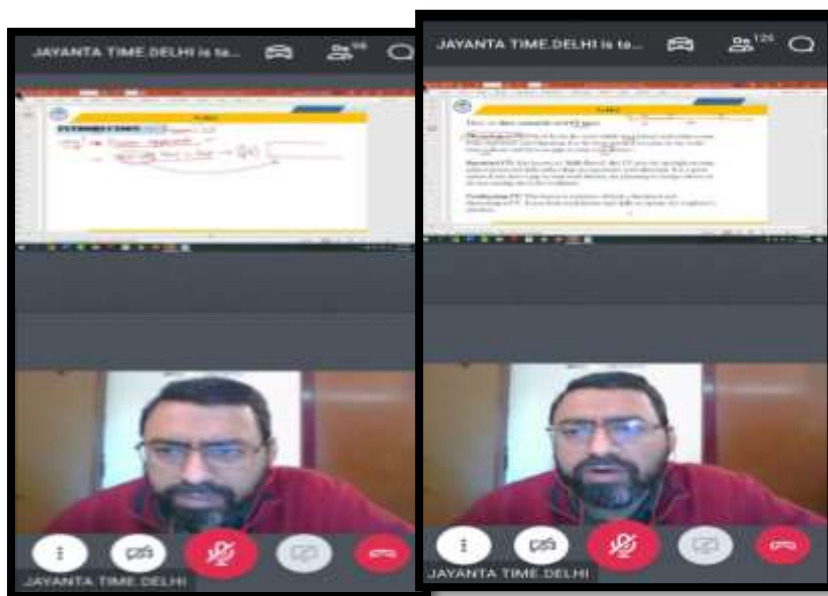
### 20. Webinar on CV writing

They have to implement these technological innovations in their curriculum, without losing their control over the classroom. Later on, she told us about the teacher recruitment process and

shared some important and useful tips which students must keep in mind before facing any interview. Recruiters select those candidates who have an effective Resume. Therefore, building an effective Resume or CV is the 1st step of the Teaching Recruitment process. To be shortlisted for an interview means that you have successfully completed an application form or produced an effective CV which has enabled you to stand out from the crowd, and meet the job criteria. She further shared few skills an ideal candidate has:

- Demonstrate strong content knowledge.
- 2 • Proven track record for planning lessons with clear learning objectives and a means for assessing whether those objectives have been met.
- Proven track record for engaging students in their own learning.
- Adopts multiple methods of teaching.
- Demonstrated success in working collaboratively in a team.
- Strong organizational and communication skills.
- Flexible or Dynamic.
- Demonstrated success in tailoring instruction to the needs of diverse learners.

She informed the students about the selection process and type of personnel an organization seeks with an emphasis on group discussion, interview and soft skills. Participants asked few questions regarding placement such as the strategy for getting placed at a good organization, opportunities and growth rate etc. Concluding Remarks: To conclude, the objective of the Placement talk was to provide prospective teachers with a platform for using their potential to gain valuable experience by working in schools. #### SUMMARY OF THE EVENT

The event commenced with the gathering of participants at Seminar 6 of MSIT. The speaker was introduced by Riya Arora. In the beginning a brief description regarding the event was given to the students. **Dr. Manimala Roy** started the event by sharing her B.Ed. experience as this course not only teaches you to inculcate good teaching skills but also how you give your contribution in the existing education system. The course curriculum teaches prospective teachers how to play their part in making a healthy education structure. She shared some key points or qualities a student must possess to be a good teacher in a school. A teacher leads, guides, facilitates and mentors a student. They are role models who set an example to students and drive them towards a brighter future.

She explained the scholastic, co-scholastic and non-academic process that a school system holds. She also guided us with the questions that arouses in the mind as a candidate appearing for the interview before the panel of experts for being hired as a teacher in various schools. She

familiarized us with some important that an interviewer focuses on and judge us on the basis not only of the content knowledge but also the behaviour, body language and inter-personal attitude that we portray after entering in the school premises.

