

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

POST GRADUATE PROGRAM

Master of Business Administration (MBA) – 120 students (Two year program)

Admission Criteria:

- All admissions shall be made on the basis of overall Percentile of Common Admission Test (CAT 2023) that was conducted by Indian Institute of Management.
- If seats remain vacant after counselling on the basis of overall percentile of CAT 2023, then only the counselling shall be conducted on the basis of Score in CMAT 2024 (another National Level Test).
- In case seats still remain vacant even after exhausting CAT 2023 and CMAT 2024 Merit, University will consider admissions in Programme MBA (Code 101) on the basis of merit in GGSIPU CET 2024 conducted by GGSIP University. (For Affiliated Colleges/ Institutes Only).

UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAM (INTEGRATED)

Bachelor of Arts LL.B- 60 students (Five year program)

Bachelor of Business Administration LL.B- 60 students (Five year program)

Admission Criteria:

All applicants are required to appear in Common Law Admission Test – Under Graduate, 2024 (CLAT – UG, 2024) that is conducted by National Law University on a rotational basis.

The University shall not conduct its own CET for admissions but shall be utilizing the merit prepared on the basis of (CLAT – UG, 2024) Merit for its admissions.

*Aggregate of 50% marks in the 12th class for the purpose of eligibility will be taken as the aggregate of best four subjects (unless otherwise specified) including English.

UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAM

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) -180 students first shift, 180 students second shift (Four year program)

Bachelor of Business Administration BBA (B&I) - 60 students first shift, 60 students second shift (Four year program)

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA)- 120 students first shift, 120 students second shift (Four year program)

Bachelor of Commerce(Hons) - 60 students first shift, 60 students second shift (Four year program).

Bachelor of Education- 100 students (Two year program)

Admission Criteria:

Admission shall be on the basis of the merit of the CET. The vacant seats after exhausting the merit list of CET will be filled through the merit list of CUET.

FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE

The Institute is beautifully landscaped in the heart of Janakpuri, New Delhi sprawling over about 8 acres of land and has the best Infrastructure and wide range of academic facilities. STATE OF THE ART COMPUTER LABS:

MOOT COURT HALL:

MSI provides the most conducive environment for a focused discussion on legal aspects between the students and faculty members. The classrooms and Moot Court Hall are spacious, air-conditioned and well-equipped to facilitate the teaching-learning process and law practices. Courtroom exercises,

RAJA MAHENDRA PRATAP HOSTEL:

SPORTS GROUND:

RULES AND REGULATIONS AT MSI

MSI has a reputation of being one of the best disciplined colleges in the GGSIP University. While being an eminently 'fun place' to study in, our students observe the code of good conduct happily.

- When a student seeks admission to the College, it is assumed by the College that s/he has an earnest purpose.
- S/he is expected to aim at the highest achievement in every sphere and to conduct himself /herself in a responsible and dignified manner.
- By joining the college, the student is bound by all its Rules and Regulations.
- A student is required to have a minimum attendance of 75% in aggregate in a semester/year. However, Director may condone attendance shortage up to 5% (in case of University maintained/affiliated Institute) for individual students for reasons beyond the control of the students.
- Every student must be dressed decently and neatly, befitting the academic environment. Student must adhere to the dress code on prescribed days/during examination/industrial visit/seminars/workshop.
- Students are required to carry their I-card with them. They
 may be called upon to produce their identity cards at any
 time by any of the College Staff. Students without their
 Identity card are liable to be sent home.
- Use of mobile phones during class hours is not allowed.
 Mobile phones should be switched off during lecture hours.
- Students must take proper care of the property of the Institute, fittings, fixtures, equipment's, teaching aids and help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Students must not disfigure walls, tables, or benches. Any wilful damage to the property of the college will be treated as breach of discipline.
- The Director may, at his/her discretion, expel student(s) from the Institute for any act of indiscipline.
- Students must maintain strict silence in the Classroom, Library, Reading Room, Computer Labs and in the corridors near classrooms.
- MSI is a non-smoking zone. Smoking and consumption of alcohol within the college premises or near the college is strictly prohibited.
- Students are not allowed to invite any outsider to the college or to the college canteen.
- Failure to observe any of the above rules will call for disciplinary action against the student.

RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the campus of the Institute. Any student found guilty of participating in or encouraging ragging within the institute's premises would face severe disciplinary action. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti- Ragging committee of the institution, the possible punishment for those found guilty of ragging shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding scholarship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or any other evaluation process.
- · Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.



- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment
