# 1. National Conference on "Paradigm Shift From Developing To Developed India Through Digitization" Dated: 28<sup>th</sup> -29<sup>th</sup> July,2017

National Conference On Paradigm Shift From Developing To Developed India Through Digitization was organized on July 28 and 29, 2017. The Inaugural Session of the conference started with lightening of lamp ceremony. Welcome address was delivered by Director MSI, Sh. J.P. Singh in which he welcomed all the Dignitaries and participants. Sh. S.P. Singh Hon'ble Chairman, Surajmal Memorial Education Society in his address talked about how in earlier times people faced problems because of lack of communication facilities and now with digitization communication has become much easier. The Keynote address was given by Prof.(Dr.) Anu Singh Lather, Pro- Vice-Chancellor, DTU. She emphasized that with digitization everything can be well planned and corruption will decrease. The Guest of Honour Prof.(Dr.) KumKum Dewan, Vice- Chancellor, Noida International University reiterated that the biggest revolution of mankind is Information Technology and Digitization.

The First Technical Session was chaired by Prof.(Dr.) N.P. Singh, MDI Gurgaon in which six presenters gave their presentations. In this session the topics discussed included issues and challenges in the digital age, Government initiatives in setting up digital infrastructure, changing paradigms for Indian students, compression function and impact of leadership. At the end of the first technical session, the chairperson Prof N.P.Singh gave his expert views on various presentations.

The Second Technical Session was chaired by Prof.(Dr.) Sangeeta Chauhan, Dean University School of Education, GGSIPU. In this session five presentations were given. These presentations dealt with impact of digitization on classroom, how digitization of education can lead to progress of the nation, influence of digitization on management, commerce and media and the researchers perspective on the impediments in using ICT for teaching. The chairperson summed up the session by highlighting the main points in each paper.

On the second day of the conference the Chairman for the First technical session was Prof. Inderjit Dagar, Principal, College of Vocational Studies. In this session five presentations were delivered. The issues deliberated upon in this session included a review of Digital India and its contribution in the development of the nation, opportunities and challenges of converting Indian economy into digital economy, applying data mining techniques to assess the students needs, demonetization and its impact on digitization, web 2.0 as a tool to promote reflection and characteristics of Smart cities. The chairperson Dr Inderjit Singh Dagar concluded the session by emphasizing on the need to change the mindset of the people towards using digital modes in daily life.

Dr. Manimala Roy, Principal, Basava International School was the Chairman for the Second Technical Session. In this session six presentations were delivered. In this session the topics discussed included impact of growth in cashless economy on Indian society, artificial intelligence and robotics, endeavors for bridging the digital divide in classrooms of India, impact of demonetization on rural banking, merchant banking and creation of e-commerce websites. At the end of the session, Dr Manimala Roy gave her feedback on the presentations.

The Chief Guest for the Valedictory Session was Sh. Vinay Thakur, Director, National E-Governance Department, Ministry of Electronics and IT. He gave his expert talk on the Digital India programme and how it will transform India into a digitally empowered nation. At the end of the

session, certificates were presented to the presenters by the Chief Guest. The conference proved to be an enriching learning experience for all the participants.



#### Day 02 : Workshop

### HandsOn Workshop[ ~ 5 hours]

Day 2 kicked off with a interesting warm up session that was focused at helping the participants realize the power of creativity and imagination. It also stressed upon how wisdom & knowledge differ from each other and how wisdom seems to come handy in the real world situations. Hence, indicating towards a balanced need of both, wisdom& knowledge.The participants were then briefed on Design Thinking which happens to be a user centric problem solving approach fueled by creativity.

The participants with different skills & expertise divided themselves into diverse groups who received a challenge to be approached via Design Thinking. The teams then started working on the challenge with the user focused research and then gradually moved on to the next phases. The teams were expected to dig deep into the problem statement & then brute force it with a good number of ideas to address the pain points uncovered. Having done that, the teams moved to drafting a rough design of the prototype followed by a presentation of their solutions.

The participants learned some basic skills like understanding team dynamics, information processing, concept of converging to the key points from a huge set of choices, prioritization, laying out a design, prototyping and presentation.

The lecture which lasted for some 90 minutes gave various practical examples & approaches towards examination. Stating a popular quote by Albert Einstein "if you judge a fish by its

ability to climb a tree, it will live its whole life believing that it has no talent" the speaker made students realize their untapped potential. The need of aptitude for quick decision making, Ability to achieve bigger goals through reasoning, the need of geometry application in real life and examination strategy were some quick, easy and helpful tricks students learnt. The lecture covered a wide area of topics like importance of communication skills, techniques to improve it, which would help students in developing themselves. ### 4. Extension lecture on the topic "Significance of Values in 21st century". Date: 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2017