#### KEY HIGHLIGHTS:

- Our success as a teacher depends upon the efforts we take to motivate and influence the young minds.
- A good communication skill – verbal, non-verbal (through actions), written.
- Appropriate dressing sense and greeting sense.
- Punctuality as a role model for the students.
- Problem solving skills and presence of mind to tackle any situation that arises unexpectedly.
- Setting of logical goals to be achieved within a span of 1 year, 5 year and long term sorted as a step-by-step process.
- Strong content knowledge of the specific subject along with child's psychology.
- Knowledge about the school history and achievements for which one has to appear for interview.
- For salary negotiation use pleasant words and never gave a blunt reply to the interviewer. Considering all the aspects like travel, working hours politely negotiation for a justified salary is appreciable.
- Experience doesn't make a good teacher but the fresh ideas and competency that a teacher must hold is a big reason to be accepted by any institution.
- At the end she asked each one of us to enquire ourselves with few questions that holds a big question on all of us as the upcoming teachers.

Two of our students has asked the question about the fear that we carry before interviewers to which she replied that fear of losing nothing is what we carry. All we need to recall is our knowledge and dignity we carry with ourselves and she also advised to carry some mood refreshments along with us during an interview.

#### CONCLUDING REMARKS:

To conclude, the objective of the Placement talk was to provide prospective teachers with a platform for using their potential to gain valuable experience by working in schools. Multiple tips and strategies were discussed to get selected for a teaching profile.

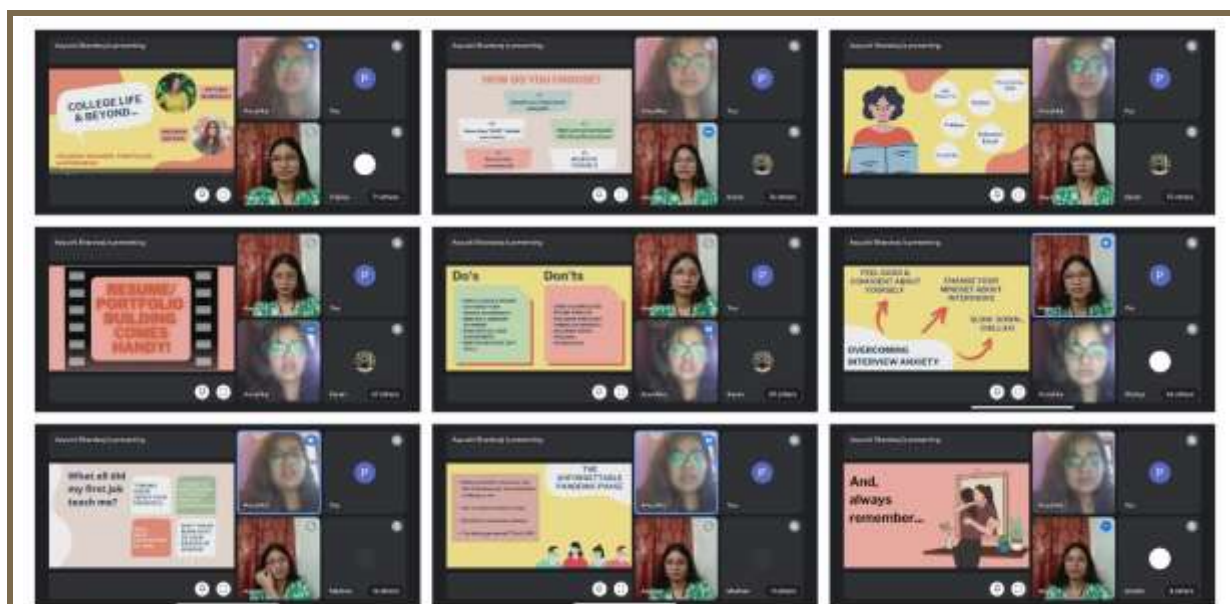

September 26, 2021

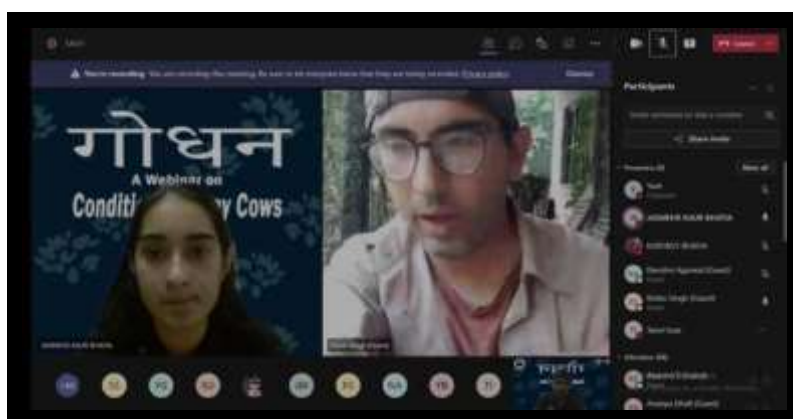
The webinar on the condition of Stray cows in India.

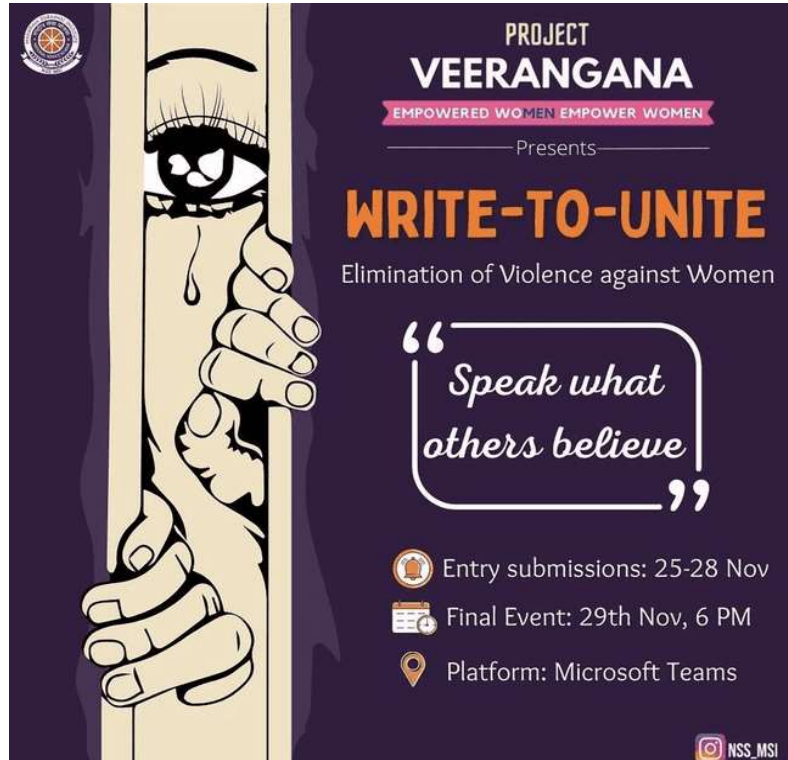
Participants had to write a short piece of literature on “Elimination of Violence against Women”. (essay, poem, short story, etc.)