On 22nd February 2017 Professor Vidya Alankar delivered a speech on the topic "Significance of Values in 21st century". He is retired professor of Delhi University and is a renowned orator. He graced us with his experiences regarding values in Indian Culture in a very interesting way. He started with a quote "As Science is based on Experiments similarly life is based on experiences". And also he said what you want to grasp is what will make your choices. He focused on learning from everything that we encounter in a positive way like we should learn walking from a cat, lovalty from a dog, peace from the Earth, and urge to fly from a parrot if given independence. He said bookish knowledge is just a fraction of life but real test is given by life. He said that internal soul is much more important than external looks by quoting an example of an envelope where the matter of letter is considered of great importance while the outer covering is torn in seconds. Modernization is necessary not in clothes but thoughts. Every individual should be characterized by his/her seva(service), sheel(humbleness), tyag(sacrifice), mariyada(decorum). Breaking of those values results to chaos. Values should not be taught by teachers but should be inculcated to students by simply ways of teaching. He also advised us to maintain a diary not to write our daily activities rather for keeping a record of our activities to reach our goals. Hence, he said that the goals are must for a person without which a person is not less than a animal. He said that one must have his own identity and should reflect on one's thought in a simplest way. One must broaden his horizon of knowledge. For us (Trainee Teachers), he advised to make our teaching in such a way that it should

inspire students and also it should be creative, interesting and must relate to moral values and Indian culture. He emphasized on Indian culture, traditions and customs being the oldest civilization. So we as teachers must conserve and protect it. And at last he believed in "simple living and high thinking". Overall, it was an extremely brilliant experience to listen from an esteemed personality like his and it provoked us in a positive way to move towards our goals.

### 5. Extension lecture by NGO: Juvenile care

### Date: 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2017

NGO: Juvenile Care- Charitable Trust 4th March, 2017 Juvenile care is a social project that was started in 2010. It is currently registered under juvenile care- charitable trust. It works by involving young Indians in social ventures and activities, and has over 15000 volunteers working for child rights and child abuse eradication. Based in Bangalore juvenile care is a registered trust with chapters in Vellore, Pune, New Delhi and Jaipur. It helps students, corporations and non working individuals utilize their time to work for orphanage, workshops, Microsoft office workshops in schools and orphanages, medical camps in slums and villages and teacher training programmes. The mission of the organization is to give the platform to the youth to come forward and work for an alleviation of society. According to them, every individual is equal and they do not want our sympathy but our empathy. They are empowering youth of today for youth of tomorrow. According to them, the perception of the parents should not be the development of a child according to society but at his own pace of learning. We should not look at symptoms of the problem but the problem. We all are not future teachers but future educators. And efforts made beyond the syllabus make teachers educators. They detected variety of students with various disorders for example, children facing ADHT, anxiety, OCD, etc. They did various projects: Project TITLI: they make students come out of the cocoon by meditation, dance therapy and music. Project VIDYA: it was a one week long project, where they shot the documentary depicting "the other side of moon." Cover up India: in this project, clothes were given in small villages and street areas. SPARSH: it is a 2week long medical checkup camp held in Tamil Nadu, once in every year. ZAJBA: there were creative stalls including all the creative stuffs, drawings, etc made by children. They also carry various programmes like 'each one teach one day', flash mob, street plays, etc. They also gave one pen to everyone and believe that we will forward it to a child to motivate him to educated.

**6. Extension lecture on "Special lecture on permutation and combination" Date: 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2017** Department of commerce organised a special lecture on Business Mathematics on  $21^{st}$  March, 2017 from 10:30 till 12 noon on the topic "<u>PERMUTATIONS AND COMBINATIONS</u>" by Dr. J.K.Thukral, Associate professor, Sri Ram College of Commerce, University of Delhi. The lecture gave conceptual insight into the topic of Permutation and Combination. The main focus of the lecture was on Permutation. The students of  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  semester of B.COM(H) attended the lecture with great zeal. It was substantial for the students to learn the methods of solving the questions. Sir provided notes as well as gave examples for the better understanding of the concept. There was active participation from the side of the students and everyone ensured proper discipline. He also shared with the students his contact number for any doubts and queries.

# 7. Extension lecture on "Role of banking after Demonetization" Date: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2017

Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized a guest lecture on 'Role of Banking After Demonetization" on 25<sup>th</sup> March by Honey deep Singh (Assistant Manager at South IndianBank, KarolBagh) who is an alumni of this prestigious institution.

The lecture started with the question of "how many of you have a bank account?" which was responded imperatively by 80% of the students and the speaker was met by surprise as to that fact. It was then followed by a zealous speaker educating students about demonetization. The history and the concept of demonetization was explained to the audience in a very lucid manner followed by the

motives of the same while taking points from the audience as well as adding more than what they already knew of. Mr. Honey deep Singh not only captured the audience by his amicable and amenable attitude but compelled them to practically shoot off their seats and participate. After explaining the concept and idea of demonetization he then proceeded to discuss the motives of it before further explaining the government's idea behind it, that is, to shift the focus paper or coin money to digital transactions and banking.

Thereafter comenced the agenda of the lecture, that is, the shift that has been brought about by demonetization in shifting the economy from cash base to digital base and how to deal and grow with that change. This was done by analyzing and discussing the tools like UTI,E-Wallet,Cards,IMPS, etcetera of digital banking the help of real world examples. Mr. Singh went on to reiterate the fact that in a developing country like India digital banking is the need of the hour as it brings into loop 75% of those who are not yet taking banking services by explaining the benefits of digital banking. The principal benefit being that digital banking services are available 24/7 anywhere and everywhere. The lecture drew to an end by the speaker explaining the cautions and precautions to be kept in mind while engaging in digital banking and making the optimum utilization of the tools already present. Mr.Singh concluded the lecture by taking doubts from the recently enlightened audience and answering them to their satisfaction.

The lecture proved not only to be intellectual and informative but highly participative and pleasure to be part of. The ebullience and erudite of Mr.Singh was an experience that was relished by the audience and was exhibited by them by their thundering applause at the end of the session.