**A WORKSHOP BY PRAKRITI MSIT, NSS MSI, IEEE MSIT, Meraki and Innovision**

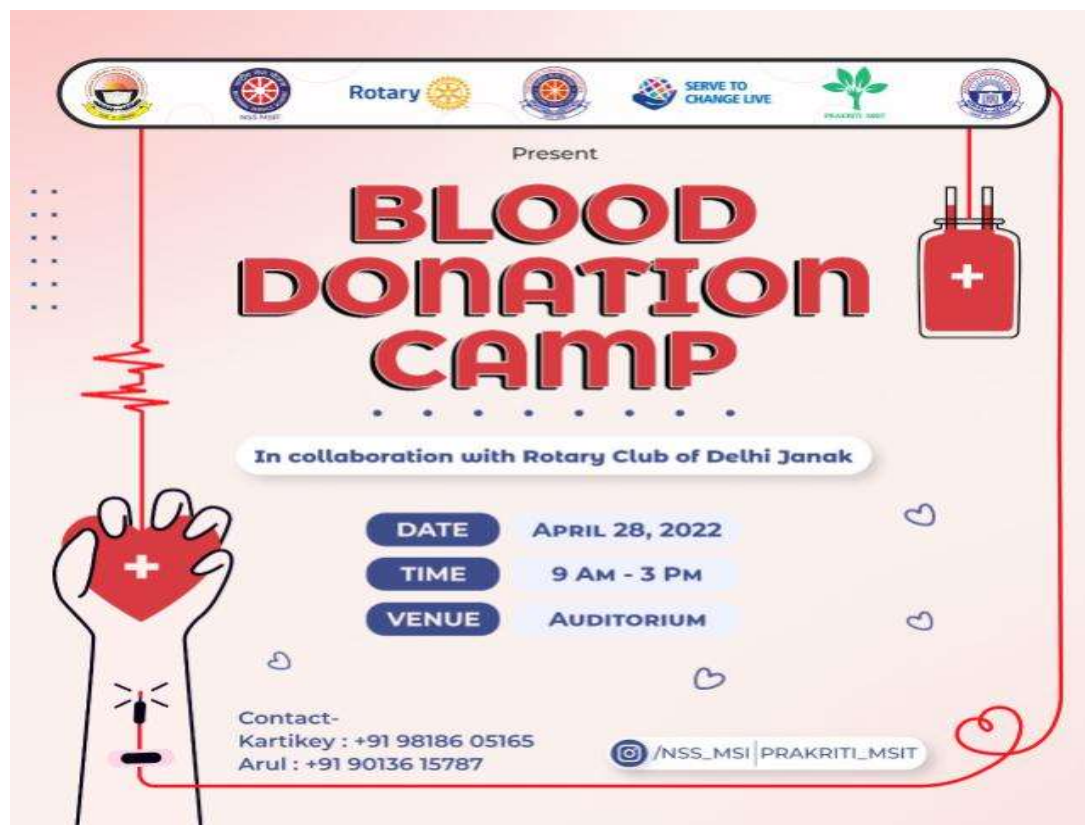

By acknowledging this noble deed, Prakriti MSIT and NSS MSI have organized a 'Blood Donation Camp' to enable the masses to donate blood and save lives.



### DATE OF EVENT

The event was conducted on 28 April 2022.

**TIMINGS AND PLACE** The event was conducted in the college auditorium from 9 am to 3 pm.

**ORGANIZER** -It was organized by the event heads- Kartikey Bhatia and Arul Singh

**TIMELINE OF THE EVENT** -The event was divided into two shifts, with time frames of 9 am-12 pm and 12 pm-3 pm. There were two blood banks, the Pitampura blood center and rotary blood center that were a part of this event. The Rotary club set up recliners on stage and Pitampura blood center set up a van outside the auditorium.



The NSS volunteers followed a dress code of their official NSS T shirts and were given ID cards for easier identification.

There was a reception desk where many volunteers registered their names for giving blood to any of the two blood banks. There were a few employees who asked some questions about the volunteers' health history and whether they take any specific medications. Some specialists present there, were checking the blood pressure levels, hemoglobin, weight, blood group, iron levels and other specific details mandatory for donation.

Post the donation, the noble donators also received bananas, juice and biscuits as refreshments and the specialists made sure they felt healthy after the blood donation process. Important medical tips were also shared by the doctors so that the volunteers felt good!

If considered eligible, a phlebotomist would draw 1 pint of blood and after that, put an adhesive strip on the arm. Through this easy process, 200 volunteers were able to donate their blood.



**CONCLUSION-**The event was a massive success. 200 motivated volunteers, as well as members from the faculty donated their blood and did a noble deed. Through these 200 pints of blood, more than 600 lives can be saved! The event was wrapped up after 3 pm. They were also given certificates by the blood banks to motivate them to spread the word and keep donating!

### 8. Library Orientation speech by Ms. Reetu Verma (Librarian & Head) December 4,2021

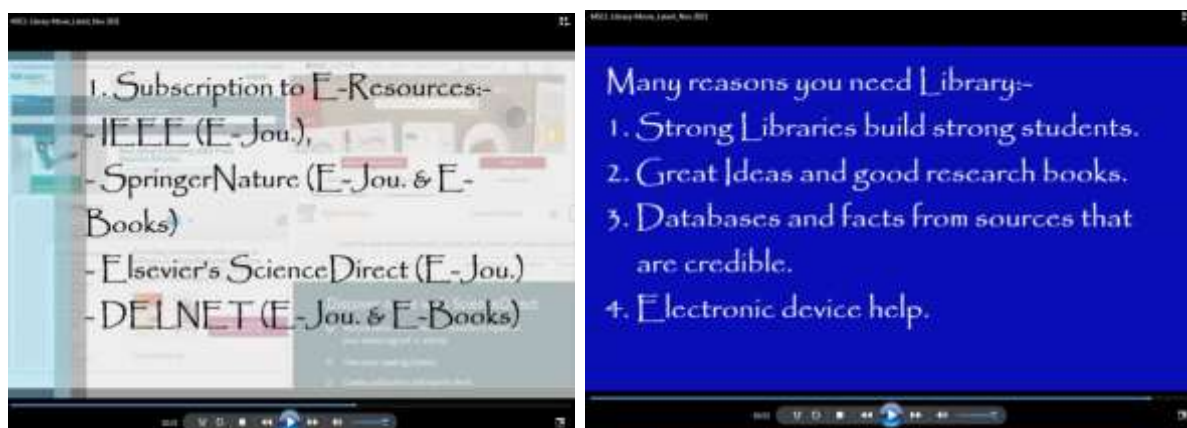

She wind up the session inviting the MSI students to come and browse the collection and services of Central library and Book-Bank.

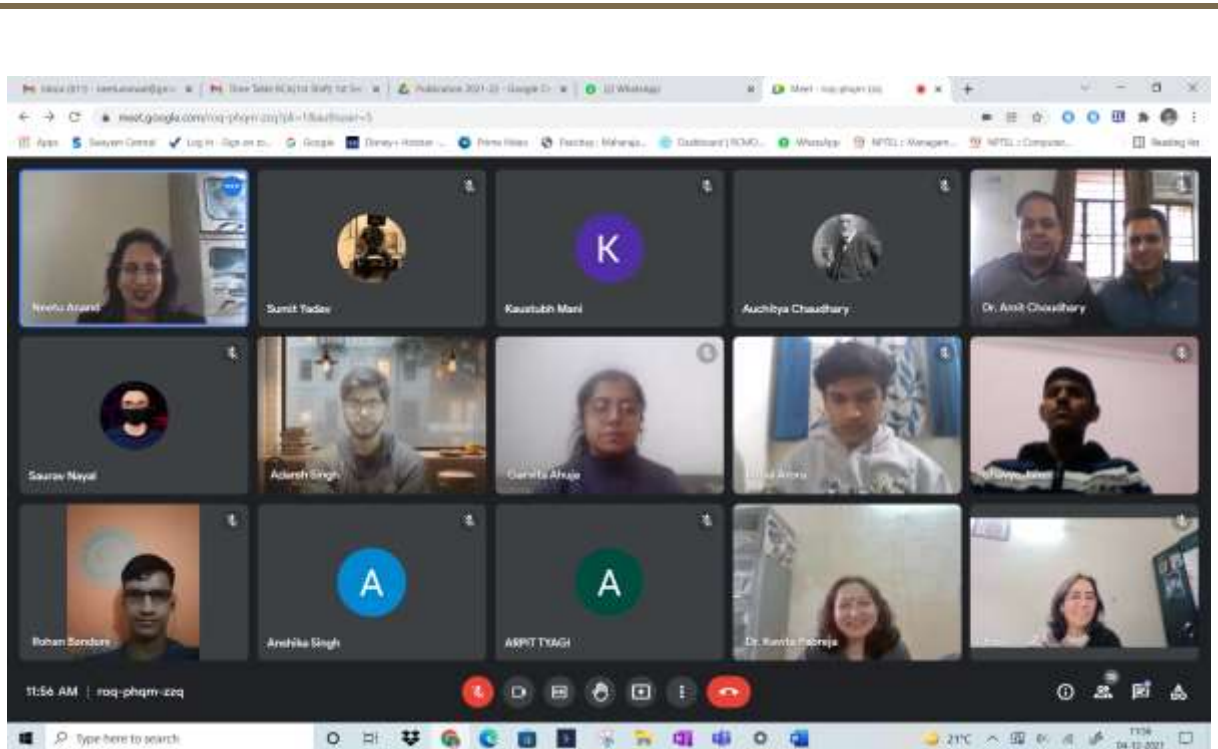

### THE SECOND ROUND

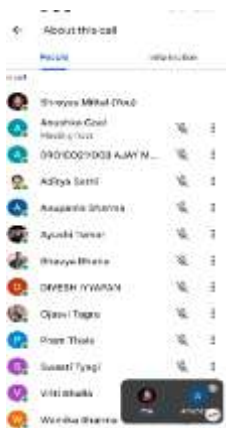
The second round was the main round of speech writing, speaking, and presentation the shortlisted students were to write a speech on **TOPIC: Air pollution should not be the price of prosperity.**

The campus was divided into 4 broad areas namely the MSI building, Auditorium, Hostel and MSIT Ground. The members then clicked pictures of the trees and bushes of those areas and identified them and maintained a count of those greens on Google sheets. The members were able to identify the names of the trees using 'Google Lens' which further made them aware of the wide variety of flora in the campus. They also realized the various greens which provide immense benefit to the humans were planted inside the campus premises, like the *Dracaena trifasciata* or the snake plant, which provides oxygen in abundance and is beneficial in areas especially like Delhi where pollution levels rise high beyond bars. The 'Green Audit' was organized by the Faculty Coordinator of Nature knocks, Dr. Anupama Sharma and was coordinated by the President of the club, Bhavya Bhatia. The members of the club participated actively in the audit with immense zeal and enthusiasm, making the audit accurate and reliable. 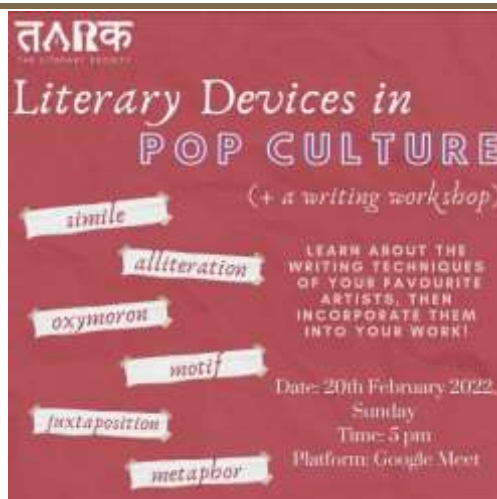

#### ***(1) Quiz(CEO/Logo/Tag Line)***

The event titled as Tech fest was organized by the department of BBA second shift on 11 and 12 March 2022. The event comprises of multiple activities for the students. In total 14 students participated in the event.

### *(2) Spin D Wheel*

On 12th March 2022, the 'Spin D Wheel' event was conducted in Maharaja Surajmal Institute, coordinated by Anshita Yadav, BCA 2nd year and Deepika Singh, BCA 2nd year, under the supervision of Dr. Anshu Lochab. The event comprised of two games, Word Search and BGMI battle. The Word Search was organized in Room 304. In this, 27 students participated out of which 3 students opted to play individually and rest were divided in groups of two. Participants were distributed in three rows. Each group and individual players were given a sheet of paper containing the quiz. For round one, they were given twelve minutes to search words from the puzzle, mentioned in the index of the quiz. At the end of the round, the sheets were collected per row and the group or individuals were evaluated on the basis of words searched by them. The group which scored maximum in their row were qualified for Round(11 two (two groups and one individual qualified for second round). Out of these three who scored maximum, was given the chance to spin the wheel, which had advantages and disadvantages in random order. The first group was asked to give the advantage/disadvantage to one of the two groups. The other two then competed for position 2. The one who scored maximum in second round, then competed with the one who scored maximum in round one.

The second game conducted was an online battle of BGMI. In this, twelve students participated and the one who was able to survive won the game. The winners of BGMI Battle are Aakash, BCA(E) 2nd year. The runner up is Abhay, BCA(E) 2nd year and the second runner-up is Nitish Kashyap, BCA(E) 2nd year.

### 33. Celebrating Biodiversity Day

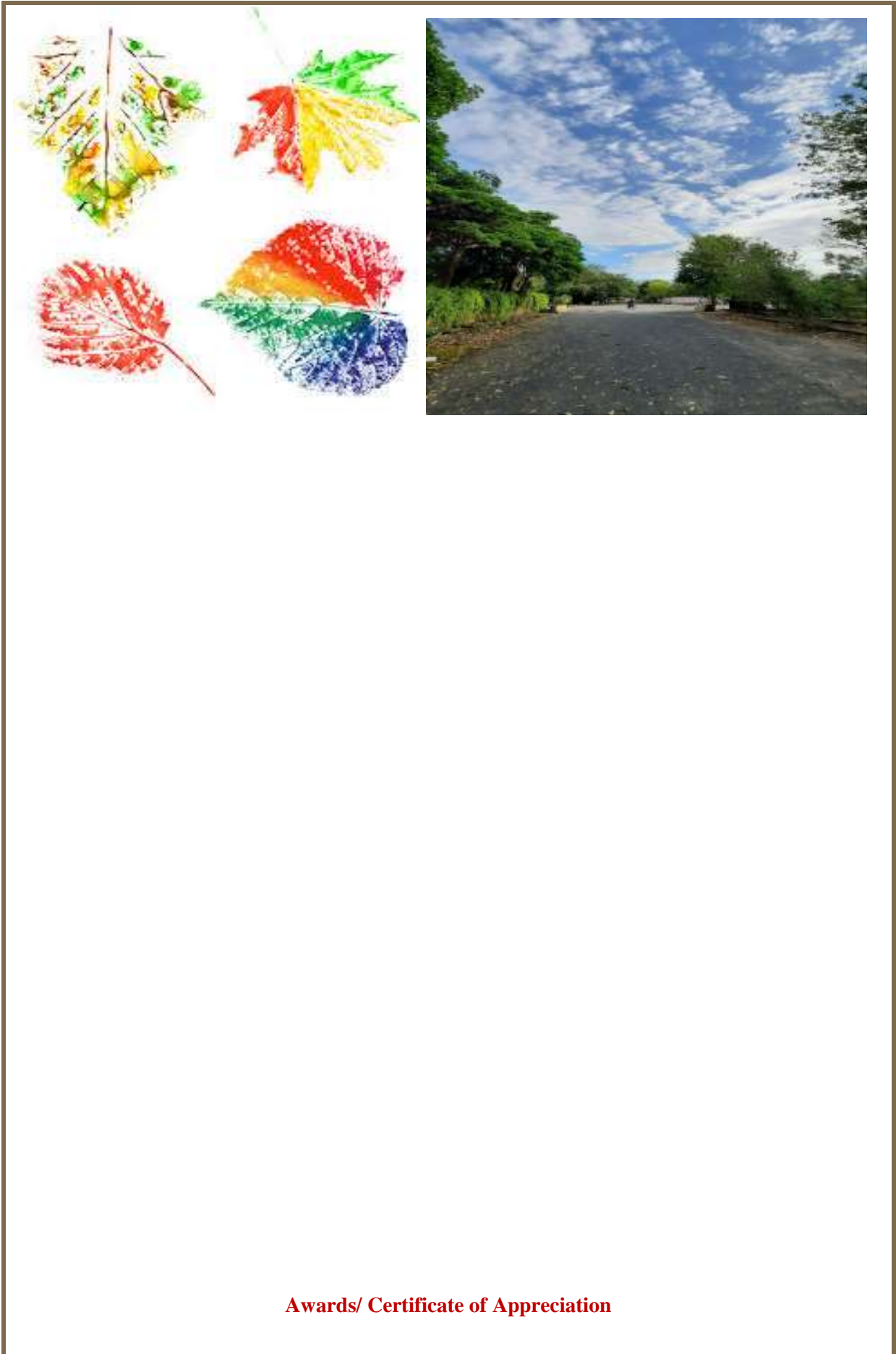
